WHILE THESE DIFFERENCES REFLECT CULTURAL VALUES—HEROISM AND DIVINE MORALITY VERSUS PERSONAL AUTONOMY—THEY ALSO REVEAL COMMON HUMAN THEMES: GROWTH THROUGH EXPERIENCE, SELF-DISCOVERY, AND MORAL DEVELOPMENT.

BOTH PERSPECTIVES UNDERScore THAT COMING OF AGE IS NOT MERELY ABOUT REACHING A CERTAIN AGE BUT ABOUT INTERNAL

TRANSFORMATION. WHETHER THROUGH HEROIC TRIALS OR PERSONAL MILESTONES, THE JOURNEY TOWARD MATURITY REMAINS A FUNDAMENTAL ASPECT OF HUMAN LIFE. AS SOCIETY CONTINUES TO EVOLVE, UNDERSTANDING THESE DIVERSE NARRATIVES ENRICHES OUR APPRECIATION OF WHAT IT TRULY MEANS TO COME OF AGE—A LIFELONG PROCESS OF BECOMING ONESELF, SHAPED BY CHALLENGES, CHOICES, AND CULTURAL CONTEXTS.

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
