6. IDENTIFY THE UNDERLYING THEME:

- BASED ON THESE SENTENCES, SYNTHESIZE THE CENTRAL MESSAGE OR MORAL.

BY HONING THE ABILITY TO IDENTIFY AND ANALYZE THESE BLUE SENTENCES, STUDENTS, CRITICS, AND CASUAL READERS ALIKE CAN UNLOCK THE LAYERED MEANINGS EMBEDDED WITHIN LITERARY WORKS, LEADING TO A MORE PROFOUND APPRECIATION OF LITERATURE'S POWER TO EXPLORE THE HUMAN CONDITION.

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
