- **NATURAL DISASTERS AND CONFLICTS:** DISASTERS DISPLACE POPULATIONS, WHO THEN SETTLE IN NEARBY INFORMAL COMMUNITIES.

IMPLICATIONS OF THESE DEMOGRAPHICS ON SLUM DEVELOPMENT

UNDERSTANDING THESE VARIOUS PROFILES IS ESSENTIAL FOR DEVELOPING TARGETED POLICIES AND SUSTAINABLE INTERVENTIONS THAT ADDRESS THEIR NEEDS HOLISTICALLY.

FINAL THOUGHTS:

- ADDRESSING THE ROOT CAUSES OF SLUM HABITATION REQUIRES MULTI-FACETED APPROACHES, INCLUDING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, SOCIAL INCLUSION, LEGAL REFORMS, AND INFRASTRUCTURAL INVESTMENTS.
- RECOGNIZING THE RESILIENCE AND AGENCY OF SLUM RESIDENTS IS VITAL; THEY ARE NOT MERELY VICTIMS BUT ACTIVE PARTICIPANTS IN THEIR COMMUNITIES.
- SUSTAINABLE URBAN GROWTH MUST INTEGRATE THE NEEDS OF SLUM POPULATIONS TO FOSTER INCLUSIVE CITIES.

BY COMPREHENSIVELY UNDERSTANDING THE TYPES OF PEOPLE WHO LIVE IN SLUMS, POLICYMAKERS, NGOS, AND COMMUNITY LEADERS CAN DESIGN MORE EFFECTIVE STRATEGIES TO IMPROVE LIVING CONDITIONS, PROMOTE SOCIAL EQUITY, AND FACILITATE UPWARD MOBILITY FOR THESE VULNERABLE POPULATIONS.
