DETAILS OF THE MEETING BETWEEN PRESIDENT JOE BIDEN AND PRESIDENT JOKO WIDODO

DATE AND VENUE

SIGNIFICANCE OF THE BIDEN-JOKOWI MEETING

ADDRESSING CLIMATE CHALLENGES

INDONESIA, BEING PRONE TO NATURAL DISASTERS AND A SIGNIFICANT EMITTER OF GREENHOUSE GASES, IS CENTRAL TO GLOBAL CLIMATE EFFORTS. U.S. SUPPORT AND COLLABORATION CAN HELP INDONESIA MEET ITS CLIMATE GOALS.

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES

THE MEETING PAVES THE WAY FOR INCREASED INVESTMENTS, JOINT VENTURES, AND TRADE AGREEMENTS, BOOSTING ECONOMIC GROWTH AND JOB CREATION IN BOTH COUNTRIES.

ENHANCING MULTILATERAL COOPERATION

THE LEADERS REITERATED THEIR SUPPORT FOR ASEAN AND OTHER REGIONAL MULTILATERAL ORGANIZATIONS, EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF COLLECTIVE ACTION ON REGIONAL ISSUES.

IMPLICATIONS FOR GLOBAL AND REGIONAL POLITICS
