$$277/32 \text{ (WHICH IS OUR ORIGINAL IMPROPER FRACTION)}$$

HOWEVER, NOTE THAT AFTER CONVERSION, THE FRACTION IS EXPRESSED IN 64THS, SO THE MOST STRAIGHTFORWARD FORM REMAINS $554/64$ UNLESS FURTHER SIMPLIFIED BASED ON CONTEXT.
