KAREN HORNEY REJECTED MANY OF FREUD'S IDEAS TO CONCENTRATE ON ASPECTS OF THE CULTURE THAT CONTRIBUTED TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF PERSONALITY AND NEUROSIS. WHILE SIGMUND FREUD'S PSYCHOANALYTIC THEORIES LAID THE FOUNDATION FOR UNDERSTANDING HUMAN PSYCHOLOGY, HORNEY DIVERGED SIGNIFICANTLY IN HER APPROACH, EMPHASIZING THE INFLUENCE OF CULTURAL, SOCIAL, AND INTERPERSONAL FACTORS. SHE CHALLENGED MANY OF FREUD'S CORE CONCEPTS, PARTICULARLY HIS VIEWS ON FEMALE PSYCHOLOGY AND INNATE BIOLOGICAL DRIVES, ADVOCATING INSTEAD FOR A MORE CULTURALLY CONTEXTUALIZED UNDERSTANDING OF HUMAN DEVELOPMENT. THIS ARTICLE EXPLORES HOW HORNEY'S REJECTION OF FREUDIAN IDEAS LED HER TO FOCUS ON CULTURAL INFLUENCES, SHAPING HER UNIQUE CONTRIBUTIONS TO PSYCHOANALYSIS AND PERSONALITY THEORY.

FOUNDATIONAL DIFFERENCES BETWEEN FREUD AND HORNEY

FREUD'S BIOLOGICAL AND INNATE FOCUS

FREUD'S PSYCHOANALYSIS IS ROOTED IN THE BELIEF THAT HUMAN BEHAVIOR IS DRIVEN PRIMARILY BY INNATE BIOLOGICAL INSTINCTS, PARTICULARLY THE LIBIDO AND DEATH DRIVES. HE EMPHASIZED UNCONSCIOUS SEXUAL AND AGGRESSIVE IMPULSES, OFTEN FRAMING NEUROSES AS CONFLICTS STEMMING FROM THESE PRIMAL URGES.

HORNEY'S EMPHASIS ON SOCIOCULTURAL FACTORS

IN CONTRAST, HORNEY ARGUED THAT SOCIAL AND CULTURAL CONDITIONS, ESPECIALLY CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES AND SOCIETAL EXPECTATIONS, PLAY A CRUCIAL ROLE IN SHAPING PERSONALITY. SHE BELIEVED THAT NEUROSES ARE NOT SOLELY THE RESULT OF INNATE DRIVES BUT ALSO STEM FROM INTERPERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS AND CULTURAL NORMS.

REJECTION OF FREUD'S VIEWS ON FEMALE PSYCHOLOGY

FREUD'S CONCEPT OF "PENIS ENVY"

FREUD POSITED THAT WOMEN EXPERIENCE "PENIS ENVY," A SENSE OF INFERIORITY DUE TO THEIR LACK OF A PENIS, WHICH HE BELIEVED CONTRIBUTED TO FEMALE NEUROSIS AND DEVELOPMENTAL DIFFERENCES.

HORNEY'S CRITIQUE AND ALTERNATIVE PERSPECTIVE

HORNEY REJECTED FREUD'S BIOLOGICAL DETERMINISM AND ARGUED THAT FEELINGS OF INFERIORITY AMONG WOMEN ARE ROOTED IN SOCIETAL AND CULTURAL RESTRICTIONS PLACED ON WOMEN. SHE VIEWED "PENIS ENVY" AS A REFLECTION OF CULTURAL SUPPRESSION RATHER THAN AN INNATE PSYCHOLOGICAL TRAIT.

- SHE PROPOSED THAT WOMEN'S SENSE OF INFERIORITY ARISES FROM SOCIAL STRUCTURES THAT LIMIT THEIR OPPORTUNITIES.
- HORNEY EMPHASIZED CULTURAL INFLUENCES OVER BIOLOGICAL FACTORS IN UNDERSTANDING GENDER DIFFERENCES.

THE CONCEPT OF BASIC ANXIETY AND CULTURAL ROOTS

FREUD'S APPROACH TO ANXIETY

FREUD REGARDED ANXIETY AS A MANIFESTATION OF INTRAPSYCHIC CONFLICTS ROOTED IN REPRESSED IMPULSES AND UNCONSCIOUS DRIVES.

HORNEY'S DEVELOPMENT OF BASIC ANXIETY

HORNEY INTRODUCED THE CONCEPT OF "BASIC ANXIETY," WHICH SHE DEFINED AS FEELINGS OF HELPLESSNESS AND ISOLATION CAUSED BY PROBLEMATIC RELATIONSHIPS AND CULTURAL ENVIRONMENTS DURING CHILDHOOD.

- SHE ARGUED THAT CULTURAL AND SOCIETAL FACTORS CONTRIBUTE SIGNIFICANTLY TO FEELINGS OF INSECURITY.
- BASIC ANXIETY IS SHAPED BY SOCIAL REJECTION, NEGLECT, OR HOSTILITY, RATHER THAN SOLELY INTERNAL CONFLICTS.

FOCUS ON INTERPERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS AND CULTURAL ENVIRONMENT

FREUD'S INTRAPSYCHIC MODEL

FREUD EMPHASIZED INTERNAL PSYCHIC CONFLICTS AND THE STRUCTURE OF THE MIND (ID, EGO, SUPEREGO) AS PRIMARY IN UNDERSTANDING PERSONALITY.

HORNEY'S INTERPERSONAL AND CULTURAL MODEL

HORNEY BELIEVED THAT HUMAN DEVELOPMENT IS HEAVILY INFLUENCED BY INTERPERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS, PARTICULARLY WITHIN THE FAMILY AND SOCIETY, WHICH ARE EMBEDDED IN CULTURAL CONTEXTS.

- SHE HIGHLIGHTED THE IMPORTANCE OF SOCIAL ACCEPTANCE AND AFFECTION.
- HORNEY ARGUED THAT CULTURAL NORMS AND SOCIETAL EXPECTATIONS SHAPE THE DEVELOPMENT OF NEUROTIC PATTERNS.

REJECTION OF FREUD'S VIEW ON THE UNCONSCIOUS

FREUD'S EMPHASIS ON THE UNCONSCIOUS

FREUD VIEWED THE UNCONSCIOUS AS A REPOSITORY OF REPRESSED DESIRES AND CONFLICTS, INACCESSIBLE TO CONSCIOUS AWARENESS.

HORNEY'S PERSPECTIVE ON THE UNCONSCIOUS AND CULTURAL NARRATIVES

WHILE ACKNOWLEDGING THE UNCONSCIOUS, HORNEY EMPHASIZED THAT CULTURAL NARRATIVES, MYTHS, AND SOCIETAL MESSAGES INFLUENCE CONSCIOUS AND UNCONSCIOUS ATTITUDES.

- SHE BELIEVED THAT CULTURAL STORIES AND SOCIAL CONDITIONING SHAPE PERSONALITY TRAITS.
- HORNEY SAW THE UNCONSCIOUS AS INTERTWINED WITH CULTURAL INFLUENCES RATHER THAN SOLELY INTRAPSYCHIC CONFLICTS.

IMPLICATIONS FOR THERAPY AND PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

FREUD'S PSYCHOANALYTIC APPROACH

FREUD'S METHOD FOCUSED ON UNCOVERING REPRESSED IMPULSES THROUGH FREE ASSOCIATION, DREAM ANALYSIS, AND INTERPRETATION OF CHILDHOOD MEMORIES.

HORNEY'S APPROACH CENTERED ON CULTURAL UNDERSTANDING

HORNEY ADVOCATED FOR THERAPY THAT CONSIDERS THE CLIENT'S CULTURAL BACKGROUND AND SOCIAL ENVIRONMENT, EMPHASIZING UNDERSTANDING AND MODIFYING SOCIETAL INFLUENCES.

- SHE PROMOTED A MORE COLLABORATIVE THERAPEUTIC RELATIONSHIP.
- HER TECHNIQUES INCLUDED ADDRESSING CULTURAL AND SOCIAL ISSUES IMPACTING THE INDIVIDUAL.

LEGACY AND IMPACT OF HORNEY'S CULTURAL FOCUS

CHALLENGING FREUDIAN ORTHODOXY

HORNEY'S REJECTION OF FREUDIAN BIOLOGICAL DETERMINISM AND EMPHASIS ON CULTURAL FACTORS CHALLENGED THE MALE-CENTRIC AND BIOLOGICALLY DETERMINISTIC VIEWS OF HER TIME.

INFLUENCE ON FEMINIST PSYCHOLOGY AND CULTURAL PSYCHIATRY

HER WORK PAVED THE WAY FOR MORE SOCIALLY CONSCIOUS APPROACHES TO PSYCHOLOGY, INCLUDING FEMINIST PSYCHOLOGY, CROSS-CULTURAL PSYCHIATRY, AND HUMANISTIC THERAPIES.

- SHE CONTRIBUTED TO SHIFTING THE FOCUS FROM INNATE DRIVES TO SOCIAL CONTEXT.
- HER IDEAS CONTINUE TO INFLUENCE CONTEMPORARY PERSPECTIVES ON GENDER, CULTURE, AND PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT.

CONCLUSION

KAREN HORNEY'S REJECTION OF MANY FREUDIAN IDEAS WAS ROOTED IN HER CONVICTION THAT CULTURE AND SOCIETY ARE FUNDAMENTAL IN SHAPING HUMAN PERSONALITY. BY CHALLENGING FREUD'S BIOLOGICAL AND INTRAPSYCHIC FOCUS, SHE BROUGHT TO LIGHT THE IMPORTANCE OF SOCIAL RELATIONSHIPS, CULTURAL NORMS, AND SOCIETAL STRUCTURES IN UNDERSTANDING HUMAN BEHAVIOR. HER EMPHASIS ON CULTURAL INFLUENCES NOT ONLY BROADENED PSYCHOANALYTIC THEORY BUT ALSO LAID THE GROUNDWORK FOR MORE INCLUSIVE AND SOCIALLY AWARE APPROACHES IN PSYCHOLOGY. THROUGH HER WORK, HORNEY DEMONSTRATED THAT UNDERSTANDING THE CULTURAL CONTEXT OF INDIVIDUALS IS ESSENTIAL TO FOSTERING PSYCHOLOGICAL HEALTH AND ADDRESSING NEUROSIS, MAKING HER A PIVOTAL FIGURE IN THE EVOLUTION OF PSYCHOANALYTIC THOUGHT.

INTRODUCTION: MOVING BEYOND FREUDIAN ORTHODOXY

KAREN HORNEY'S PSYCHOLOGICAL PERSPECTIVE WAS ROOTED IN A DESIRE TO CHALLENGE WHAT SHE SAW AS THE LIMITATIONS AND BIASES INHERENT IN FREUD'S THEORIES. WHILE FREUD EMPHASIZED BIOLOGICAL DRIVES, PARTICULARLY SEXUALITY, AND INNATE INSTINCTS, HORNEY BELIEVED THAT CULTURAL AND SOCIAL INFLUENCES PLAYED A MORE SIGNIFICANT ROLE IN SHAPING THE PSYCHE. HER DIVERGENCE FROM FREUDIAN ORTHODOXY WAS DRIVEN BY HER OBSERVATIONS OF THE SOCIETAL FACTORS AFFECTING WOMEN AND HER BROADER UNDERSTANDING OF HUMAN DEVELOPMENT.

HER CRITICAL STANCE WAS NOT MERELY ACADEMIC; IT WAS ALSO A RESPONSE TO THE SOCIO-CULTURAL CONTEXT OF HER TIME, WHICH INCLUDED PATRIARCHAL NORMS, GENDER INEQUALITY, AND SOCIETAL EXPECTATIONS THAT FREUD'S THEORIES OFTEN OVERLOOKED OR UNDERESTIMATED. HORNEY'S FOCUS ON CULTURAL CONTRIBUTIONS AIMED TO PROVIDE A MORE COMPREHENSIVE UNDERSTANDING OF PERSONALITY, EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF ENVIRONMENT, SOCIETAL ROLES, AND CULTURAL NORMS.

REJECTION OF FREUD'S BIOLOGICAL AND INSTINCTUAL FOCUS

CRITIQUE OF INNATE SEXUALITY AND INSTINCTS

FREUD'S PSYCHOANALYTIC MODEL POSITED THAT INNATE BIOLOGICAL DRIVES, ESPECIALLY SEXUALITY, WERE THE PRIMARY FORCES BEHIND HUMAN BEHAVIOR. HIS THEORIES SUGGESTED THAT NEUROSES AND PSYCHOLOGICAL CONFLICTS ORIGINATED FROM REPRESSED SEXUAL DESIRES AND UNRESOLVED CHILDHOOD CONFLICTS RELATED TO SEXUALITY.

HORNEY CHALLENGED THIS VIEW ON SEVERAL GROUNDS:

- **CULTURAL VARIABILITY OF SEXUAL NORMS:** SHE ARGUED THAT SOCIETAL ATTITUDES TOWARDS SEXUALITY VARY WIDELY ACROSS CULTURES AND HISTORICAL PERIODS. IF SEXUALITY WERE SOLELY AN INNATE DRIVE, THEN CULTURAL DIFFERENCES SHOULD HAVE LITTLE INFLUENCE ON INDIVIDUAL DEVELOPMENT, WHICH SHE FOUND INCONSISTENT.
- **PSYCHOSOCIAL FACTORS OVER INSTINCTUAL DRIVES:** HORNEY EMPHASIZED THAT SOCIAL RELATIONSHIPS, CULTURAL EXPECTATIONS, AND PERSONAL EXPERIENCES SIGNIFICANTLY INFLUENCE PERSONALITY FORMATION, OFTEN MORE THAN BIOLOGICAL INSTINCTS.
- **FOCUS ON SOCIAL AND CULTURAL ROOTS:** SHE BELIEVED THAT MANY NEUROSES STEM FROM FEELINGS OF INSECURITY, HELPLESSNESS, AND ALIENATION FOSTERED BY SOCIAL ENVIRONMENTS, RATHER THAN INNATE SEXUAL CONFLICTS.

REJECTION OF THE OEDIPUS COMPLEX AS A UNIVERSAL PHENOMENON

FREUD'S CONCEPT OF THE OEDIPUS COMPLEX HAS BEEN CENTRAL TO HIS THEORY OF PSYCHOSEXUAL DEVELOPMENT, ASSERTING THAT CHILDREN HARBOR SUBCONSCIOUS DESIRES FOR THEIR OPPOSITE-SEX PARENT AND HOSTILITY TOWARDS THEIR SAME-SEX PARENT.

HORNEY'S CRITIQUE INCLUDED:

- **CULTURAL AND GENDER VARIATIONS:** SHE OBSERVED THAT THE OEDIPUS COMPLEX WAS NOT UNIVERSAL ACROSS CULTURES OR GENDERS. MANY SOCIETIES DO NOT REINFORCE OR EVEN RECOGNIZE SUCH DYNAMICS, INDICATING THAT THEY ARE CULTURALLY CONSTRUCTED RATHER THAN INNATE.
- **GENDER AND POWER DYNAMICS:** HORNEY ARGUED THAT SOCIETAL POWER STRUCTURES INFLUENCE FAMILIAL RELATIONSHIPS. FOR EXAMPLE, SHE SUGGESTED THAT GENDER ROLES AND SOCIETAL EXPECTATIONS SHAPE HOW CHILDREN RELATE TO THEIR PARENTS, WHICH IS MORE PERTINENT THAN FREUD'S NOTION OF UNCONSCIOUS SEXUAL DESIRES.
- **FOCUS ON SOCIAL RELATIONSHIPS:** INSTEAD OF CHILDHOOD SEXUAL DESIRES, HORNEY EMPHASIZED THE IMPORTANCE OF SOCIAL BONDS, PARENT-CHILD RELATIONSHIPS BASED ON LOVE, SECURITY, AND TRUST.

FOCUS ON CULTURAL AND SOCIAL INFLUENCES IN PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT

HORNEY'S MOST SIGNIFICANT DEPARTURE FROM FREUD WAS HER EMPHASIS ON THE ROLE OF CULTURE IN SHAPING PERSONALITY. SHE BELIEVED THAT UNDERSTANDING AN INDIVIDUAL'S CULTURAL CONTEXT IS CRUCIAL TO COMPREHENDING THEIR PSYCHOLOGICAL MAKEUP.

THE SOCIOCULTURAL ENVIRONMENT AS A FOUNDATION FOR PERSONALITY

HORNEY ASSERTED THAT:

- **CULTURAL NORMS AND VALUES:** THESE INFLUENCE WHAT INDIVIDUALS CONSIDER ACCEPTABLE, DESIRABLE, OR THREATENING. FOR INSTANCE, SOCIETAL EXPECTATIONS ABOUT GENDER ROLES CAN CREATE SPECIFIC PERSONALITY TRAITS AND NEUROSES.
- **CHILD-REARING PRACTICES:** CULTURAL ATTITUDES TOWARDS UPBRINGING, DISCIPLINE, AND EMOTIONAL EXPRESSION IMPACT PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT. OVERLY STRICT OR NEGLECTFUL PARENTING CAN FOSTER FEELINGS OF INSECURITY OR HOSTILITY.
- **SOCIETAL POWER STRUCTURES:** HIERARCHIES AND SOCIAL INEQUALITIES CONTRIBUTE TO FEELINGS OF INFERIORITY OR SUPERIORITY, WHICH CAN MANIFEST AS NEUROTIC TENDENCIES.

THE ROLE OF SOCIAL ANXIETY AND ALIENATION

HORNEY BELIEVED THAT SOCIAL ENVIRONMENTS OFTEN GENERATE FEELINGS OF ANXIETY, ALIENATION, AND HELPLESSNESS, WHICH ARE CENTRAL TO NEUROTIC DEVELOPMENT:

- BASIC ANXIETY: A TERM SHE COINED TO DESCRIBE FEELINGS OF HELPLESSNESS AND INSECURITY STEMMING FROM SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS.
- NEUROTIC NEEDS AND STRATEGIES: THESE ARE WAYS INDIVIDUALS COPE WITH FEELINGS OF INSECURITY, OFTEN REINFORCED BY CULTURAL EXPECTATIONS, WHICH CAN LEAD TO MALADAPTIVE PERSONALITY PATTERNS.
- CULTURAL CONFLICTS: SOCIETIES THAT IMPOSE CONFLICTING ROLES OR EXPECTATIONS CAN CAUSE INTERNAL CONFLICTS WITHIN INDIVIDUALS, RESULTING IN NEUROSIS.

GENDER AND CULTURAL CRITIQUE

HORNEY'S CRITIQUE OF FREUD WAS PARTICULARLY FOCUSED ON GENDER BIASES EMBEDDED WITHIN HIS THEORIES.

REJECTION OF "PENIS ENVY" AND FEMALE DEVELOPMENT THEORIES

- CRITIQUE OF "PENIS ENVY": FREUD'S CONCEPT SUGGESTED THAT WOMEN'S FEELINGS OF INFERIORITY STEMMED FROM THEIR LACK OF A PENIS, WHICH HORNEY DISMISSED AS A CULTURAL MYTH RATHER THAN A BIOLOGICAL FACT.
- FOCUS ON SOCIAL POWER DYNAMICS: HORNEY ARGUED THAT WOMEN'S FEELINGS OF INFERIORITY ARE ROOTED IN SOCIAL AND CULTURAL DISADVANTAGES RATHER THAN INNATE BIOLOGICAL DIFFERENCES.

EMPHASIS ON CULTURAL EXPECTATIONS AND SOCIAL ROLES

- GENDER ROLES AS SOCIAL CONSTRUCTS: HORNEY BELIEVED THAT SOCIETAL EXPECTATIONS SHAPE WOMEN'S AND MEN'S BEHAVIORS, ASPIRATIONS, AND SELF-CONCEPTIONS MORE THAN BIOLOGY.
- IMPACT ON PSYCHOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENT: THESE CULTURAL INFLUENCES CAN LEAD TO FEELINGS OF INADEQUACY OR FRUSTRATION, CONTRIBUTING TO NEUROSIS.

IMPLICATIONS FOR PSYCHOANALYTIC PRACTICE AND THEORY

HORNEY'S EMPHASIS ON CULTURAL FACTORS PROMPTED A REEVALUATION OF PSYCHOANALYTIC METHODS AND THEORIES.

THERAPEUTIC APPROACHES

- FOCUS ON SOCIAL CONTEXTS: THERAPISTS SHOULD CONSIDER CULTURAL, SOCIETAL, AND ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS INFLUENCING CLIENTS' ISSUES.
- EMPOWERING THE INDIVIDUAL: RECOGNIZING SOCIETAL PRESSURES ALLOWS FOR A MORE COMPASSIONATE AND HOLISTIC APPROACH TO TREATMENT.

DEVELOPMENT OF NEW THEORETICAL MODELS

- NEUROSIS AS A RESPONSE TO SOCIAL CONDITIONS: INSTEAD OF VIEWING NEUROSIS PRIMARILY AS AN INTERNAL CONFLICT ROOTED IN CHILDHOOD SEXUALITY, HORNEY SAW IT AS A RESPONSE TO SOCIAL THREATS, ALIENATION, AND INSECURITY.
- THE SELF-REALIZATION MODEL: EMPHASIZES PERSONAL GROWTH WITHIN A CULTURAL CONTEXT, ENCOURAGING INDIVIDUALS TO UNDERSTAND AND CHALLENGE SOCIETAL INFLUENCES THAT IMPAIR THEIR WELL-BEING.

LEGACY AND MODERN RELEVANCE

KAREN HORNEY'S IDEAS HAVE HAD LASTING INFLUENCE ON CONTEMPORARY PSYCHOLOGY AND PSYCHOTHERAPY:

- FEMINIST PSYCHOLOGY: HER CRITIQUE OF GENDER BIASES AND EMPHASIS ON SOCIAL FACTORS PAVED THE WAY FOR FEMINIST CRITIQUES OF TRADITIONAL PSYCHOANALYSIS.
- HUMANISTIC AND EXISTENTIAL THERAPIES: HER FOCUS ON SOCIAL CONTEXT, AUTHENTICITY, AND SELF-AWARENESS ALIGNS WITH HUMANISTIC PRINCIPLES.
- CROSS-CULTURAL PSYCHOLOGY: HER INSISTENCE ON CULTURAL INFLUENCES CONTRIBUTED TO A BROADER UNDERSTANDING OF PERSONALITY VARIABILITY ACROSS DIFFERENT SOCIETIES.
- MODERN APPROACHES TO MENTAL HEALTH: RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF SOCIAL DETERMINANTS, COMMUNITY, AND ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS IN MENTAL HEALTH ALIGNS WITH HORNEY'S PERSPECTIVE.

CONCLUSION: REFRAMING PSYCHOANALYSIS THROUGH CULTURAL AWARENESS

KAREN HORNEY'S REJECTION OF MANY FREUDIAN IDEAS WAS NOT MERELY A CRITIQUE BUT A TRANSFORMATIVE SHIFT TOWARDS UNDERSTANDING THE HUMAN PSYCHE AS

DEEPLY EMBEDDED WITHIN CULTURAL AND SOCIAL FRAMEWORKS. HER WORK UNDERSCORES THE IMPORTANCE OF CONSIDERING SOCIETAL NORMS, GENDER ROLES, AND ENVIRONMENTAL INFLUENCES WHEN ANALYZING PERSONALITY AND MENTAL HEALTH. HER EMPHASIS ON CULTURE BROADENED THE SCOPE OF PSYCHOANALYTIC THEORY, MAKING IT MORE INCLUSIVE AND APPLICABLE ACROSS DIVERSE CONTEXTS.

BY CHALLENGING THE OVEREMPHASIS ON BIOLOGY AND INNATE DRIVES, HORNEY'S INSIGHTS FOSTERED A MORE NUANCED VIEW OF HUMAN DEVELOPMENT—ONE THAT RECOGNIZES THE COMPLEXITY OF CULTURAL INFLUENCES SHAPING INDIVIDUAL CONSCIOUSNESS. HER LEGACY PERSISTS IN CONTEMPORARY PSYCHOLOGY'S APPRECIATION FOR DIVERSITY, SOCIAL JUSTICE, AND THE IMPORTANCE OF ENVIRONMENT IN MENTAL HEALTH. ULTIMATELY, KAREN HORNEY'S CONTRIBUTIONS REMIND US THAT UNDERSTANDING THE CULTURAL FABRIC OF SOCIETY IS ESSENTIAL TO UNLOCKING THE DEPTHS OF THE HUMAN MIND.

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
