

A SUBJECTIVE EVALUATION OF WHICH RISK IS WORSE DURING RISK PERCEPTION IS KNOWN AS?

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UNDERSTANDING HOW HUMANS PERCEIVE AND EVALUATE RISKS IS FUNDAMENTAL TO FIELDS RANGING FROM PSYCHOLOGY AND PUBLIC HEALTH TO RISK MANAGEMENT AND POLICY DEVELOPMENT. IN THE REALM OF RISK PERCEPTION, ONE INTRIGUING QUESTION ARISES: "WHICH RISK IS WORSE?" THE ANSWER ISN'T STRAIGHTFORWARD BECAUSE PERCEPTIONS VARY WIDELY AMONG INDIVIDUALS AND COMMUNITIES. THE PROCESS OF EVALUATING AND COMPARING RISKS BASED ON SUBJECTIVE JUDGMENT IS A CRITICAL COMPONENT OF UNDERSTANDING HUMAN BEHAVIOR IN UNCERTAIN SITUATIONS. - CONTROL: RISKS PERCEIVED AS CONTROLLABLE ARE OFTEN VIEWED AS LESS DANGEROUS.
- DREAD: RISKS THAT EVOKE FEAR OR DREAD ARE PERCEIVED AS MORE SEVERE.
- CATASTROPHIC POTENTIAL: THE POSSIBILITY OF SEVERE CONSEQUENCES INCREASES PERCEIVED RISK.
- MEDIA INFLUENCE: MEDIA COVERAGE CAN AMPLIFY PERCEPTIONS OF CERTAIN RISKS.

THE IMPORTANCE OF SUBJECTIVE EVALUATION IN RISK MANAGEMENT

UNDERSTANDING SUBJECTIVE RISK EVALUATIONS IS VITAL FOR:

- DESIGNING EFFECTIVE PUBLIC HEALTH CAMPAIGNS.

How Do People Decide Which Risk Is Worse?

WHEN INDIVIDUALS ARE ASKED TO COMPARE TWO OR MORE RISKS AND DETERMINE WHICH IS WORSE, THEY ENGAGE IN A COMPLEX COGNITIVE PROCESS INVOLVING:

- ASSESSMENT OF POTENTIAL HARM: CONSIDERING THE SEVERITY AND LIKELIHOOD.

FOR EXAMPLE, PEOPLE MIGHT PERCEIVE A RISK OF DYING FROM A PLANE CRASH AS WORSE THAN A RISK OF DYING FROM A CAR ACCIDENT, EVEN IF STATISTICALLY, CAR ACCIDENTS ARE MORE COMMON. THIS DISCREPANCY ILLUSTRATES THE INFLUENCE OF FACTORS LIKE DREAD AND UNFAMILIARITY.

SUBJECTIVE EVALUATION AND ITS IMPACT ON DECISION-MAKING

THE SUBJECTIVE EVALUATION PROCESS CAN LEAD TO:

- OVERESTIMATION OF RARE BUT DRAMATIC RISKS (E.G., TERRORISM).
- UNDERESTIMATION OF COMMON BUT LESS SENSATIONAL RISKS (E.G., SMOKING).
- MISMATCHED RESPONSES TO ACTUAL RISK LEVELS, LEADING TO EITHER PANIC OR COMPLACENCY.

- PUBLIC RESPONSE TO COVID-19: DIFFERENT COMMUNITIES ASSESSED THE RISKS OF INFECTION VERSUS ECONOMIC IMPACT, INFLUENCING COMPLIANCE WITH HEALTH GUIDELINES.
- ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: RESIDENTS LIVING NEAR INDUSTRIAL SITES MAY PERCEIVE POLLUTION RISKS AS WORSE DUE TO MEDIA COVERAGE, DESPITE SCIENTIFIC EVIDENCE INDICATING LOW HEALTH IMPACTS.
- TECHNOLOGICAL RISKS: PEOPLE OFTEN FEAR NEW TECHNOLOGIES LIKE GENETICALLY MODIFIED ORGANISMS MORE THAN ESTABLISHED ONES, BASED ON PERCEIVED UNFAMILIARITY AND DREAD.

CONCLUSION

THE SUBJECTIVE EVALUATION OF WHICH RISK IS WORSE DURING RISK PERCEPTION IS A NUANCED PROCESS INFLUENCED BY EMOTIONAL, COGNITIVE, AND SOCIAL FACTORS. PSYCHOMETRIC PARADIGM

- DEVELOPED BY PAUL SLOVIC AND COLLEAGUES, THIS PARADIGM STUDIES HOW PEOPLE PERCEIVE AND EVALUATE RISKS BASED ON QUALITATIVE CHARACTERISTICS.
- IT IDENTIFIES FACTORS THAT INFLUENCE PERCEIVED RISK SEVERITY, SUCH AS:
 - DREAD FACTOR: HOW FRIGHTENING OR UNCONTROLLABLE A RISK APPEARS
 - UNKNOWN RISK: FAMILIARITY AND SCIENTIFIC KNOWLEDGE
 - NUMBER OF PEOPLE AFFECTED: SCALE OF IMPACT
 - CATASTROPHIC POTENTIAL: LIKELIHOOD OF SEVERE OUTCOMES

HEURISTICS AND BIASES

- COGNITIVE SHORTCUTS THAT INFLUENCE RISK PERCEPTION:
 - AVAILABILITY HEURISTIC: RISKS THAT ARE MORE MEMORABLE OR RECENT SEEM MORE PROBABLE
 - REPRESENTATIVENESS HEURISTIC: RISKS SIMILAR TO KNOWN DANGERS ARE PERCEIVED AS WORSE
 - OPTIMISM BIAS: UNDERESTIMATING PERSONAL VULNERABILITY
 - ANCHORING BIAS: INITIAL INFORMATION INFLUENCES PERCEPTION DISPROPORTIONATELY

RISK AS FEELINGS MODEL

- PROPOSED BY GEORGE LOEWENSTEIN, THIS MODEL EMPHASIZES THAT EMOTIONAL REACTIONS OFTEN OUTWEIGH ANALYTICAL REASONING IN RISK JUDGMENTS.
- THE "AFFECT HEURISTIC" SUGGESTS THAT PEOPLE RELY ON THEIR FEELINGS ABOUT RISKS WHEN FORMING PERCEPTIONS.

CULTURAL THEORY

- HIGHLIGHTS HOW CULTURAL VALUES SHAPE PERCEPTIONS OF RISKS.
- DIFFERENT SOCIETIES MAY PRIORITIZE CERTAIN HAZARDS OVER OTHERS BASED ON COLLECTIVE BELIEFS.

WHICH RISKS ARE PERCEIVED AS WORSE? FACTORS INFLUENCING SUBJECTIVE JUDGMENT

IN PRACTICE, SOME RISKS TEND TO BE PERCEIVED AS WORSE REGARDLESS OF THEIR OBJECTIVE DANGER. SEVERAL FACTORS INFLUENCE THIS SUBJECTIVE HIERARCHY:

1. DREAD AND UNCONTROLLABILITY

- RISKS PERCEIVED AS UNCONTROLLABLE OR CATASTROPHIC EVOKE STRONGER NEGATIVE REACTIONS.
- EXAMPLES:
 - NUCLEAR ACCIDENTS
 - PANDEMICS
 - TERRORISM

2. FAMILIARITY AND NOVELTY

- FAMILIAR RISKS ARE OFTEN UNDERESTIMATED BECAUSE THEY SEEM MANAGEABLE.
- CONVERSELY, NOVEL OR UNFAMILIAR RISKS ARE PERCEIVED AS MORE THREATENING.
- EXAMPLE: EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES LIKE AI OR GENETICALLY MODIFIED ORGANISMS (GMOs).

3. MEDIA AMPLIFICATION

- MEDIA COVERAGE CAN INFLATE PERCEIVED RISK BY EMPHASIZING WORST-CASE SCENARIOS.
- "DISASTER STORIES" TEND TO STICK IN PUBLIC CONSCIOUSNESS, RAISING PERCEIVED SEVERITY.

4. PERSONAL AND CULTURAL EXPERIENCES

- PAST ENCOUNTERS WITH HAZARDS INFLUENCE PERCEPTION.
- CULTURAL NARRATIVES AND SOCIETAL ATTITUDES ALSO SHAPE WHAT RISKS ARE PRIORITIZED.

5. PERSONAL VULNERABILITY AND CONTROL

- INDIVIDUALS WHO FEEL THEY HAVE CONTROL OVER A RISK TEND TO PERCEIVE IT AS LESS DANGEROUS.
- CONVERSELY, LACK OF CONTROL HEIGHTENS PERCEIVED SEVERITY.

IMPLICATIONS OF SUBJECTIVE RISK EVALUATION IN DECISION-MAKING

- MISTRUST OR OVERESTIMATION OF CERTAIN HAZARDS CAN LEAD TO PANIC OR COMPLACENCY.

POLICY AND RISK COMMUNICATION

- EFFECTIVE RISK COMMUNICATION MUST ACCOUNT FOR SUBJECTIVE PERCEPTIONS.
