WHAT DO THE LUSITANIA AND THE SUSSEX HAVE IN COMMON?

THE LUSITANIA AND THE SUSSEX ARE TWO VESSELS THAT HAVE CAPTURED THE IMAGINATION AND HISTORICAL INTEREST OF MANY DUE TO THEIR TRAGIC FATES AND SIGNIFICANT ROLES IN MARITIME HISTORY. THOUGH THEY HAIL FROM DIFFERENT ERAS AND SERVED DIFFERENT PURPOSES, THESE SHIPS SHARE INTRIGUING SIMILARITIES THAT HIGHLIGHT THEIR IMPORTANCE IN WORLD EVENTS, TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCEMENTS, AND CULTURAL IMPACT. EXPLORING WHAT THESE SHIPS HAVE IN COMMON OFFERS INSIGHT INTO BROADER THEMES OF NAVAL HISTORY, WARTIME DIPLOMACY, AND THE EVOLUTION OF MARITIME SAFETY. IN THIS ARTICLE, WE DELVE INTO THE BACKGROUNDS OF BOTH SHIPS, THEIR SIGNIFICANCE, AND THE COMMON THREADS THAT CONNECT THEM.

HISTORICAL CONTEXT AND SIGNIFICANCE

THE LUSITANIA: A WORLD WAR I ICON

THE RMS LUSITANIA WAS A BRITISH OCEAN LINER OPERATED BY THE CUNARD LINE, LAUNCHED IN 1906. IT WAS RENOWNED FOR ITS LUXURIOUS ACCOMMODATIONS AND SPEED, MAKING IT A FLAGSHIP OF TRANSATLANTIC TRAVEL. HOWEVER, ITS MOST NOTABLE HISTORICAL ROLE WAS DURING WORLD WAR I, WHEN IT BECAME A SYMBOL OF BOTH CIVILIAN MARITIME TRAVEL AND WARTIME CONFLICT. THE SINKING OF LUSITANIA IN 1915 BY A GERMAN U-BOAT MARKED A PIVOTAL MOMENT, INFLUENCING PUBLIC OPINION AND CONTRIBUTING TO THE UNITED STATES' DECISION TO ENTER THE WAR. THE TRAGEDY RESULTED IN THE LOSS OF OVER 1,200 LIVES, INCLUDING MANY CIVILIANS, AND UNDERScoreD THE DEADLY RISKS FACED BY PASSENGER SHIPS DURING WARTIME.

THE SUSSEX: A SYMBOL OF NAVAL DIPLOMACY

THE SS SUSSEX WAS A FRENCH-BUILT PASSENGER FERRY LAUNCHED IN 1902, LATER OPERATED BY THE FRENCH LINE AND OTHER COMPANIES. IT BECAME FAMOUS FOR ITS ROLE IN PEACETIME AND DURING WARTIME, ESPECIALLY IN THE CONTEXT OF DIPLOMATIC NEGOTIATIONS. THE SUSSEX INCIDENT OF 1916 INVOLVED A GERMAN TORPEDO ATTACK ON THE VESSEL, WHICH RESULTED IN INJURIES AND CASUALTIES, AND ALMOST LED TO A DIPLOMATIC CRISIS BETWEEN GERMANY AND THE UNITED STATES. THE INCIDENT PROMPTED GERMANY TO ISSUE THE SUSSEX PLEDGE, PROMISING TO RESTRICT SUBMARINE WARFARE AND AVOID SINKING MERCHANT SHIPS WITHOUT WARNING—AN IMPORTANT STEP IN THE LEAD-UP TO AMERICA'S INVOLVEMENT IN WORLD WAR I.

SHARED THEMES IN MARITIME HISTORY

BOTH SHIPS AS SYMBOLS OF THEIR TIME

THE LUSITANIA AND THE SUSSEX SERVE AS SYMBOLS OF THEIR RESPECTIVE ERAS, EMBODYING THE TECHNOLOGICAL, POLITICAL, AND SOCIAL TENSIONS OF THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY. THEY EXEMPLIFY THE EVOLUTION OF MARITIME TRAVEL FROM LUXURY LINERS TO STRATEGIC ASSETS IN WARTIME. THEIR STORIES REFLECT THE BROADER NARRATIVE OF TECHNOLOGICAL PROGRESS IN SHIPBUILDING, NAVIGATION, AND COMMUNICATION, AS WELL AS THE SHIFTING NATURE OF WARFARE AND DIPLOMACY.

IMPACT ON INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

BOTH VESSELS PLAYED SIGNIFICANT ROLES IN SHAPING INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS DURING A TUMULTUOUS PERIOD. THE SINKING OF LUSITANIA WAS A CATALYST THAT SHIFTED PUBLIC OPINION AND POLITICAL STANCES, INFLUENCING THE U.S. DECISION TO

JOIN THE WAR. MEANWHILE, THE SUSSEX INCIDENT PROMPTED DIPLOMATIC NEGOTIATIONS AND LED TO THE SUSSEX PLEDGE, WHICH TEMPORARILY LIMITED GERMAN SUBMARINE WARFARE AND AIMED TO PREVENT ESCALATION INTO FULL-SCALE CONFLICT. THESE EVENTS HIGHLIGHT HOW SHIPS, BEYOND THEIR PHYSICAL PRESENCE, CAN INFLUENCE DIPLOMATIC DYNAMICS AND WAR STRATEGIES.

TECHNOLOGICAL AND DESIGN SIMILARITIES

ADVANCES IN SHIPBUILDING

WHILE THE LUSITANIA WAS A MARVEL OF EARLY 20TH-CENTURY MARITIME ENGINEERING, THE SUSSEX REFLECTED THE TECHNOLOGICAL STANDARDS OF SMALLER PASSENGER VESSELS OF ITS TIME. BOTH SHIPS INCORPORATED INNOVATIONS AIMED AT IMPROVING SAFETY, SPEED, AND COMFORT, THOUGH THEIR DESIGNS ULTIMATELY RESPONDED TO DIFFERENT NEEDS—LUXURY AND SPEED FOR LUSITANIA, AND REGIONAL PASSENGER TRANSPORT FOR SUSSEX.

SAFETY MEASURES AND THEIR EVOLUTION

THE TRAGEDIES INVOLVING BOTH SHIPS CONTRIBUTED TO CHANGES IN MARITIME SAFETY REGULATIONS. THE SINKING OF LUSITANIA, WITH ITS MASSIVE LOSS OF CIVILIAN LIVES, UNDERSCORED THE NECESSITY FOR BETTER SAFETY STANDARDS AND COMMUNICATION PROTOCOLS AT SEA. SIMILARLY, THE SUSSEX INCIDENT LED TO INCREASED ATTENTION TO THE SAFETY OF CIVILIAN VESSELS AND THE IMPORTANCE OF DIPLOMATIC SAFEGUARDS, SUCH AS THE SUSSEX PLEDGE, TO PREVENT UNNECESSARY CONFLICT ESCALATION.

COMMONALITIES IN THEIR TRAGIC ENDINGS

SINKING AS A RESULT OF WARFARE

BOTH SHIPS MET THEIR END DUE TO ACTS OF WAR—LUSITANIA WAS TORPEDOED BY A GERMAN U-BOAT, AND SUSSEX WAS ATTACKED UNDER SIMILAR CIRCUMSTANCES. THESE EVENTS EXEMPLIFY THE DANGERS FACED BY PASSENGER SHIPS DURING WARTIME, WHEN THE LINE BETWEEN CIVILIAN AND MILITARY TARGETS OFTEN BECAME BLURRED. THE SINKING OF BOTH VESSELS NOT ONLY RESULTED IN LOSS OF LIFE BUT ALSO HAD PROFOUND POLITICAL AND MILITARY REPERCUSSIONS.

INFLUENCE ON PUBLIC OPINION AND POLICY

THE SINKING OF LUSITANIA AND THE SUSSEX ATTACK STIRRED PUBLIC OUTRAGE AND INFLUENCED GOVERNMENTAL POLICIES. LUSITANIA'S LOSS GALVANIZED ANTI-GERMAN SENTIMENTS IN THE ALLIED COUNTRIES AND CONTRIBUTED TO THE U.S. ENTERING WWI. THE SUSSEX INCIDENT, ON THE OTHER HAND, PROMPTED GERMANY TO ALTER ITS SUBMARINE WARFARE TACTICS TEMPORARILY, AIMING TO AVOID PROVOKING THE UNITED STATES FURTHER. THESE INCIDENTS SHOW HOW MARITIME DISASTERS CAN SERVE AS CATALYSTS FOR DIPLOMATIC AND MILITARY DECISIONS.

LEGACY AND CULTURAL IMPACT

MEMORIALS AND HISTORICAL REMEMBRANCE

BOTH SHIPS HAVE LEFT ENDURING LEGACIES THROUGH MEMORIALS, MUSEUMS, AND HISTORICAL STUDIES. THE LUSITANIA IS REMEMBERED AS A SYMBOL OF THE TRAGIC HUMAN COST OF WAR AND THE IMPORTANCE OF MARITIME SAFETY REFORMS. THE SUSSEX IS REMEMBERED FOR ITS ROLE IN DIPLOMATIC HISTORY AND THE EVENTS THAT SHAPED EARLY 20TH-CENTURY

IN POPULAR CULTURE

THE STORIES OF THESE SHIPS HAVE BEEN DEPICTED IN BOOKS, FILMS, AND DOCUMENTARIES, EMPHASIZING THEIR SIGNIFICANCE. THE LUSITANIA'S SINKING HAS BEEN THE SUBJECT OF NUMEROUS FILMS AND HISTORICAL ANALYSES, WHILE THE SUSSEX'S INCIDENT HAS BEEN REFERENCED IN DISCUSSIONS OF DIPLOMATIC HISTORY AND NAVAL WARFARE. THEIR STORIES CONTINUE TO SERVE AS CAUTIONARY TALES AND SYMBOLS OF THE COMPLEX INTERPLAY BETWEEN TECHNOLOGY, WAR, AND DIPLOMACY.

CONCLUSION: WHAT UNITES THE LUSITANIA AND THE SUSSEX?

DESPITE DIFFERENCES IN SIZE, PURPOSE, AND THE SPECIFICS OF THEIR NARRATIVES, THE LUSITANIA AND THE SUSSEX ARE UNITED BY THEIR ROLES AS VESSELS DEEPLY INTERTWINED WITH THE POLITICAL, TECHNOLOGICAL, AND SOCIAL UPEAVALS OF THEIR TIME. THEY EXEMPLIFY HOW SHIPS ARE MORE THAN MERE TRANSPORTATION—THEY ARE SYMBOLS OF NATIONAL IDENTITY, TECHNOLOGICAL PROGRESS, AND THE TRAGIC CONSEQUENCES OF WAR. THEIR STORIES REMIND US OF THE IMPORTANCE OF MARITIME SAFETY, THE IMPACT OF NAVAL CONFLICT ON CIVILIAN LIVES, AND THE ENDURING LEGACY OF SHIPS THAT HAVE SHAPED HISTORY. UNDERSTANDING WHAT THESE SHIPS HAVE IN COMMON ENRICHES OUR APPRECIATION OF MARITIME HISTORY AND HIGHLIGHTS THE ENDURING LESSONS LEARNED FROM THEIR FATEFUL VOYAGES.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT ARE THE COMMON FACTORS BETWEEN THE LUSITANIA AND THE SUSSEX?

BOTH THE LUSITANIA AND THE SUSSEX WERE PASSENGER SHIPS INVOLVED IN SIGNIFICANT MARITIME INCIDENTS DURING WARTIME, AND BOTH WERE TARGETED BY GERMAN U-BOATS DURING WORLD WAR I, LEADING TO LOSS OF LIFE AND INFLUENCING PUBLIC OPINION.

HOW DID THE SINKING OF THE LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX IMPACT INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS?

BOTH SINKINGS HEIGHTENED ANTI-GERMAN SENTIMENT IN ALLIED COUNTRIES AND CONTRIBUTED TO THE UNITED STATES' DECISION TO ENTER WORLD WAR I, AS THEY UNDERScoreD THE THREAT POSED BY GERMAN UNRESTRICTED SUBMARINE WARFARE.

IN WHAT WAYS DID THE SINKING OF THE LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX INFLUENCE MARITIME WARFARE POLICIES?

THE INCIDENTS LED TO INCREASED EMPHASIS ON CONVOY SYSTEMS, NAVAL PATROLS, AND DIPLOMATIC EFFORTS TO PREVENT CIVILIAN PASSENGER SHIPS FROM BEING TARGETED, SHAPING FUTURE MARITIME SECURITY MEASURES.

WERE THERE ANY SIMILARITIES IN THE CASUALTIES CAUSED BY THE LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX ATTACKS?

YES, BOTH SHIPS SUFFERED SIGNIFICANT LOSS OF CIVILIAN LIVES DUE TO THE GERMAN U-BOAT ATTACKS, WITH THE LUSITANIA'S SINKING RESULTING IN APPROXIMATELY 1,200 DEATHS AND THE SUSSEX INCIDENT CAUSING AROUND 50 CASUALTIES.

HOW DID THE PUBLIC REACT TO THE SINKING OF BOTH SHIPS?

PUBLIC REACTION WAS ONE OF OUTRAGE AND INCREASED ANTI-GERMAN SENTIMENT, WITH WIDESPREAD PROTESTS AND CALLS FOR STRONGER MILITARY ACTION, ESPECIALLY AFTER THE LUSITANIA'S SINKING, WHICH WAS SEEN AS A BRUTAL ATTACK ON

INNOCENT CIVILIANS.

WHAT ROLE DID THE SINKINGS OF THE LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX PLAY IN WARTIME PROPAGANDA?

BOTH INCIDENTS WERE USED BY ALLIED PROPAGANDA TO RALLY PUBLIC SUPPORT FOR THE WAR EFFORT, PORTRAYING GERMANY AS A RUTHLESS AGGRESSOR AND EMPHASIZING THE NEED FOR MILITARY INTERVENTION TO PROTECT INNOCENT LIVES.

SS SUSSEX: A PASSENGER AND CARGO CARRIER WITH A NAVAL ROLE

THE SS SUSSEX, LAUNCHED IN 1902, WAS A BRITISH STEAMSHIP OPERATED BY THE FRENCH LINE (COMPAGNIE GÉNÉRALE TRANSATLANTIQUE). INITIALLY SERVING AS A PASSENGER AND CARGO VESSEL, THE SUSSEX GAINED PROMINENCE DURING WORLD WAR I WHEN IT WAS REQUISITIONED FOR MILITARY PURPOSES.

- DESIGN & FEATURES: SMALLER THAN THE LUSITANIA, THE SUSSEX WAS BUILT FOR EFFICIENCY AND RELIABILITY, INCORPORATING FEATURES SUITABLE FOR BOTH PASSENGER COMFORT AND CARGO CAPACITY.
- OPERATIONAL ROLE: SERVED ON TRANSATLANTIC ROUTES, CONNECTING EUROPE AND NORTH AMERICA, WITH A REPUTATION FOR SAFETY AND DEPENDABILITY.
- WARTIME INVOLVEMENT: REQUISITIONED BY THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT, THE SUSSEX PLAYED A ROLE IN TROOP TRANSPORT AND SUPPLY MISSIONS.

SHARED TECHNOLOGICAL AND DESIGN FEATURES

DESPITE DIFFERENCES IN SIZE AND PURPOSE, LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX SHARED KEY TECHNOLOGICAL AND DESIGN ELEMENTS CHARACTERISTIC OF THEIR RESPECTIVE ERAS BUT ALSO INDICATIVE OF BROADER MARITIME TRENDS.

STEAM PROPULSION

BOTH SHIPS WERE POWERED BY COAL-FIRED STEAM ENGINES, WHICH WAS THE DOMINANT PROPULSION TECHNOLOGY AT THE TIME.

- EFFICIENCY AND SPEED: ENABLED TRANSATLANTIC CROSSINGS IN RECORD TIMES FOR THEIR PERIODS.
- INNOVATIONS: THE LUSITANIA, FOR EXAMPLE, BOASTED A DUAL-SCREW PROPELLER SYSTEM THAT IMPROVED MANEUVERABILITY AND SPEED.

HULL DESIGN AND SAFETY FEATURES

- HULL CONSTRUCTION: BOTH VESSELS EMPLOYED RIVETED STEEL HULLS, STANDARD FOR DURABILITY AND STRENGTH.
- LIFEBOATS AND SAFETY EQUIPMENT: WHILE SAFETY STANDARDS EVOLVED OVER TIME, BOTH SHIPS WERE EQUIPPED WITH LIFEBOATS AND LIFE-SAVING APPLIANCES IN ACCORDANCE WITH MARITIME REGULATIONS.

LUXURY AND PASSENGER COMFORT

- INTERIOR DESIGN: LUSITANIA WAS RENOWNED FOR ITS LUXURIOUS SALONS, DINING ROOMS, AND CABINS.
- PASSENGER AMENITIES: SUSSEX ALSO PRIORITIZED PASSENGER COMFORT, WITH WELL-APPOINTED ACCOMMODATIONS, REFLECTING THE MARITIME LUXURY STANDARDS OF THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY.

ROLES DURING WARTIME AND THEIR IMPACT

ONE OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT COMMONALITIES BETWEEN THE LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX IS THEIR INVOLVEMENT IN WARTIME, WHICH PROFOUNDLY AFFECTED THEIR FATES AND THE BROADER CONTEXT OF MARITIME SECURITY.

MILITARY REQUISITION AND STRATEGIC USE

- SUSSEX: REQUISITIONED EXPLICITLY FOR WARTIME SERVICE, INCLUDING TROOP TRANSPORT AND SUPPLY RUNS, REFLECTING THE STRATEGIC IMPORTANCE OF PASSENGER SHIPS DURING WARTIME.

IMPACT OF WARFARE ON SAFETY AND DESIGN

- BOTH SHIPS' WARTIME ROLES PROMPTED MODIFICATIONS, SUCH AS REINFORCED HULLS AND INCREASED ARMAMENT (IN SOME CASES), BUT ALSO EXPOSED VULNERABILITIES.
- THE THREAT OF SUBMARINE WARFARE LED TO INCREASED SAFETY MEASURES, ALTHOUGH THESE WERE OFTEN INSUFFICIENT, AS

EVIDENCED BY THEIR SINKING.

MARITIME WARFARE AND INTERNATIONAL LAW

- THE SINKINGS OF LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX SPURRED DEBATES OVER THE LEGALITY OF SUBMARINE WARFARE AND CIVILIAN SAFETY.
- LUSITANIA: THE SINKING BY A GERMAN U-BOAT IN 1915 RESULTED IN THE LOSS OF OVER 1,000 LIVES AND SWAYED PUBLIC OPINION AGAINST GERMANY.
- SUSSEX: SUNK IN 1916 AFTER BEING HIT BY A GERMAN TORPEDO, LEADING TO DIPLOMATIC TENSIONS AND THE EVENTUAL ADOPTION OF THE SUSSEX PLEDGE, WHICH SOUGHT TO LIMIT UNRESTRICTED SUBMARINE WARFARE.

SHARED TRAGEDIES AND THEIR LEGACIES

THE SINKING OF BOTH SHIPS MARKED PIVOTAL MOMENTS IN MARITIME HISTORY AND HAD LASTING REPERCUSSIONS.

THE SINKING OF LUSITANIA

- DATE & CIRCUMSTANCES: SUNK ON MAY 7, 1915, OFF THE COAST OF IRELAND.
- CASUALTIES: OVER 1,200 LIVES LOST, INCLUDING MANY CIVILIANS.
- IMPACT:
- SHIFTED PUBLIC OPINION TOWARDS SUPPORTING THE ALLIES.
- ACCELERATED THE U.S. ENTRY INTO WWI.
- LED TO CHANGES IN MARITIME SAFETY REGULATIONS AND ANTI-SUBMARINE MEASURES.

THE SINKING OF SUSSEX

- DATE & CIRCUMSTANCES: OCCURRED ON MARCH 24, 1916, NEAR THE COAST OF FRANCE.
- CASUALTIES: INITIALLY 11 KILLED; SUBSEQUENT DIPLOMATIC NEGOTIATIONS LED TO SAFER MARITIME PRACTICES.
- IMPACT:
- PROMPTED THE SUSSEX PLEDGE, WHICH TEMPORARILY CURTAILED GERMAN UNRESTRICTED SUBMARINE WARFARE.
- HIGHLIGHTED THE DANGERS FACED BY CIVILIAN MARINERS DURING WARTIME.

COMMON THEMES IN THEIR LEGACIES

- CATALYSTS FOR POLICY CHANGE: BOTH SINKINGS PROMPTED SHIFTS IN MARITIME SAFETY LAWS, INTERNATIONAL DIPLOMACY, AND WARTIME NAVAL STRATEGY.
- SYMBOLISM: THEY BECAME SYMBOLS OF THE HUMAN COST OF MODERN WARFARE AND THE VULNERABILITIES OF CIVILIAN SHIPS CAUGHT IN CONFLICT.

BROADER CULTURAL AND HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

BEYOND THEIR TECHNICAL AND OPERATIONAL SIMILARITIES, BOTH SHIPS HAVE BECOME CULTURAL ICONS REPRESENTING DIFFERENT ERAS.

IN LITERATURE AND MEDIA

- THE LUSITANIA'S SINKING HAS BEEN IMMORTALIZED IN NUMEROUS BOOKS, DOCUMENTARIES, AND FILMS, SYMBOLIZING THE TRAGEDY OF WAR.
- THE SUSSEX ALSO FEATURES IN HISTORICAL ACCOUNTS OF WWI MARITIME WARFARE, EMPHASIZING THE PERILS FACED BY CIVILIAN SHIPS.

MEMORIALS AND COMMEMORATIONS

- MEMORIALS DEDICATED TO THE VICTIMS OF BOTH SHIPS SERVE AS POIGNANT REMINDERS OF THE HUMAN COST OF CONFLICT.
- THEIR STORIES CONTINUE TO INFLUENCE MARITIME SAFETY PROTOCOLS AND INTERNATIONAL MARITIME LAW.

CONCLUSION: WHAT DO THEY HAVE IN COMMON?

IN SUMMATION, THE LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX SHARE A MULTIFACETED SET OF COMMONALITIES:

- TECHNOLOGICAL FOUNDATIONS: BOTH WERE STEAM-POWERED, RIVETED STEEL SHIPS DESIGNED FOR TRANSATLANTIC PASSENGER SERVICE.
- WARTIME ROLES: EACH WAS REQUISITIONED OR INVOLVED IN WARTIME OPERATIONS, ILLUSTRATING THE INTERSECTION OF CIVILIAN AND MILITARY MARITIME ACTIVITY.
- UNDERLYING VULNERABILITIES: BOTH SHIPS EXEMPLIFY HOW TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCEMENTS WERE SOMETIMES INSUFFICIENT AGAINST EVOLVING THREATS LIKE SUBMARINES.
- HISTORICAL IMPACT: THEIR SINKINGS CATALYZED SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN MARITIME LAW, SAFETY STANDARDS, AND INTERNATIONAL DIPLOMACY.
- SYMBOLIC SIGNIFICANCE: THEY SERVE AS ENDURING SYMBOLS OF THE HUMAN TOLL OF WAR AND THE IMPORTANCE OF MARITIME SAFETY.

BY ANALYZING THESE ASPECTS, IT BECOMES CLEAR THAT THE LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX ARE NOT MERELY SHIPS LOST TO HISTORY BUT ARE INTERTWINED IN THE BROADER NARRATIVE OF MARITIME EVOLUTION, WARTIME STRATEGY, AND INTERNATIONAL POLICY. THEIR STORIES CONTINUE TO INFORM MODERN MARITIME SAFETY PRACTICES AND REMIND US OF THE ENDURING IMPORTANCE OF SAFEGUARDING CIVILIAN LIVES AMID CONFLICT.

IN ESSENCE, THE LUSITANIA AND SUSSEX EXEMPLIFY HOW SHIPS CAN BE MORE THAN VESSELS—THEY ARE REFLECTIONS OF TECHNOLOGICAL PROGRESS, POLITICAL TENSIONS, AND HUMAN RESILIENCE. THEIR SHARED HISTORIES UNDERSCORE THE ONGOING NEED FOR VIGILANCE, INNOVATION, AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION IN THE REALM OF MARITIME SECURITY.

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
