UNDERSTANDING THESE ROOTS IS CRUCIAL FOR ADDRESSING CONTEMPORARY DISPARITIES. RECOGNIZING THAT MANY INEQUALITIES STEM FROM HISTORICAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS CAN INFORM POLICIES AIMED AT FOSTERING MORE EQUITABLE DEVELOPMENT. ULTIMATELY, DIAMOND'S WORK CHALLENGES US TO SEE THE WORLD'S DISPARITIES NOT MERELY AS THE RESULT OF HUMAN FAILINGS BUT AS OUTCOMES OF COMPLEX INTERACTIONS BETWEEN ENVIRONMENT AND SOCIETY—INTERACTIONS THAT HAVE BEEN ONGOING FOR THOUSANDS OF YEARS.
