SENTENCE: ____ BICYCLE BELONGS TO MY BROTHER.

ANSWER: THE BICYCLE BELONGS TO MY BROTHER.

EXPLANATION: THE BICYCLE IS SPECIFIC AND KNOWN, SO "THE" IS USED.

DETAILED GUIDELINES FOR COMPLETING ARTICLES BASED ON DIFFERENT SCENARIOS

SCENARIO 1: INTRODUCING A NEW OBJECT

- WHEN THE OBJECT IS MENTIONED FOR THE FIRST TIME AND IS NOT KNOWN TO THE LISTENER, USE "A" OR "AN."
- EXAMPLE: I SAW ____ CAT IN THE GARDEN.

SCENARIO 2: REFERRING TO A SPECIFIC OR KNOWN OBJECT

- EXAMPLE: THE CAT IS SLEEPING ON ____ SOFA.

- USE "THE" FOR OBJECTS THAT ARE ONE OF A KIND, SUCH AS "THE SUN," "THE MOON," OR "THE EARTH."
- EXAMPLE: ____ SUN IS SHINING BRIGHTLY TODAY.

SCENARIO 4: USING ARTICLES WITH PLURAL AND UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

- USUALLY, NO ARTICLE IS USED WITH PLURAL OR UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS WHEN SPEAKING GENERALLY.
- WHEN REFERRING TO SPECIFIC PLURAL OR UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS, USE "THE."
- EXAMPLES:
- GENERAL: CATS ARE INDEPENDENT ANIMALS.
- SPECIFIC: THE CATS IN MY NEIGHBORHOOD ARE FRIENDLY.

TIPS FOR MASTERING ARTICLE USAGE WITH PICTURES

- FOCUS ON THE QUANTITY: IS THE OBJECT SINGULAR OR PLURAL? THIS INFLUENCES ARTICLE CHOICE.
