4. EXPLAIN TWO REASONS WHY LUCY STONE SUPPORTED THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT. (4 POINTS)

LUCY STONE WAS A PROMINENT SUFFRAGIST, ABOLITIONIST, AND ADVOCATE FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE IN THE 19TH CENTURY. HER SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT, WHICH GRANTED AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN THE RIGHT TO VOTE, WAS ROOTED IN HER BROADER COMMITMENT TO EQUALITY AND JUSTICE. IN THIS ARTICLE, WE WILL EXPLORE TWO PRIMARY REASONS WHY LUCY STONE CHAMPIONED THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT, SHEDDING LIGHT ON HER MOTIVATIONS AND THE HISTORICAL CONTEXT THAT INFLUENCED HER STANCE.

UNDERSTANDING LUCY STONE'S BACKGROUND AND PRINCIPLES

BEFORE DIVING INTO THE SPECIFIC REASONS, IT'S ESSENTIAL TO UNDERSTAND LUCY STONE'S BACKGROUND. SHE WAS ONE OF THE FIRST WOMEN IN THE UNITED STATES TO KEEP HER MAIDEN NAME AFTER MARRIAGE AND WAS A PASSIONATE ADVOCATE FOR WOMEN'S RIGHTS AND ABOLITION. HER DEDICATION TO SOCIAL REFORM WAS DRIVEN BY HER BELIEF IN UNIVERSAL HUMAN RIGHTS AND HER CONVICTION THAT SOCIETAL PROGRESS DEPENDED ON EXPANDING DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS TO MARGINALIZED GROUPS.

REASON 1: COMMITMENT TO RACIAL EQUALITY AND ABOLITION

HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF THE POST-CIVIL WAR ERA

THE PERIOD FOLLOWING THE CIVIL WAR, KNOWN AS RECONSTRUCTION, WAS MARKED BY EFFORTS TO REBUILD THE NATION AND ESTABLISH CIVIL RIGHTS FOR FORMERLY ENSLAVED AFRICAN AMERICANS. THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT, RATIFIED IN 1870, WAS A LANDMARK LEGISLATION THAT AIMED TO SECURE VOTING RIGHTS REGARDLESS OF RACE, COLOR, OR PREVIOUS CONDITION OF SERVITUDE.

LUCY STONE'S SUPPORT FOR RACIAL JUSTICE

LUCY STONE BELIEVED THAT THE FIGHT FOR RACIAL EQUALITY WAS A MORAL IMPERATIVE AND ALIGNED WITH HER ABOLITIONIST PRINCIPLES. HER SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS DRIVEN BY THE CONVICTION THAT:

- UNIVERSAL HUMAN RIGHTS: SHE BELIEVED THAT VOTING RIGHTS SHOULD BE EXTENDED TO ALL MEN, REGARDLESS OF RACE, AS A FUNDAMENTAL ASPECT OF EQUALITY.
- END OF RACIAL DISCRIMINATION: SUPPORTING THE AMENDMENT WAS A WAY TO COMBAT RACIAL DISCRIMINATION AND PROMOTE SOCIAL JUSTICE.
- SOLIDARITY WITH AFRICAN AMERICANS: SHE SAW THE ENFRANCHISEMENT OF BLACK MEN AS A STEP TOWARD A MORE JUST AND EQUITABLE SOCIETY, RECOGNIZING THEIR STRUGGLES AND CONTRIBUTIONS.

ALIGNMENT WITH ABOLITIONIST VALUES

LUCY STONE'S EARLY ACTIVISM WAS DEEPLY ROOTED IN THE ABOLITIONIST MOVEMENT. SHE VIEWED THE FIGHT FOR BLACK MEN'S SUFFRAGE AS A NATURAL EXTENSION OF HER EFFORTS TO END SLAVERY. SUPPORTING THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT ALLOWED HER TO:

- MAINTAIN HER COMMITMENT TO ENDING RACIAL OPPRESSION.
- DEMONSTRATE SOLIDARITY WITH AFRICAN AMERICANS SEEKING CIVIL RIGHTS.
- UPHOLD HER BELIEF THAT DEMOCRACY MUST BE INCLUSIVE OF ALL RACES.

REASON 2: STRATEGIC SUPPORT FOR WOMEN'S RIGHTS AND POLITICAL PROGRESS

BALANCING WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE AND RACIAL EQUALITY

WHILE LUCY STONE WAS A STAUNCH ADVOCATE FOR WOMEN'S VOTING RIGHTS, SHE RECOGNIZED THE IMPORTANCE OF SUPPORTING BROADER CIVIL RIGHTS INITIATIVES, EVEN IF THEY DID NOT IMMEDIATELY INCLUDE WOMEN. HER SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS ALSO STRATEGIC:

- ADVANCING DEMOCRATIC PRINCIPLES: SHE BELIEVED THAT EXPANDING VOTING RIGHTS TO BLACK MEN WAS ESSENTIAL FOR STRENGTHENING DEMOCRACY.
- BUILDING ALLIANCES: SUPPORTING THE AMENDMENT HELPED FORGE ALLIANCES WITH AFRICAN AMERICAN LEADERS AND OTHER REFORMERS, WHICH COULD EVENTUALLY BENEFIT WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE EFFORTS.
- INCREMENTAL PROGRESS: STONE UNDERSTOOD THAT SOCIAL REFORM OFTEN INVOLVED GRADUAL STEPS, AND BACKING THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS PART OF A LARGER STRATEGY TOWARD UNIVERSAL SUFFRAGE.

IMPACT ON THE WOMEN'S RIGHTS MOVEMENT

ALTHOUGH SOME WOMEN'S RIGHTS ACTIVISTS OPPOSED THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT BECAUSE IT DID NOT INCLUDE WOMEN, LUCY STONE'S POSITION REFLECTED HER PRAGMATIC APPROACH:

- SHE PRIORITIZED ADVANCING CIVIL RIGHTS FOR ALL MARGINALIZED GROUPS.
- HER SUPPORT HELPED SHAPE THE BROADER SOCIAL MOVEMENT TOWARD EQUALITY.
- SHE BELIEVED THAT SECURING VOTING RIGHTS FOR BLACK MEN WAS A NECESSARY FOUNDATION FOR FUTURE PROGRESS, INCLUDING WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS IN LUCY STONE'S SUPPORT

WHILE THE TWO MAIN REASONS DISCUSSED ARE CENTRAL TO HER SUPPORT, OTHER FACTORS ALSO INFLUENCED HER STANCE:

- MORAL AND ETHICAL CONVICTIONS: HER UNWAVERING BELIEF IN JUSTICE AND EQUALITY PROPELLED HER TO SUPPORT CIVIL RIGHTS INITIATIVES.
- EXPERIENCE WITH OPPRESSION: HAVING FACED GENDER DISCRIMINATION HERSELF, SHE EMPATHIZED WITH STRUGGLES AGAINST RACIAL INJUSTICE.
- POLITICAL STRATEGY: RECOGNIZING THE POLITICAL LANDSCAPE OF THE TIME, SHE SAW SUPPORTING THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT AS A MEANS TO PROMOTE BROADER SOCIAL REFORMS.

CONCLUSION: LUCY STONE'S LEGACY AND HER SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT

LUCY STONE'S SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS A REFLECTION OF HER DEEP COMMITMENT TO EQUALITY, JUSTICE, AND SOCIAL PROGRESS. HER BACKING WAS MOTIVATED BY HER BELIEF IN RACIAL JUSTICE, HER ABOLITIONIST PRINCIPLES, AND HER STRATEGIC UNDERSTANDING OF POLITICAL ALLIANCES AND INCREMENTAL REFORM. BY ADVOCATING FOR THE AMENDMENT, SHE DEMONSTRATED HER DEDICATION TO BUILDING A MORE INCLUSIVE AND JUST SOCIETY, EVEN WHEN HER OWN IMMEDIATE

GOALS—SUCH AS WOMEN’S SUFFRAGE—WERE NOT YET FULLY REALIZED. HER LEGACY CONTINUES TO INSPIRE THOSE WHO BELIEVE IN THE IMPORTANCE OF STANDING UP FOR CIVIL RIGHTS AND WORKING TOWARD A MORE EQUITABLE WORLD.

FAQs ABOUT LUCY STONE’S SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT

1. DID ALL WOMEN’S RIGHTS ACTIVISTS SUPPORT THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT?

NO, THERE WAS DIVISION AMONG WOMEN’S RIGHTS ACTIVISTS. SOME, LIKE ELIZABETH CADY STANTON AND SUSAN B. ANTHONY, OPPOSED THE AMENDMENT BECAUSE IT DID NOT INCLUDE WOMEN. OTHERS, LIKE LUCY STONE, SUPPORTED IT AS A STEP TOWARD CIVIL RIGHTS FOR ALL.

2. HOW DID LUCY STONE’S SUPPORT INFLUENCE THE WOMEN’S SUFFRAGE MOVEMENT?

HER SUPPORT FOR CIVIL RIGHTS AND THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT HELPED BROADEN THE SOCIAL REFORM MOVEMENT. WHILE SOME WOMEN’S RIGHTS LEADERS FELT BETRAYED, STONE’S PRAGMATIC APPROACH CONTRIBUTED TO COALITION-BUILDING EFFORTS.

3. WAS LUCY STONE’S SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT CONTROVERSIAL?

YES, ESPECIALLY AMONG WOMEN’S SUFFRAGISTS WHO BELIEVED THAT VOTING RIGHTS SHOULD BE UNIVERSAL REGARDLESS OF GENDER OR RACE. HOWEVER, STONE’S STANCE WAS ROOTED IN HER BELIEF IN RACIAL JUSTICE AND POLITICAL STRATEGY.

4. WHAT IS LUCY STONE’S LASTING IMPACT REGARDING CIVIL RIGHTS?

HER SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT EXEMPLIFIES HER COMMITMENT TO EQUALITY AND SOCIAL JUSTICE, PAVING THE WAY FOR FUTURE CIVIL RIGHTS ACTIVISM AND HIGHLIGHTING THE IMPORTANCE OF STRATEGIC ALLIANCES IN SOCIAL REFORM MOVEMENTS.

WHAT WERE THE TWO MAIN REASONS LUCY STONE SUPPORTED THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT?

LUCY STONE SUPPORTED THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT BECAUSE SHE BELIEVED IN UNIVERSAL SUFFRAGE REGARDLESS OF RACE AND WANTED TO ENSURE THAT AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN GAINED VOTING RIGHTS, ADVANCING THE CAUSE OF EQUALITY FOR ALL.

WHY DID LUCY STONE PRIORITIZE RACIAL EQUALITY IN HER SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT?

SHE BELIEVED THAT SECURING VOTING RIGHTS FOR AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN WAS A CRUCIAL STEP TOWARD ACHIEVING EQUALITY AND JUSTICE FOR MARGINALIZED GROUPS, INCLUDING WOMEN.

DID LUCY STONE'S SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT CAUSE ANY CONTROVERSY AMONG WOMEN'S RIGHTS ACTIVISTS?

SHE VIEWED IT AS A MEANS TO PROMOTE RACIAL JUSTICE, EXPAND DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS, AND LAY THE GROUNDWORK FOR FUTURE EQUALITY, INCLUDING WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

HOW DID LUCY STONE RECONCILE HER SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WITH HER ADVOCACY FOR WOMEN'S VOTING RIGHTS?

SHE BELIEVED THAT SUPPORTING AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN'S SUFFRAGE WAS ESSENTIAL FOR THE PROGRESS OF CIVIL RIGHTS AND THAT WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE WOULD FOLLOW LATER, THUS PRIORITIZING RACIAL EQUALITY FIRST.

WHAT WAS LUCY STONE'S STANCE ON THE TIMING OF WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE IN RELATION TO THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT?

SHE THOUGHT THAT SUPPORTING THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS A STRATEGIC STEP, AND THAT WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE WOULD COME AFTERWARD ONCE CIVIL RIGHTS FOR AFRICAN AMERICANS WERE SECURED.

HOW DID LUCY STONE'S SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT REFLECT HER COMMITMENT TO EQUALITY?

HER SUPPORT DEMONSTRATED HER BELIEF THAT ALL MARGINALIZED GROUPS DESERVED VOTING RIGHTS AND THAT RACIAL JUSTICE WAS A CRUCIAL COMPONENT OF ACHIEVING OVERALL EQUALITY.

WHAT IMPACT DID LUCY STONE'S SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT HAVE ON HER RELATIONSHIPS WITH OTHER WOMEN'S RIGHTS ADVOCATES?

IT CAUSED SOME DISAGREEMENTS, ESPECIALLY WITH SUFFRAGISTS WHO BELIEVED WOMEN'S RIGHTS SHOULD TAKE PRECEDENCE, BUT IT ALSO SHOWCASED HER COMMITMENT TO RACIAL JUSTICE WITHIN THE BROADER FIGHT FOR EQUALITY.

WHY IS LUCY STONE'S SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT CONSIDERED A SIGNIFICANT MOMENT IN CIVIL RIGHTS HISTORY?

THE CONTEXT OF THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT AND LUCY STONE'S ADVOCACY

BEFORE DELVING INTO HER REASONS, IT IS ESSENTIAL TO UNDERSTAND THE HISTORICAL BACKDROP. THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT, RATIFIED IN 1870, WAS A LANDMARK CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGE THAT PROHIBITED STATES FROM DENYING THE RIGHT TO VOTE BASED ON RACE, COLOR, OR PREVIOUS CONDITION OF SERVITUDE. WHILE IT WAS CELEBRATED BY MANY AFRICAN AMERICANS AND ABOLITIONISTS, IT ALSO SPARKED CONTROVERSY AMONG WOMEN'S RIGHTS ADVOCATES, INCLUDING ELIZABETH CADY STANTON AND SUSAN B. ANTHONY, BECAUSE IT DID NOT EXTEND VOTING RIGHTS TO WOMEN.

LUCY STONE, A PIONEERING WOMEN'S RIGHTS ACTIVIST AND ABOLITIONIST, FOUND HERSELF AT THE CENTER OF THIS DEBATE. UNLIKE STANTON AND ANTHONY, WHO OPPOSED THE AMENDMENT FOR EXCLUDING WOMEN, STONE SUPPORTED IT, BELIEVING THAT RACIAL JUSTICE WAS A CRUCIAL STEP TOWARD A MORE EQUITABLE SOCIETY. HER STANCE WAS ROOTED IN HER BROADER VISION OF SOCIAL REFORM AND HER STRATEGIC BELIEF IN WORKING WITHIN THE EXISTING POLITICAL FRAMEWORK.

REASON 1: COMMITMENT TO RACIAL JUSTICE AND ANTI-SLAVERY PRINCIPLES

A DEEPLY HELD MORAL CONVICTION

ONE OF THE FOREMOST REASONS LUCY STONE SUPPORTED THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS HER UNWAVERING COMMITMENT TO RACIAL JUSTICE AND THE PRINCIPLES OF ABOLITIONISM. AS A LONG-TIME ADVOCATE FOR THE END OF SLAVERY AND THE RIGHTS OF FORMERLY ENSLAVED PEOPLE, STONE BELIEVED THAT EXTENDING VOTING RIGHTS TO AFRICAN AMERICAN MEN WAS A MORAL IMPERATIVE. HER SUPPORT WAS ROOTED IN HER BELIEF THAT RACIAL EQUALITY WAS ESSENTIAL FOR THE PROGRESS OF JUSTICE AND HUMAN DIGNITY.

HISTORICAL AND PERSONAL ROOTS IN ABOLITIONISM

STONE'S EARLY ACTIVISM WAS INTERTWINED WITH THE ABOLITIONIST MOVEMENT. SHE WAS A PROMINENT SPEAKER AND ORGANIZER FOR ANTI-SLAVERY CAUSES AND BELIEVED THAT ENFRANCHISING BLACK MEN WAS A NATURAL EXTENSION OF THE FIGHT AGAINST SLAVERY. SUPPORTING THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT ALIGNED WITH HER BROADER GOAL OF ERADICATING RACIAL DISCRIMINATION AND PROMOTING CIVIL RIGHTS FOR ALL.

THE POWER OF POLITICAL PROGRESS

STONE SAW THE PASSAGE OF THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT AS A SIGNIFICANT VICTORY AGAINST THE LEGACY OF SLAVERY AND RACIAL OPPRESSION. SHE BELIEVED THAT SECURING VOTING RIGHTS FOR BLACK MEN WOULD LAY THE FOUNDATION FOR A MORE INCLUSIVE DEMOCRACY. FOR HER, SUPPORTING THE AMENDMENT WAS A STEP TOWARD A SOCIETY WHERE RACIAL JUSTICE COULD BE ACHIEVED, AND SHE PRIORITIZED THIS OVER IMMEDIATE WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

HIGHLIGHTED POINTS:

- HER LIFELONG DEDICATION TO ABOLISHING SLAVERY.
- THE BELIEF THAT RACIAL EQUALITY WAS INTEGRAL TO HUMAN RIGHTS.
- THE CONVICTION THAT POLITICAL PROGRESS FOR BLACK AMERICANS WOULD BENEFIT SOCIETY AS A WHOLE.
- THE STRATEGIC VIEW THAT SUPPORTING THE AMENDMENT COULD CREATE A MORE EQUITABLE AMERICA, OPENING DOORS FOR FUTURE REFORMS.

REASON 2: STRATEGIC APPROACH TO ACHIEVING WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE

BUILDING ALLIANCES AND POLITICAL INFLUENCE

WHILE LUCY STONE WAS A STAUNCH ADVOCATE FOR WOMEN'S RIGHTS, SHE ALSO RECOGNIZED THE IMPORTANCE OF PRAGMATIC ALLIANCES IN ACHIEVING SOCIAL CHANGE. HER SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS PARTLY STRATEGIC—SHE BELIEVED THAT SUPPORTING RACIAL VOTING RIGHTS COULD HELP BUILD GOODWILL AND INFLUENCE BROADER REFORM EFFORTS, INCLUDING WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

THE "INCREMENTAL" STRATEGY

STONE AND HER ALLIES OFTEN EMPLOYED AN INCREMENTAL APPROACH TO SOCIAL REFORM. INSTEAD OF INSISTING ON IMMEDIATE UNIVERSAL SUFFRAGE, SHE SAW SUPPORTING THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT AS A WAY TO ADVANCE CIVIL RIGHTS INCREMENTALLY. SHE BELIEVED THAT SECURING VOTING RIGHTS FOR BLACK MEN COULD, OVER TIME, PAVE THE WAY FOR WOMEN TO GAIN SIMILAR RIGHTS.

AVOIDING ALIENATION AND BUILDING COMMON CAUSE

SUPPORTING THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT ALLOWED STONE TO AVOID ALIENATING POTENTIAL ALLIES WHO PRIORITIZED RACIAL JUSTICE. BY ENDORSING THE AMENDMENT, SHE FOSTERED ALLIANCES WITH ABOLITIONISTS AND AFRICAN AMERICAN LEADERS, WHICH SHE BELIEVED COULD EVENTUALLY TRANSLATE INTO SUPPORT FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE. THIS STRATEGIC STANCE WAS ROOTED IN HER UNDERSTANDING THAT SOCIAL MOVEMENTS ARE OFTEN MOST SUCCESSFUL WHEN THEY WORK TOGETHER AND SUPPORT EACH OTHER'S VICTORIES.

THE "SPIDER WEB" OF JUSTICE

STONE FAMOUSLY ARTICULATED HER APPROACH TO REFORM AS A "WEB" OF INTERCONNECTED CAUSES—ABOLITION, WOMEN'S RIGHTS, TEMPERANCE, AND MORE. HER SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS PART OF THIS INTERCONNECTED STRATEGY, BELIEVING THAT PROGRESS IN ONE AREA COULD BOLSTER EFFORTS IN OTHERS.

HIGHLIGHTED POINTS:

- RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF BUILDING POLITICAL ALLIANCES.
- SUPPORTING RACIAL VOTING RIGHTS AS A STEPPING STONE TOWARD WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.
- EMPLOYING A PRAGMATIC, INCREMENTAL APPROACH TO SOCIAL REFORM.
- BELIEVING THAT VICTORIES IN ONE AREA COULD CATALYZE PROGRESS ACROSS MULTIPLE CAUSES.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS: CONTRASTING VIEWS AND PERSONAL CONVICTIONS

WHILE LUCY STONE'S SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS DRIVEN BY HER COMMITMENT TO RACIAL JUSTICE AND STRATEGIC REFORM, IT ALSO PLACED HER AT ODDS WITH SOME FELLOW FEMINISTS WHO BELIEVED THAT VOTING RIGHTS SHOULD BE EXTENDED TO WOMEN SIMULTANEOUSLY. HER NUANCED STANCE REFLECTS HER BELIEF THAT ADVANCING RACIAL EQUALITY WAS AN ESSENTIAL FOUNDATION FOR BROADER SOCIAL JUSTICE.

CONCLUSION: A LEGACY OF PRAGMATISM AND PRINCIPLES

IN SUMMARY, EXPLAIN TWO REASONS WHY LUCY STONE SUPPORTED THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT REVEALS HER COMPLEX INTERPLAY OF MORAL CONVICTION AND STRATEGIC THINKING. HER SUPPORT WAS ROOTED IN HER FIRM BELIEF IN RACIAL JUSTICE AND HER PRAGMATIC APPROACH TO SOCIAL REFORM, UNDERSTANDING THAT PROGRESS IN ONE AREA COULD BOLSTER EFFORTS IN ANOTHER. BY SUPPORTING THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT, LUCY STONE EXEMPLIFIED A VISION OF SOCIAL CHANGE THAT PRIORITIZED PRINCIPLES OF EQUALITY WHILE EMPLOYING STRATEGIC ALLIANCES TO ACHIEVE BROADER GOALS.

HER STANCE REMAINS A TESTAMENT TO THE MULTIFACETED NATURE OF ACTIVISM, WHERE MORAL PRINCIPLES OFTEN INTERSECT

WITH STRATEGIC CONSIDERATIONS. RECOGNIZING HER REASONS PROVIDES A RICHER UNDERSTANDING OF THE HISTORICAL DEBATES DURING RECONSTRUCTION AND HIGHLIGHTS THE IMPORTANCE OF NUANCED LEADERSHIP IN THE PURSUIT OF JUSTICE FOR ALL.

IN ESSENCE, LUCY STONE'S SUPPORT FOR THE FIFTEENTH AMENDMENT WAS BOTH A MORAL STANCE ROOTED IN HER ABOLITIONIST IDEALS AND A STRATEGIC MOVE DESIGNED TO ADVANCE THE BROADER CAUSE OF EQUALITY. HER LEGACY CONTINUES TO INSPIRE THOSE WHO BELIEVE THAT PROGRESS OFTEN REQUIRES A COMBINATION OF PRINCIPLED CONVICTION AND PRAGMATIC STRATEGY.

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
