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GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT (GDP) IS A KEY INDICATOR USED WORLDWIDE TO MEASURE THE ECONOMIC PERFORMANCE OF A COUNTRY. IT QUANTIFIES THE TOTAL MONETARY VALUE OF ALL FINISHED GOODS AND SERVICES PRODUCED WITHIN A NATION'S BORDERS OVER A SPECIFIC PERIOD. HOWEVER, NOT ALL ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES ARE CAPTURED IN GDP CALCULATIONS. ONE NOTABLE EXAMPLE IS HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION, SUCH AS BAKING BREAD AT HOME. THIS OMISSION STEMS FROM SEVERAL REASONS ROOTED IN ECONOMIC MEASUREMENT PRINCIPLES, DATA COLLECTION CHALLENGES, AND THE NATURE OF INFORMAL ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES. UNDERSTANDING WHY HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION IS EXCLUDED FROM GDP IS ESSENTIAL FOR GRASPING THE LIMITATIONS AND SCOPE OF ECONOMIC INDICATORS, AS WELL AS THE BROADER IMPLICATIONS FOR ASSESSING ECONOMIC WELL-BEING.

UNDERSTANDING GDP AND ITS MEASUREMENT

WHAT IS GDP?

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT MEASURES THE MARKET VALUE OF ALL FINAL GOODS AND SERVICES PRODUCED WITHIN A COUNTRY'S BORDERS IN A GIVEN PERIOD. IT SERVES AS A COMPREHENSIVE INDICATOR OF A NATION'S ECONOMIC ACTIVITY AND IS USED BY POLICYMAKERS, ECONOMISTS, AND INVESTORS TO ANALYZE ECONOMIC HEALTH, COMPARE COUNTRIES, AND FORMULATE POLICIES.

COMPONENTS OF GDP

GDP IS TYPICALLY CALCULATED USING THREE APPROACHES:

- PRODUCTION (OR OUTPUT) APPROACH: SUMMING THE VALUE ADDED AT EACH STAGE OF PRODUCTION.
- INCOME APPROACH: SUMMING ALL INCOMES EARNED BY FACTORS OF PRODUCTION.
- EXPENDITURE APPROACH: SUMMING TOTAL SPENDING ON FINAL GOODS AND SERVICES.

DESPITE THESE METHODOLOGIES, CERTAIN ACTIVITIES REMAIN UNMEASURED IN GDP CALCULATIONS, NOTABLY HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION.

WHY IS HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION NOT INCLUDED IN GDP?

1. NATURE OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION IS INFORMAL AND NON-MARKET

HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION ENCOMPASSES ACTIVITIES LIKE COOKING, CLEANING, CHILDCARE, GARDENING, AND BAKING BREAD AT HOME. THESE ACTIVITIES ARE PERFORMED FOR PERSONAL CONSUMPTION RATHER THAN FOR SALE IN THE MARKET, MAKING THEM NON-MARKET ACTIVITIES.

- NON-MARKET ACTIVITIES ARE THOSE THAT DO NOT INVOLVE MONETARY TRANSACTIONS.
- SINCE THEY ARE NOT BOUGHT OR SOLD, THEY LACK A MARKET PRICE, MAKING VALUATION DIFFICULT.

2. DIFFICULTY IN VALUATION

GDP RELIES ON MARKET PRICES TO QUANTIFY THE VALUE OF GOODS AND SERVICES. HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITIES, BY THEIR VERY NATURE, DO NOT HAVE EXPLICIT PRICES.

- ASSIGNING A MONETARY VALUE TO PERSONAL LABOR OR TIME SPENT IS INHERENTLY CHALLENGING.
- ESTIMATIONS REQUIRE ASSUMPTIONS ABOUT WAGES OR MARKET EQUIVALENTS, WHICH INTRODUCE INACCURACIES.

3. DATA COLLECTION CHALLENGES

MEASURING HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION ON A NATIONAL SCALE IS COMPLEX:

- SURVEY LIMITATIONS: HOUSEHOLD SURVEYS MAY NOT CAPTURE ALL INFORMAL ACTIVITIES.
- RECALL BIAS: RESPONDENTS MAY FORGET OR UNDERESTIMATE TIME SPENT.
- COSTLY AND IMPRACTICAL: GATHERING DETAILED DATA ON ALL HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITIES WOULD BE RESOURCE-INTENSIVE.

4. FOCUS ON MARKET TRANSACTIONS

GDP AIMS TO CAPTURE MARKET-BASED ECONOMIC ACTIVITY BECAUSE:

- IT REFLECTS ACTUAL TRANSACTIONS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO ECONOMIC OUTPUT.
- IT PROVIDES A STANDARDIZED, COMPARABLE MEASURE ACROSS COUNTRIES.
- HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITIES, ALTHOUGH VALUABLE, ARE CONSIDERED OUTSIDE THE SCOPE OF MARKET-BASED ECONOMIC MEASUREMENT.

5. AVOIDING DOUBLE COUNTING

INCLUDING HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION COULD LEAD TO DOUBLE COUNTING:

- FOR EXAMPLE, IF SOMEONE BAKES BREAD AT HOME, IT IS NOT COUNTED SEPARATELY FROM FOOD PRODUCTION.
- SINCE THE BREAD IS FOR PERSONAL CONSUMPTION, INCLUDING IT IN GDP WOULD INFLATE THE MEASURE WITHOUT REFLECTING MARKET ACTIVITY.

EXAMPLES OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION ACTIVITIES EXCLUDED FROM GDP

- BAKING BREAD, COOKING MEALS, AND PREPARING FOOD AT HOME.
- CHILDCARE, ELDERCARE, AND OTHER CAREGIVING TASKS PERFORMED WITHIN HOUSEHOLDS.
- CLEANING, LAUNDRY, AND HOME MAINTENANCE.
- GARDENING, YARD WORK, AND HOME REPAIRS.
- SEWING, KNITTING, AND OTHER CRAFT ACTIVITIES DONE FOR PERSONAL USE.

IMPLICATIONS OF EXCLUDING HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION FROM GDP

1. UNDERESTIMATION OF ACTUAL ECONOMIC ACTIVITY

WHILE GDP PROVIDES A MEASURE OF MARKET ACTIVITY, IT DOES NOT ACCOUNT FOR THE VALUABLE WORK DONE WITHIN HOUSEHOLDS. THIS CAN LEAD TO:

- UNDERESTIMATING THE TOTAL ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTION OF INDIVIDUALS.
- OVERLOOKING THE UNPAID LABOR THAT SUSTAINS HOUSEHOLDS AND COMMUNITIES.

2. IMPACT ON POLICY AND WELFARE ANALYSIS

THE EXCLUSION OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION AFFECTS:

- POLICY DECISIONS: SOCIAL WELFARE PROGRAMS, LABOR POLICIES, AND ECONOMIC ASSESSMENTS MAY NOT FULLY CONSIDER UNPAID WORK.
- GENDER DISPARITIES: SINCE WOMEN OFTEN PERFORM A SIGNIFICANT SHARE OF HOUSEHOLD WORK, THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS MAY BE UNDERVALUED.
- MEASUREMENT OF WELL-BEING: GDP IS AN IMPERFECT PROXY FOR LIVING STANDARDS BECAUSE IT IGNORES UNPAID HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITIES.

3. ALTERNATIVE MEASURES AND APPROACHES

RECOGNIZING THESE LIMITATIONS, ECONOMISTS AND POLICYMAKERS HAVE DEVELOPED SUPPLEMENTARY INDICATORS:

- SATELLITE ACCOUNTS: EXTENSIONS OF GDP THAT ESTIMATE HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION.
- HUMAN CAPITAL AND WELL-BEING METRICS: MEASURES LIKE THE GENUINE PROGRESS INDICATOR (GPI) OR THE HUMAN DEVELOPMENT INDEX (HDI) INCORPORATE NON-MARKET ACTIVITIES.
- TIME-USE SURVEYS: COLLECT DATA ON HOW INDIVIDUALS ALLOCATE THEIR TIME, INCLUDING UNPAID HOUSEHOLD WORK.

BROADER CONTEXT: THE INFORMAL ECONOMY AND UNPAID WORK

THE INFORMAL ECONOMY

HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION IS PART OF THE LARGER INFORMAL ECONOMY, WHICH INCLUDES:

- UNREGISTERED BUSINESSES.
- UNREPORTED INCOME-GENERATING ACTIVITIES.
- HOUSEHOLD AND COMMUNITY-BASED ACTIVITIES.

WHILE SOME INFORMAL ACTIVITIES ARE CAPTURED IN GDP THROUGH SPECIFIC SURVEYS, MANY REMAIN UNCOUNTED DUE TO THEIR NON-MARKET NATURE.

UNPAID WORK AND GENDER EQUALITY

UNPAID HOUSEHOLD WORK DISPROPORTIONATELY FALLS ON WOMEN, IMPACTING GENDER EQUALITY AND ECONOMIC PARTICIPATION. EXCLUDING SUCH WORK FROM GDP CAN:

- MASK GENDER DISPARITIES.
- UNDERMINE RECOGNITION OF WOMEN'S ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTIONS.
- INFLUENCE POLICY DEBATES ON WORK-LIFE BALANCE, SOCIAL PROTECTION, AND LABOR RIGHTS.

THE FUTURE OF MEASURING HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION

INNOVATIONS IN DATA COLLECTION

ADVANCES IN TECHNOLOGY AND DATA COLLECTION METHODS CAN IMPROVE THE MEASUREMENT OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION:

- TIME-USE DIARIES AND SURVEYS CAN QUANTIFY UNPAID WORK.
- SATELLITE ACCOUNTS CAN INCORPORATE ESTIMATES OF HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITY INTO NATIONAL ACCOUNTS.
- DIGITAL TOOLS AND APPS MAY FACILITATE MORE ACCURATE TRACKING OF TIME SPENT ON HOUSEHOLD TASKS.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

BETTER MEASUREMENT OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION CAN LEAD TO:

- MORE COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC INDICATORS.
- POLICIES THAT RECOGNIZE AND COMPENSATE UNPAID LABOR.
- ENHANCED UNDERSTANDING OF ECONOMIC WELL-BEING BEYOND MARKET ACTIVITY.

CONCLUSION

HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION, SUCH AS BAKING BREAD AT HOME, IS A VITAL ASPECT OF EVERYDAY LIFE AND CONTRIBUTES SIGNIFICANTLY TO INDIVIDUAL AND SOCIETAL WELL-BEING. HOWEVER, IT IS NOT INCLUDED IN GDP CALCULATIONS PRIMARILY BECAUSE OF ITS NON-MARKET NATURE, VALUATION DIFFICULTIES, DATA COLLECTION CHALLENGES, AND THE FOCUS ON MARKET TRANSACTIONS IN ECONOMIC MEASUREMENT. RECOGNIZING THESE LIMITATIONS IS CRUCIAL FOR POLICYMAKERS, ECONOMISTS, AND

SOCIETY TO UNDERSTAND THE FULL SCOPE OF ECONOMIC ACTIVITY AND TO DEVELOP MORE INCLUSIVE INDICATORS THAT REFLECT THE TRUE VALUE OF UNPAID HOUSEHOLD WORK. AS EFFORTS CONTINUE TO IMPROVE DATA COLLECTION AND MEASUREMENT TECHNIQUES, FUTURE ECONOMIC INDICATORS MAY BETTER CAPTURE THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION, LEADING TO MORE COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENTS OF ECONOMIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL PROGRESS.

HOW DOES THE EXCLUSION OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION FROM GDP IMPACT ECONOMIC MEASUREMENTS?

IT CAN UNDERESTIMATE THE TRUE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY AND THE TOTAL WORK DONE WITHIN A SOCIETY, ESPECIALLY UNPAID LABOR.

IS THERE ANY WAY TO MEASURE THE VALUE OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION LIKE BAKING BREAD AT HOME?

YES, ECONOMISTS SOMETIMES ESTIMATE THE VALUE OF UNPAID HOUSEHOLD WORK THROUGH SATELLITE ACCOUNTS OR TIME-USE SURVEYS.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO RECOGNIZE HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION DESPITE ITS EXCLUSION FROM GDP?

- INCOME APPROACH: SUMMING INCOMES GENERATED BY PRODUCTION, SUCH AS WAGES, PROFITS, RENTS, AND TAXES MINUS SUBSIDIES.
- EXPENDITURE APPROACH: SUMMING TOTAL SPENDING ON FINAL GOODS AND SERVICES.

DESPITE THESE COMPREHENSIVE METHODS, CERTAIN TYPES OF ACTIVITY ARE SYSTEMATICALLY EXCLUDED, NOTABLY HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION.

WHAT IS HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION?

DEFINITION AND EXAMPLES

HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION REFERS TO ACTIVITIES PERFORMED BY INDIVIDUALS WITHIN THEIR HOMES THAT PRODUCE GOODS OR SERVICES PRIMARILY FOR THEIR OWN CONSUMPTION, RATHER THAN FOR SALE IN THE MARKET. COMMON EXAMPLES INCLUDE:

- BAKING BREAD OR COOKING MEALS AT HOME
- GARDENING AND GROWING VEGETABLES
- HOME CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE
- CHILDCARE AND ELDERCARE PERFORMED WITHIN THE HOUSEHOLD
- SEWING, CRAFTING, OR OTHER HANDMADE GOODS

THESE ACTIVITIES OFTEN INVOLVE CONSIDERABLE TIME AND EFFORT AND MAY GENERATE TANGIBLE OR INTANGIBLE BENEFITS, SUCH AS NOURISHMENT, COMFORT, OR PERSONAL SATISFACTION.

WHY IS HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION CONSIDERED IMPORTANT?

WHILE NOT COUNTED IN GDP, HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION PLAYS A VITAL ROLE IN:

- ENSURING FOOD SECURITY AND NUTRITION
- CONTRIBUTING TO HOUSEHOLD WELL-BEING

- REDUCING RELIANCE ON MARKET-BASED SERVICES
- SUPPORTING LEISURE AND FAMILY LIFE

DESPITE ITS IMPORTANCE AT THE MICROECONOMIC LEVEL, IT REMAINS OUTSIDE OFFICIAL ECONOMIC MEASURES.

REASONS WHY HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION IS NOT INCLUDED IN GDP

1. NON-MARKET NATURE OF HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITIES

ONE OF THE FUNDAMENTAL REASONS FOR EXCLUDING HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION FROM GDP IS THAT THESE ACTIVITIES ARE NOT TRADED IN FORMAL MARKETS. SINCE GDP MEASURES MARKET TRANSACTIONS, ACTIVITIES THAT DO NOT INVOLVE MONETARY EXCHANGES ARE INHERENTLY OUTSIDE ITS SCOPE.

- PROS: THIS MAINTAINS CONSISTENCY IN WHAT IS COUNTED, FOCUSING ON MARKET-BASED ECONOMIC ACTIVITY.
- CONS: IT OVERLOOKS SUBSTANTIAL ECONOMIC VALUE CREATED OUTSIDE FORMAL MARKETS, LEADING TO AN UNDERESTIMATION OF ACTUAL ECONOMIC ACTIVITY.

2. DIFFICULTY IN VALUATION

ASSIGNING A MONETARY VALUE TO HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION IS INHERENTLY CHALLENGING BECAUSE:

- THERE ARE NO MARKET PRICES TO DIRECTLY MEASURE THE VALUE OF HOMEMADE BREAD OR CHILDCARE.
- ESTIMATING OPPORTUNITY COSTS (WHAT INDIVIDUALS COULD EARN IF THEY SPENT TIME WORKING ELSEWHERE) INVOLVES ASSUMPTIONS AND SUBJECTIVE JUDGMENTS.
- VARIABILITY IN QUALITY AND EFFORT MAKES STANDARD VALUATION COMPLEX.
- PROS: ENSURES THAT GDP REMAINS BASED ON COMPARABLE, MARKET-BASED DATA, AVOIDING ARBITRARY ESTIMATIONS.
- CONS: OMITTS SIGNIFICANT PRODUCTIVE CONTRIBUTIONS, ESPECIALLY IN ECONOMIES WHERE HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION IS SUBSTANTIAL.

3. DATA COLLECTION AND MEASUREMENT CHALLENGES

COLLECTING DATA ON HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITIES IS DIFFICULT BECAUSE:

- HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITIES ARE OFTEN INFORMAL, UNRECORDED, AND VARY WIDELY.
- SURVEYS MAY UNDERREPORT OR MISREPRESENT THE EXTENT OF HOUSEHOLD WORK.
- THE LACK OF STANDARDIZED METRICS COMPLICATES NATIONAL ACCOUNTING.
- PROS: SIMPLIFIES STATISTICAL COLLECTION AND REDUCES MEASUREMENT ERRORS.
- CONS: LEADS TO INCOMPLETE ASSESSMENTS OF REAL ECONOMIC ACTIVITY.

4. FOCUS ON MARKET TRANSACTIONS AND FINAL GOODS

GDP EMPHASIZES FINAL GOODS AND SERVICES SOLD IN THE MARKETPLACE. HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION OFTEN RESULTS IN INTERMEDIATE OR SELF-CONSUMED GOODS, WHICH ARE NOT PART OF MARKET TRANSACTIONS.

- PROS: AVOIDS DOUBLE COUNTING OF GOODS AND SERVICES.
- CONS: EXCLUDES VALUABLE HOUSEHOLD CONTRIBUTIONS THAT SUPPORT THE ECONOMY INDIRECTLY.

5. HISTORICAL AND THEORETICAL FOUNDATIONS

ECONOMIC MEASUREMENT STANDARDS HAVE HISTORICALLY CENTERED ON MARKET TRANSACTIONS, AS THEY ARE EASIER TO QUANTIFY AND COMPARE ACROSS CONTEXTS. THE SYSTEM OF NATIONAL ACCOUNTS (SNA) AND SIMILAR FRAMEWORKS

PRIORITIZE MARKET-BASED ACTIVITY, LEADING TO THE EXCLUSION OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION.

- PROS: MAINTAINS CONSISTENCY AND COMPARABILITY ACROSS COUNTRIES AND OVER TIME.
- CONS: FAILS TO CAPTURE THE FULL SCOPE OF ECONOMIC ACTIVITY, ESPECIALLY IN SUBSISTENCE ECONOMIES.

IMPLICATIONS OF EXCLUDING HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION FROM GDP

ECONOMIC UNDERESTIMATION

EXCLUDING HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITIES CAN SIGNIFICANTLY UNDERESTIMATE A COUNTRY'S ACTUAL ECONOMIC ACTIVITY. FOR EXAMPLE, IN MANY DEVELOPING COUNTRIES WHERE INFORMAL AND HOUSEHOLD WORK CONSTITUTES A LARGE SHARE OF ECONOMIC EFFORT, OFFICIAL GDP FIGURES MAY SUBSTANTIALLY UNDERVALUE LIVING STANDARDS AND ECONOMIC WELL-BEING.

POLICY AND RESOURCE ALLOCATION

RELYING SOLELY ON GDP CAN LEAD POLICYMAKERS TO OVERLOOK THE VALUE OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION, WHICH AFFECTS:

- SOCIAL POLICY DECISIONS RELATED TO CHILDCARE, HEALTHCARE, AND SOCIAL SERVICES.
- RECOGNITION OF UNPAID LABOR, PARTICULARLY THAT PERFORMED BY WOMEN.
- UNDERSTANDING OF THE TRUE ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTION OF HOUSEHOLDS.

GENDER AND SOCIAL EQUITY CONSIDERATIONS

HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION, SUCH AS CAREGIVING AND DOMESTIC CHORES, IS OFTEN PERFORMED DISPROPORTIONATELY BY WOMEN. EXCLUDING THESE ACTIVITIES FROM GDP CAN PERPETUATE GENDER BIASES, UNDERVALUE WOMEN'S CONTRIBUTIONS, AND INFLUENCE GENDER EQUITY POLICIES.

ALTERNATIVE MEASURES AND COMPLEMENTARY INDICATORS

RECOGNIZING THESE LIMITATIONS, ECONOMISTS AND POLICYMAKERS HAVE DEVELOPED SUPPLEMENTARY MEASURES SUCH AS:

- SATELLITE ACCOUNTS: WHICH ESTIMATE THE VALUE OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION.
- HUMAN DEVELOPMENT INDEX (HDI): WHICH INCORPORATES HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND INCOME.
- GENUINE PROGRESS INDICATOR (GPI): WHICH ADJUSTS GDP FOR FACTORS LIKE HOUSEHOLD WORK, ENVIRONMENTAL DEGRADATION, AND SOCIAL WELL-BEING.

FEATURES, PROS, AND CONS OF EXCLUDING HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION

FEATURES:

- FOCUS ON MARKET TRANSACTIONS
- EMPHASIS ON FINAL GOODS AND SERVICES
- STANDARDIZED MEASUREMENT FRAMEWORKS

PROS:

- ENSURES COMPARABILITY ACROSS COUNTRIES
- SIMPLIFIES DATA COLLECTION
- AVOIDS SUBJECTIVE VALUATION ISSUES
- MAINTAINS FOCUS ON MONETIZED ACTIVITY

CONS:

- OMITTS SIGNIFICANT PRODUCTIVE EFFORT
- UNDERESTIMATES TRUE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY

- NEGLECTS UNPAID LABOR, OFTEN PERFORMED BY WOMEN
- MAY DISTORT POLICY PRIORITIES AND SOCIAL UNDERSTANDING

CONCLUSION

THE EXCLUSION OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION, SUCH AS BAKING BREAD AT HOME, FROM GDP STEMS FROM FOUNDATIONAL PRINCIPLES OF ECONOMIC MEASUREMENT THAT PRIORITIZE MARKET-BASED TRANSACTIONS, EASE OF DATA COLLECTION, AND COMPARABILITY. WHILE THIS APPROACH OFFERS CLARITY AND CONSISTENCY, IT ALSO INTRODUCES NOTABLE LIMITATIONS BY IGNORING A SUBSTANTIAL PORTION OF ECONOMIC ACTIVITY THAT CONTRIBUTES TO INDIVIDUAL WELL-BEING, SOCIAL COHESION, AND ECONOMIC RESILIENCE. AS AWARENESS GROWS ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF UNPAID AND HOUSEHOLD WORK, ECONOMISTS AND POLICYMAKERS INCREASINGLY SEEK WAYS TO INCORPORATE THESE ACTIVITIES INTO BROADER MEASURES OF ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL PROGRESS, FOSTERING A MORE HOLISTIC UNDERSTANDING OF A NATION'S TRUE ECONOMIC LANDSCAPE. RECOGNIZING THE VALUE OF HOUSEHOLD PRODUCTION IS CRUCIAL FOR CRAFTING EQUITABLE POLICIES, UNDERSTANDING GENDER DYNAMICS, AND APPRECIATING THE FULL SCOPE OF HUMAN ECONOMIC EFFORT.

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
