THE OPTIONS ARE:

- A. SINCE

- B. For
- C. So far
- D. Got

OUR GOAL IS TO DETERMINE WHICH OF THESE BEST FITS THE INTENDED MEANING.

EXAMINING EACH OPTION IN DETAIL

OPTION A: SINCE

USAGE:

SINCE IS USED TO INDICATE THE STARTING POINT OF AN ACTION THAT CONTINUES UP TO THE PRESENT. IT IS OFTEN FOLLOWED BY A SPECIFIC POINT IN TIME OR A DATE.

EXAMPLE:

- I HAVE BEEN WORKING HERE SINCE 2010.
- SHE HAS LIVED IN PARIS SINCE SHE WAS A CHILD.

IN CONTEXT:

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SINCE TEN O'CLOCK."

THIS CONSTRUCTION SUGGESTS THAT THE RECIPIENT HAS BEEN RECEIVING EMAILS CONTINUOUSLY FROM TEN O'CLOCK UP TO NOW.

IMPLICATION:

IT EMPHASIZES THE STARTING POINT OF AN ONGOING PROCESS.

OPTION B: FOR

USAGE:

FOR IS USED TO SPECIFY THE DURATION OF AN ACTION.

EXAMPLE:

- I HAVE BEEN WAITING FOR TWO HOURS.
- SHE HAS LIVED HERE FOR FIVE YEARS.

IN CONTEXT:

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS FOR TEN O'CLOCK."

THIS SENTENCE IS GRAMMATICALLY INCORRECT BECAUSE FOR NEEDS TO BE FOLLOWED BY A TIME DURATION, NOT A SPECIFIC TIME LIKE TEN O'CLOCK.

IMPLICATION:

USING FOR HERE WOULD BE INCORRECT UNLESS REPHRASED TO INDICATE DURATION, E.G., "FOR TWO HOURS."

OPTION C: SO FAR

USAGE:

SO FAR INDICATES THAT UP TO THE PRESENT MOMENT, A CERTAIN AMOUNT OR NUMBER HAS BEEN ACHIEVED OR OBSERVED.

EXAMPLE:

- I HAVE READ FIVE BOOKS SO FAR.
- THE PROJECT HAS BEEN SUCCESSFUL SO FAR.

IN CONTEXT:

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SO FAR."

THIS MAKES SENSE BECAUSE IT INDICATES THAT UP TO NOW, TWENTY EMAILS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED.

IMPLICATION:

IT SUGGESTS THAT THE PROCESS MAY STILL BE ONGOING AND THE TOTAL COULD INCREASE.

OPTION D: GOT

USAGE:

GOT IS A SIMPLE PAST TENSE OF GET AND CAN INDICATE POSSESSION OR RECEIPT.

EXAMPLE:

- I GOT A NEW CAR YESTERDAY.
- SHE GOT THE MESSAGE THIS MORNING.

IN CONTEXT:

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS GOT TEN O'CLOCK."

THIS IS GRAMMATICALLY INCORRECT; GOT WOULD NOT FIT DIRECTLY AFTER THE TIME INDICATION IN THIS STRUCTURE.

IMPLICATION:

USING GOT HERE WOULD REQUIRE REPHRASING, SUCH AS "I GOT TWENTY EMAILS BY TEN O'CLOCK," WHICH CHANGES THE SENTENCE STRUCTURE.

DETERMINING THE BEST FIT FOR THE SENTENCE

BASED ON THE ANALYSIS, LET'S REVISIT THE SENTENCE FRAGMENT:

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS... TEN O'CLOCK."

THE GOAL IS TO COMPLETE THIS WITH THE MOST APPROPRIATE OPTION TO MAKE A CORRECT AND MEANINGFUL SENTENCE.

- USING "SINCE":

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SINCE TEN O'CLOCK."

THIS INDICATES THAT FROM TEN O'CLOCK UP TO NOW, THE PERSON HAS RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS. IT IS GRAMMATICALLY CORRECT AND CONTEXTUALLY APPROPRIATE.

- USING "FOR":

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS FOR TEN O'CLOCK."

THIS IS AWKWARD UNLESS REPHRASED; IT MIGHT IMPLY THE EMAILS ARE DUE BY TEN O'CLOCK OR RECEIVED OVER A DURATION LEADING UP TO TEN O'CLOCK, BUT AS IS, IT DOESN'T FIT WELL.

- USING "SO FAR":

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SO FAR."

THIS IS CORRECT BUT DOES NOT SPECIFY THE TIME, ONLY THAT UP TO NOW, TWENTY EMAILS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED.

- USING "GOT":

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS GOT TEN O'CLOCK."

THIS IS UNGRAMMATICAL AS PRESENTED.

CONCLUSION:

THE BEST FIT IS OPTION A: SINCE, MAKING THE COMPLETE SENTENCE:

"QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SINCE TEN O'CLOCK."

THIS CLEARLY INDICATES THE EMAILS RECEIVED FROM TEN O'CLOCK UP TO THE PRESENT MOMENT.

PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS AND TIPS FOR USING TIME EXPRESSIONS CORRECTLY

HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT TIME EXPRESSION

- USE "SINCE" WHEN REFERRING TO THE STARTING POINT OF AN ONGOING ACTION OR STATE.

EXAMPLE: "I'VE BEEN WAITING SINCE 3 P.M."

- USE "FOR" WHEN INDICATING THE DURATION.

EXAMPLE: "I'VE BEEN WAITING FOR THREE HOURS."

- USE "SO FAR" TO EXPRESS PROGRESS UP TO THE CURRENT MOMENT.

EXAMPLE: "I'VE COMPLETED THREE CHAPTERS SO FAR."

- USE "GOT" MAINLY IN PAST TENSE CONTEXTS TO INDICATE POSSESSION OR RECEIPT.

EXAMPLE: "I GOT YOUR EMAIL YESTERDAY."

COMMON MISTAKES TO AVOID

- MIXING SINCE AND FOR INCORRECTLY.

- USING FOR WITH SPECIFIC TIMES (E.G., "FOR TEN O'CLOCK")—WHICH IS USUALLY INCORRECT UNLESS REPHRASED.

- OMITTING NECESSARY AUXILIARY VERBS WHEN CONSTRUCTING TIME-RELATED SENTENCES.

- USING GOT AS AN AUXILIARY VERB WHERE HAVE OR HAS IS APPROPRIATE.

SAMPLE SENTENCES FOR PRACTICE

1. I HAVE BEEN WORKING ON THIS PROJECT SINCE MONDAY.

2. SHE HAS LIVED HERE FOR FIVE YEARS.

3. WE HAVE RECEIVED EMAILS SO FAR TODAY.

4. THEY GOT THEIR TICKETS YESTERDAY.

CONCLUSION: MASTERING TIME EXPRESSIONS FOR CLEAR COMMUNICATION

PROPER USE OF TIME EXPRESSIONS LIKE SINCE, FOR, SO FAR, AND VERBS LIKE GOT IS ESSENTIAL FOR CLEAR AND EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION IN ENGLISH. BY UNDERSTANDING THE SPECIFIC CONTEXTS AND GRAMMATICAL RULES ASSOCIATED WITH EACH, LEARNERS CAN ENHANCE THEIR WRITING AND SPEAKING SKILLS.

IN THE CASE OF THE SENTENCE FRAGMENT INVOLVING "QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS... TEN O'CLOCK," THE OPTIMAL CHOICE IS "SINCE," LEADING TO THE COMPLETE, CORRECT SENTENCE:

> QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SINCE TEN O'CLOCK.

THIS STRUCTURE ACCURATELY CONVEYS THAT FROM TEN O'CLOCK ONWARD, THE PERSON HAS BEEN RECEIVING EMAILS UP TO THE CURRENT MOMENT.

FINAL TIPS:

- ALWAYS CONSIDER WHETHER YOU ARE INDICATING A STARTING POINT, DURATION, CURRENT PROGRESS, OR PAST POSSESSION TO SELECT THE APPROPRIATE WORD OR PHRASE.
- PRACTICE CONSTRUCTING SENTENCES WITH EACH TIME EXPRESSION TO INTERNALIZE THEIR CORRECT USAGE.
- WHEN IN DOUBT, THINK ABOUT WHETHER THE ACTION IS ONGOING, COMPLETED, OR SPECIFIC TO A POINT IN TIME.

BY MASTERING THESE CONCEPTS, YOU'LL IMPROVE YOUR FLUENCY AND CONFIDENCE IN USING ENGLISH EFFECTIVELY IN BOTH WRITTEN AND SPOKEN COMMUNICATION.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS THE CORRECT WAY TO COMPLETE THE SENTENCE 'QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS...'?

THE CORRECT COMPLETION IS 'SINCE B', MAKING THE SENTENCE: 'QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SINCE B.'

WHICH OPTION BEST FITS THE SENTENCE: 'QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS ... TEN O'CLOCK'?

OPTION C: 'SO FAR' FITS BEST, RESULTING IN 'QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SO FAR TEN O'CLOCK.'

WHAT DOES THE PHRASE 'SINCE B' IMPLY IN THE CONTEXT OF RECEIVING EMAILS?

IT IMPLIES THAT THE TWENTY EMAILS WERE RECEIVED STARTING FROM A SPECIFIC POINT IN TIME LABELED 'B'.

HOW DOES 'SO FAR' FUNCTION IN THE SENTENCE ABOUT EMAILS RECEIVED?

'SO FAR' INDICATES THE NUMBER OF EMAILS RECEIVED UP TO THE PRESENT MOMENT.

WHICH OPTION INDICATES A TIME-RELATED PHRASE SUITABLE FOR THE SENTENCE?

OPTION C: 'SO FAR' IS TIME-RELATED AND APPROPRIATE FOR EXPRESSING THE ONGOING COUNT OF EMAILS.

WHAT IS THE LIKELY INTENDED MEANING BEHIND 'QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY

EMAILS...’?

IT SUGGESTS THAT THE SPEAKER HAS RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS UP TO THIS POINT OR WITHIN A CERTAIN PERIOD.

WHY MIGHT ‘SINCE B’ BE CONSIDERED A GRAMMATICALLY CORRECT CHOICE IN THIS CONTEXT?

BECAUSE IT IMPLIES A STARTING POINT IN TIME FROM WHICH THE EMAILS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED.

CAN ‘GOT’ BE A SUITABLE COMPLETION FOR THE SENTENCE?

NO, ‘GOT’ ALONE DOES NOT COMPLETE THE SENTENCE PROPERLY; IT WOULD NEED MORE CONTEXT OR WORDS.

WHAT IS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE PHRASE ‘TEN O’CLOCK’ IN THE SENTENCE OPTIONS?

IT INDICATES A SPECIFIC TIME REFERENCE, POSSIBLY INDICATING WHEN THE EMAILS WERE RECEIVED OR THE TIME FRAME BEING DISCUSSED.

WHICH OF THE OPTIONS PROVIDED ARE MOST RELEVANT IN THE CONTEXT OF TRACKING EMAILS OVER TIME?

UNDERSTANDING THE QUESTION

THE CORE OF THIS QUESTION REVOLVES AROUND SELECTING THE MOST APPROPRIATE WORD OR PHRASE TO COMPLETE A SENTENCE THAT INVOLVES A TIMELINE OR THE ACCUMULATION OF EMAILS RECEIVED UP TO A SPECIFIC POINT IN TIME—IN THIS CASE, TEN O’CLOCK. THE PHRASE “QUESTION 2 I’VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS” SETS THE SCENE, AND THE OPTIONS A THROUGH D ARE INTENDED TO CLARIFY THE TIMEFRAME OR THE NATURE OF THE EMAILS RECEIVED.

THE SENTENCE FRAGMENT

THE SENTENCE FRAGMENT CAN BE INTERPRETED AS:

> “I’VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS ____ TEN O’CLOCK.”

THE TASK IS TO SELECT THE BEST OPTION THAT LOGICALLY AND GRAMMATICALLY COMPLETES THIS SENTENCE.

ANALYZING EACH OPTION

LET’S LOOK AT EACH CHOICE—SINCE, FOR, SO FAR, GOT—AND EXAMINE HOW THEY FIT INTO THE SENTENCE.

OPTION A: SINCE

- USAGE: "SINCE" IS USED TO INDICATE THE STARTING POINT OF A PERIOD CONTINUING UP TO NOW OR A SPECIFIC TIME.
- EXAMPLE: "I HAVE BEEN WAITING SINCE 8 A.M."
- APPLICATION: "I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SINCE TEN O'CLOCK."

EVALUATION: THIS INDICATES THAT THE RECEIPT OF EMAILS BEGAN AT TEN O'CLOCK AND CONTINUES TO THE PRESENT. HOWEVER, IN THE ORIGINAL SENTENCE, TEN O'CLOCK IS A SPECIFIC POINT IN TIME, AND THE PHRASE "SINCE TEN O'CLOCK" SUGGESTS THE EMAILS STARTED ARRIVING AT THAT TIME AND MAY STILL BE ARRIVING.

POSSIBLE SENTENCE:

"I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SINCE TEN O'CLOCK."

MEANING: THE TWENTY EMAILS STARTED ARRIVING AT TEN O'CLOCK AND PERHAPS ARE STILL ARRIVING.

OPTION B: FOR

- USAGE: "FOR" IS USED TO SPECIFY A DURATION OF TIME.
- EXAMPLE: "I HAVE BEEN WAITING FOR TWO HOURS."
- APPLICATION: "I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS FOR TEN O'CLOCK."

EVALUATION: USING "FOR" WITH A SPECIFIC TIME LIKE TEN O'CLOCK IS AWKWARD. "FOR" GENERALLY PAIRS WITH DURATIONS (E.G., MINUTES, HOURS, DAYS), NOT SPECIFIC POINTS IN TIME.

POSSIBLE SENTENCE:

"I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS FOR THE PAST HOUR."

BUT AS PHRASED, "FOR TEN O'CLOCK" DOESN'T MAKE SENSE BECAUSE IT DOESN'T SPECIFY A DURATION; IT REFERENCES A SPECIFIC TIME POINT.

OPTION C: SO FAR

- USAGE: "SO FAR" INDICATES AN ONGOING PROCESS UP TO THE PRESENT MOMENT.
- EXAMPLE: "I HAVE READ THREE CHAPTERS SO FAR."
- APPLICATION: "I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SO FAR."

EVALUATION: THIS FITS NATURALLY WHEN THE CONTEXT IS ABOUT THE ACCUMULATION OF EMAILS UP TO NOW, REGARDLESS OF THE SPECIFIC TIME.

POSSIBLE SENTENCE:

"I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SO FAR."

MEANING: UP TO NOW, TWENTY EMAILS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED.

OPTION D: GOT

- USAGE: "GOT" IS THE PAST TENSE OF "GET" AND IS COLLOQUIALLY USED TO MEAN "RECEIVED."
- EXAMPLE: "I GOT A LETTER YESTERDAY."
- APPLICATION: "I'VE GOT TWENTY EMAILS ____ TEN O'CLOCK."

EVALUATION: "GOT" ALONE DOESN'T FIT GRAMMATICALLY WITH THE TIME REFERENCE. IT MIGHT BE PART OF A LARGER PHRASE LIKE "GOTTEN" (MORE COMMON IN AMERICAN ENGLISH), BUT IN THIS CONTEXT, IT DOESN'T SERVE AS A CONJUNCTION OR PREPOSITION.

SELECTING THE BEST FIT

BASED ON THE ANALYSIS, THE OPTIONS "SINCE" AND "SO FAR" ARE THE MOST PLAUSIBLE BECAUSE THEY RELATE DIRECTLY TO THE TIMEFRAME OF RECEIVING EMAILS.

COMPARING "SINCE" AND "SO FAR"

- "SINCE" EMPHASIZES THE STARTING POINT OF THE EMAIL RECEPTION AT TEN O'CLOCK, IMPLYING EMAILS HAVE BEEN ARRIVING FROM THAT MOMENT ONWARD.
- "SO FAR" EMPHASIZES THE TOTAL RECEIVED UP TO THE CURRENT MOMENT, WHICH COULD BE AT OR AFTER TEN O'CLOCK.

CONTEXTUAL CLUES AND PRACTICAL USAGE

TO DETERMINE WHICH FITS BEST, CONSIDER THE CONTEXT:

- IF THE FOCUS IS ON THE BEGINNING OF RECEIVING EMAILS AT TEN O'CLOCK, "SINCE" MAKES SENSE.
- IF THE FOCUS IS ON THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EMAILS RECEIVED UP TO NOW, "SO FAR" IS MORE APPROPRIATE.

SUPPOSE THE STATEMENT IS:

> "QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SINCE TEN O'CLOCK."

THIS INDICATES THAT STARTING AT TEN O'CLOCK, THE PERSON HAS RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS, POSSIBLY CONTINUING TO RECEIVE MORE.

ALTERNATIVELY,

> "QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS SO FAR."

THIS INDICATES THAT UP TO THIS MOMENT (PERHAPS AFTER TEN O'CLOCK), TWENTY EMAILS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED.

PRACTICAL TIPS FOR ANSWERING SIMILAR QUESTIONS

1. IDENTIFY THE TIME REFERENCE: LOOK FOR WORDS INDICATING A SPECIFIC TIME (E.G., "AT," "SINCE," "UNTIL") OR A PERIOD (E.G., "FOR," "DURING").
2. DETERMINE THE FOCUS: IS THE SENTENCE EMPHASIZING WHEN SOMETHING STARTED, HOW LONG IT HAS BEEN HAPPENING, OR THE TOTAL ACCUMULATED AMOUNT?
3. MATCH THE FUNCTION OF THE WORD/PHRASE:
 - "SINCE" = FROM A SPECIFIC POINT IN TIME ONWARDS.
 - "FOR" = OVER A DURATION.
 - "SO FAR" = UP TO NOW.
 - "GOT" = COLLOQUIAL PAST TENSE OF "GET," NOT SUITABLE HERE.

ACCUMULATING EMAILS.

QUESTIONS LIKE "QUESTION 2 I'VE RECEIVED TWENTY EMAILS... TEN O'CLOCK. A. SINCE B. FOR C. SO FAR D. GOT" TEST YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF TIME EXPRESSIONS AND YOUR ABILITY TO CHOOSE CONTEXTUALLY APPROPRIATE WORDS. REMEMBER, THE KEY LIES IN UNDERSTANDING WHETHER THE SENTENCE EMPHASIZES THE STARTING POINT, DURATION, OR TOTAL ACCUMULATED ACTION.

BY MASTERING THESE DISTINCTIONS, YOU'LL IMPROVE YOUR COMPREHENSION AND AVOID COMMON PITFALLS IN ENGLISH GRAMMAR AND USAGE. PRACTICE REGULARLY WITH SIMILAR QUESTIONS, AND YOU'LL DEVELOP AN INTUITIVE SENSE OF WHICH WORDS NATURALLY FIT THE CONTEXT, ENSURING CLARITY AND CORRECTNESS IN YOUR WRITING AND SPEAKING.
