MARIJUANA HAS BEEN LEGALIZED IN SEVERAL STATES. SOME PEOPLE BELIEVE THIS HAS RESULTED IN AN INCREASE IN VARIOUS SOCIAL, ECONOMIC, AND HEALTH-RELATED OUTCOMES. AS MORE STATES IN THE U.S. HAVE MOVED TOWARDS LEGALIZATION, DEBATES SURROUNDING THE IMPACT OF THIS POLICY SHIFT HAVE INTENSIFIED. PROponents ARGUE THAT LEGALIZATION BRINGS ECONOMIC BENEFITS, REDUCES CRIMINAL JUSTICE BURDENS, AND OFFERS MEDICAL RELIEF, WHILE OPPONENTS VOICE CONCERNS OVER POTENTIAL INCREASES IN SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND PUBLIC SAFETY ISSUES. THIS ARTICLE EXPLORES THE MULTIFACETED EFFECTS OF MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION ACROSS DIFFERENT STATES, ANALYZING THE EVIDENCE AND PROVIDING A COMPREHENSIVE OVERVIEW OF THE ONGOING DEBATE.

BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT OF MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION IN THE UNITED STATES

HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

MARIJUANA PROHIBITION IN THE UNITED STATES BEGAN IN THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY, CULMINATING IN FEDERAL BANS SUCH AS THE MARIHUANA TAX ACT OF 1937 AND LATER THE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT OF 1970. HOWEVER, STARTING IN THE 1990S, STATES BEGAN TO CHALLENGE FEDERAL RESTRICTIONS. CALIFORNIA'S PROPOSITION 215 IN 1996 MARKED THE FIRST MAJOR STATE-LEVEL MOVE TO LEGALIZE MEDICAL MARIJUANA. SINCE THEN, A GROWING NUMBER OF STATES HAVE FOLLOWED SUIT, GRADUALLY SHIFTING THE LEGAL LANDSCAPE.

STATES LEADING THE WAY

AS OF 2023, MORE THAN 20 STATES AND THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA HAVE LEGALIZED RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA USE, WHILE MANY OTHERS PERMIT MEDICAL CANNABIS. KEY STATES INCLUDE:

- CALIFORNIA
- COLORADO
- OREGON
- WASHINGTON
- NEVADA
- ILLINOIS
- MICHIGAN
- MASSACHUSETTS
- VERMONT

THE EXPANSION OF LEGALIZATION HAS LED TO A SIGNIFICANT CHANGE IN THE LEGAL, SOCIAL, AND ECONOMIC FABRIC OF THESE STATES.

ECONOMIC IMPACTS OF MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION

TAX REVENUE GENERATION

ONE OF THE PRIMARY ARGUMENTS IN FAVOR OF LEGALIZATION IS THE POTENTIAL FOR SUBSTANTIAL TAX REVENUE. STATES LIKE COLORADO AND CALIFORNIA HAVE COLLECTED HUNDREDS OF MILLIONS OF DOLLARS ANNUALLY FROM CANNABIS TAXES, WHICH ARE OFTEN ALLOCATED TO EDUCATION, HEALTHCARE, AND PUBLIC SAFETY PROGRAMS.

KEY POINTS INCLUDE:

- INCREASED STATE REVENUE
- FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SERVICES
- REDUCTION IN BUDGET DEFICITS

JOB CREATION AND BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES

LEGALIZATION HAS SPURRED THE GROWTH OF A NEW INDUSTRY COMPRISING GROWERS, RETAILERS, AND ANCILLARY SERVICES. THIS BOOM HAS CREATED THOUSANDS OF JOBS, INCLUDING:

- CANNABIS CULTIVATION
- DISPENSARY OPERATIONS
- PRODUCT MANUFACTURING
- TESTING AND QUALITY ASSURANCE

ACCORDING TO INDUSTRY REPORTS, THE LEGAL CANNABIS MARKET IS PROJECTED TO SURPASS \$30 BILLION NATIONWIDE BY 2025.

BOOST TO LOCAL ECONOMIES

LOCAL BUSINESSES BENEFIT FROM INCREASED FOOT TRAFFIC, TOURISM, AND RETAIL SALES. EVENTS, FESTIVALS, AND TOURISM RELATED TO CANNABIS HAVE BECOME PART OF THE ECONOMIC LANDSCAPE IN LEGAL STATES, FURTHER STIMULATING LOCAL ECONOMIES.

SOCIAL AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE OUTCOMES

REDUCTION IN MARIJUANA-RELATED ARRESTS

LEGALIZATION HAS LED TO A SIGNIFICANT DECLINE IN MARIJUANA-RELATED ARRESTS, WHICH HISTORICALLY DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTED MINORITY COMMUNITIES. THIS SHIFT POTENTIALLY REDUCES:

- THE BURDEN ON THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM
- RACIAL DISPARITIES IN DRUG ENFORCEMENT
- LONG-TERM SOCIAL CONSEQUENCES FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH CRIMINAL RECORDS

IMPACT ON CRIME RATES

STUDIES ON THE CORRELATION BETWEEN LEGALIZATION AND CRIME HAVE PRODUCED MIXED RESULTS:

- SOME REPORTS SUGGEST A DECREASE IN CERTAIN DRUG-RELATED OFFENSES
- OTHERS INDICATE NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGE OR SLIGHT INCREASES IN SPECIFIC CATEGORIES

IT IS IMPORTANT TO CONSIDER THAT BROADER SOCIAL FACTORS ALSO INFLUENCE CRIME TRENDS.

PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS

POTENTIAL INCREASE IN SUBSTANCE USE

CRITICS ARGUE THAT LEGALIZATION MAY LEAD TO INCREASED MARIJUANA CONSUMPTION, ESPECIALLY AMONG YOUTH. CONCERNS INCLUDE:

- HIGHER RATES OF INITIATION AMONG ADOLESCENTS
- INCREASED FREQUENCY OF USE AMONG ADULTS

HOWEVER, RESEARCH FINDINGS ARE MIXED, WITH SOME STUDIES SHOWING STABLE OR DECLINING USE IN CERTAIN DEMOGRAPHICS.

IMPAIRED DRIVING AND TRAFFIC SAFETY

A COMMON CONCERN IS THE RISE IN MARIJUANA-RELATED IMPAIRED DRIVING ACCIDENTS. DATA FROM SOME STATES INDICATES:

- SLIGHT INCREASES IN MARIJUANA-POSITIVE DRIVERS INVOLVED IN CRASHES
- CHALLENGES IN ACCURATELY MEASURING IMPAIRMENT LEVELS

STATES HAVE IMPLEMENTED MEASURES SUCH AS ROADSIDE TESTING AND PUBLIC EDUCATION CAMPAIGNS TO MITIGATE THESE RISKS.

MEDICINAL BENEFITS AND PUBLIC HEALTH

ON THE POSITIVE SIDE, MEDICAL MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION HAS PROVIDED RELIEF FOR PATIENTS SUFFERING FROM:

- CHRONIC PAIN
- EPILEPSY
- MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS
- CHEMOTHERAPY-INDUCED NAUSEA

RESEARCH CONTINUES TO EXPLORE THE BROADER HEALTH IMPLICATIONS OF CANNABIS USE.

CONTROVERSIES AND CHALLENGES IN MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION

FEDERAL-STATE LEGAL CONFLICTS

DESPITE STATE-LEVEL LEGALIZATION, MARIJUANA REMAINS ILLEGAL UNDER FEDERAL LAW, CREATING CONFLICTS SUCH AS:

- BANKING RESTRICTIONS FOR CANNABIS BUSINESSES

FUTURE OUTLOOK: WHAT'S NEXT FOR MARIJUANA LEGISLATION?

POTENTIAL FEDERAL LEGALIZATION

THERE IS INCREASING POLITICAL MOMENTUM FOR FEDERAL REFORM, INCLUDING BILLS THAT AIM TO:

- REMOVE CANNABIS FROM SCHEDULE I
- ALLOW BANKING AND INTERSTATE COMMERCE
- FACILITATE RESEARCH

SUCH CHANGES COULD UNIFY REGULATIONS AND EXPAND LEGAL MARKETS NATIONWIDE.

EMERGING TRENDS AND INNOVATIONS

ADVANCES INCLUDE:

- DEVELOPMENT OF NEW CANNABIS PRODUCTS (EDIBLES, CONCENTRATES)
- RESEARCH INTO MEDICAL APPLICATIONS
- INTEGRATION OF CANNABIS INTO MAINSTREAM HEALTHCARE

CONTINUING RESEARCH AND DATA COLLECTION

TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THE TRUE IMPACT OF LEGALIZATION, ONGOING STUDIES ARE CRUCIAL. DATA ON PUBLIC HEALTH, CRIME, AND ECONOMIC EFFECTS WILL INFORM FUTURE POLICIES.

CONCLUSION

THE LEGALIZATION OF MARIJUANA IN SEVERAL STATES HAS UNDOUBTEDLY TRANSFORMED THE LANDSCAPE OF DRUG POLICY IN THE UNITED STATES. THE EVOLVING LEGAL ENVIRONMENT PRESENTS OPPORTUNITIES FOR INNOVATION, BETTER PUBLIC HEALTH STRATEGIES, AND A MORE EQUITABLE JUSTICE SYSTEM. ULTIMATELY, THE ONGOING DEBATE UNDERSCORES THE COMPLEXITY OF MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION AND ITS FAR-REACHING SOCIETAL IMPLICATIONS.

WHICH STATES HAVE RECENTLY LEGALIZED MARIJUANA, AND WHEN DID THIS HAPPEN?

SEVERAL STATES, INCLUDING CALIFORNIA, COLORADO, AND OREGON, HAVE LEGALIZED MARIJUANA FOR RECREATIONAL USE, WITH CALIFORNIA LEGALIZING IN 2016, COLORADO IN 2012, AND OREGON IN 2014.

HAS THE LEGALIZATION OF MARIJUANA IN THESE STATES LED TO AN INCREASE IN USAGE

AMONG ADULTS AND MINORS?

YES, DATA INDICATES THAT MARIJUANA USE HAS INCREASED AMONG ADULTS AND, IN SOME CASES, AMONG MINORS, FOLLOWING LEGALIZATION, THOUGH THE EXTENT VARIES BY STATE.

WHAT IMPACT HAS MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION HAD ON PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY?

SOME STUDIES SUGGEST AN INCREASE IN EMERGENCY ROOM VISITS RELATED TO MARIJUANA, AS WELL AS CONCERNS ABOUT IMPAIRED DRIVING, BUT OVERALL PUBLIC HEALTH IMPACTS ARE STILL BEING STUDIED.

HAS MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION AFFECTED CRIME RATES IN STATES WHERE IT HAS BEEN LEGAL?

RESEARCH SHOWS MIXED RESULTS; SOME STATES REPORT DECREASES IN CERTAIN CRIMES LIKE DRUG TRAFFICKING, WHILE OTHERS SEE NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGE OR INCREASES IN SPECIFIC OFFENSES.

WHAT ARE THE ECONOMIC EFFECTS OF MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION IN THESE STATES?

LEGALIZATION HAS GENERATED SIGNIFICANT TAX REVENUE, CREATED JOBS IN THE CANNABIS INDUSTRY, AND REDUCED LAW ENFORCEMENT COSTS RELATED TO MARIJUANA ENFORCEMENT.

DO EXPERTS BELIEVE THAT MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION HAS CONTRIBUTED TO AN INCREASE IN CANNABIS-RELATED HEALTH ISSUES?

WHILE SOME EXPERTS EXPRESS CONCERN OVER POTENTIAL INCREASES IN DEPENDENCY AND MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES, COMPREHENSIVE DATA IS STILL BEING COLLECTED TO DETERMINE LONG-TERM HEALTH IMPACTS.

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

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THE LEGALIZATION OF MARIJUANA ACROSS NUMEROUS U.S. STATES MARKS ONE OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT SHIFTS IN DRUG POLICY IN RECENT DECADES. ONCE BROADLY CRIMINALIZED AT THE FEDERAL LEVEL, CANNABIS HAS GRADUALLY TRANSITIONED FROM AN ILLICIT SUBSTANCE TO A REGULATED COMMODITY IN MULTIPLE JURISDICTIONS. WHILE PROPONENTS CHAMPION ITS MEDICINAL AND ECONOMIC BENEFITS, CRITICS AND CONCERNED CITIZENS HAVE RAISED QUESTIONS ABOUT POTENTIAL SOCIETAL IMPACTS, PARTICULARLY THE ASSERTION THAT MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION HAS LED TO AN INCREASE IN VARIOUS ADVERSE OUTCOMES. THIS INVESTIGATION EXPLORES THE COMPLEX LANDSCAPE SURROUNDING MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION, EXAMINING WHETHER THE AVAILABLE EVIDENCE SUPPORTS CLAIMS OF INCREASES IN USAGE, CRIME, HEALTH CONCERNS, AND OTHER SOCIETAL METRICS FOLLOWING LEGALIZATION.

BACKGROUND: THE EVOLUTION OF MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION IN THE UNITED STATES

OVER THE PAST TWO DECADES, MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION HAS TRANSITIONED FROM A FRINGE MOVEMENT TO A MAINSTREAM POLICY DEBATE. CALIFORNIA PIONEERED THE EFFORT WITH ITS 1996 MEDICAL MARIJUANA INITIATIVE (PROP 215), ALLOWING PATIENTS TO POSSESS AND CULTIVATE CANNABIS FOR MEDICAL USE. SINCE THEN, STATES LIKE COLORADO, WASHINGTON, OREGON, ALASKA, AND MAINE HAVE FOLLOWED SUIT WITH RECREATIONAL LEGALIZATION LAWS.

KEY MILESTONES INCLUDE:

- 2012: COLORADO AND WASHINGTON BECOME THE FIRST STATES TO LEGALIZE RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA.
- 2014: ALASKA AND OREGON ALSO LEGALIZE RECREATIONAL USE.
- 2016: CALIFORNIA, NEVADA, MASSACHUSETTS, AND MAINE PASS LEGAL RECREATIONAL CANNABIS LAWS.
- 2020-2022: ADDITIONAL STATES SUCH AS MICHIGAN, ILLINOIS, AND NEW YORK ADOPT LEGALIZATION MEASURES.

FEDERAL POLICY REMAINS CONFLICTING, WITH THE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT CLASSIFYING MARIJUANA AS A SCHEDULE I SUBSTANCE, WHICH COMPLICATES RESEARCH AND REGULATION. NONETHELESS, STATE-LEVEL LEGALIZATION HAS LED TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF REGULATED MARKETS, DISPENSARIES, AND COMMERCIAL CULTIVATION.

CLAIMS OF INCREASED USAGE POST-LEGALIZATION

A COMMON ASSERTION AMONG CRITICS IS THAT LEGALIZATION LEADS TO INCREASED MARIJUANA CONSUMPTION AMONG VARIOUS DEMOGRAPHIC GROUPS, PARTICULARLY YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS. TO ASSESS THIS, RESEARCHERS HAVE ANALYZED SURVEY DATA, SALES FIGURES, AND EPIDEMIOLOGICAL STUDIES.

EVIDENCE FROM NATIONAL SURVEYS

THE NATIONAL SURVEY ON DRUG USE AND HEALTH (NSDUH) AND MONITORING THE FUTURE (MTF) SURVEYS ARE PRIMARY SOURCES FOR TRACKING SUBSTANCE USE TRENDS:

- ADULT USAGE: DATA INDICATES A RISE IN MARIJUANA USE AMONG ADULTS (18+), WITH STATES THAT HAVE LEGALIZED SEEING HIGHER SELF-REPORTED USAGE RATES POST-LEGALIZATION.
- YOUTH USAGE: THE IMPACT ON ADOLESCENT CONSUMPTION IS MORE NUANCED. WHILE SOME STUDIES SHOW STABLE OR DECLINING USAGE AMONG TEENAGERS, OTHERS REPORT SLIGHT INCREASES IN CERTAIN AGE GROUPS.

KEY FINDINGS INCLUDE:

- POST-LEGALIZATION, ADULT MARIJUANA USE INCREASED BY APPROXIMATELY 10-15% IN SOME STATES.
- YOUTH USAGE RATES HAVE REMAINED RELATIVELY STABLE OR DECLINED SLIGHTLY IN SEVERAL JURISDICTIONS, POSSIBLY DUE TO EFFECTIVE REGULATION AND PUBLIC EDUCATION CAMPAIGNS.
- USAGE AMONG PREGNANT WOMEN AND ADOLESCENTS REMAINS A CONCERN FOR SOME POLICYMAKERS, THOUGH COMPREHENSIVE DATA IS LIMITED.

FACTORS INFLUENCING USAGE TRENDS

USAGE INCREASES MAY NOT SOLELY BE ATTRIBUTABLE TO LEGALIZATION. OTHER FACTORS INCLUDE:

- NORMALIZATION OF CANNABIS: LEGALIZATION REDUCES PERCEIVED RISK, POTENTIALLY ENCOURAGING EXPERIMENTATION.
- MARKET AVAILABILITY: LEGAL DISPENSARIES INCREASE ACCESS FOR ADULTS, POSSIBLY INFLUENCING CONSUMPTION PATTERNS.
- CULTURAL SHIFTS: CHANGING SOCIAL ATTITUDES TOWARD MARIJUANA CONTRIBUTE TO HIGHER ACCEPTANCE AND USE.

IMPACT ON CRIME AND PUBLIC SAFETY

A SIGNIFICANT ASPECT OF THE DEBATE CONCERNS WHETHER MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION CORRELATES WITH CHANGES IN CRIME RATES, ESPECIALLY RELATED TO DRUG OFFENSES, DUIs, AND VIOLENT CRIMES.

CRIME RATE ANALYSES

STUDIES EXAMINING PRE- AND POST-LEGALIZATION CRIME DATA REVEAL MIXED RESULTS:

- REDUCTION IN DRUG-RELATED ARRESTS: SEVERAL STATES REPORT A DECLINE IN MARIJUANA-RELATED ARRESTS, EASING LAW ENFORCEMENT BURDENS.
- IMPACT ON VIOLENT CRIME: SOME RESEARCH SUGGESTS NO SIGNIFICANT INCREASE, WHILE OTHERS INDICATE SLIGHT UPTICKS IN CERTAIN REGIONS.
- IMPAIRED DRIVING INCIDENTS: DATA ON MARIJUANA-IMPAIRED DRIVING IS MIXED; SOME JURISDICTIONS REPORT INCREASES IN DUI ARRESTS INVOLVING CANNABIS, RAISING SAFETY CONCERNS.

CHALLENGES IN DATA INTERPRETATION

- VARIABILITY IN REPORTING STANDARDS.
- DIFFICULTY DISTINGUISHING BETWEEN CAUSATION AND CORRELATION.
- THE INFLUENCE OF ENFORCEMENT PRACTICES AND PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS.

HEALTH AND SOCIAL CONCERNS

THE HEALTH IMPLICATIONS OF INCREASED MARIJUANA USE POST-LEGALIZATION ARE A FOCAL POINT FOR CRITICS. THESE CONCERNS INCLUDE MENTAL HEALTH EFFECTS, DEPENDENCY, AND IMPACTS ON YOUTH DEVELOPMENT.

PUBLIC HEALTH STUDIES

RESEARCH INDICATES:

- MENTAL HEALTH: SOME STUDIES LINK HEAVY CANNABIS USE WITH INCREASED RISKS OF ANXIETY, DEPRESSION, AND PSYCHOSIS, ESPECIALLY AMONG VULNERABLE POPULATIONS.
- DEPENDENCY: WHILE CANNABIS DEPENDENCE IS LESS SEVERE THAN OTHER SUBSTANCES, INCREASED ACCESSIBILITY RAISES CONCERNS ABOUT MISUSE.
- COGNITIVE EFFECTS: ADOLESCENT BRAINS, STILL IN DEVELOPMENT, MAY BE MORE SUSCEPTIBLE TO ADVERSE EFFECTS, PROMPTING ONGOING RESEARCH.

REGULATORY MEASURES AND PUBLIC EDUCATION

STATES HAVE IMPLEMENTED MEASURES SUCH AS:

- PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS.
- AGE RESTRICTIONS.
- LIMITS ON POTENCY.
- RESTRICTIONS ON MARKETING AND ADVERTISING.

THESE EFFORTS AIM TO MITIGATE HEALTH RISKS AND PREVENT YOUTH ACCESS.

ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL IMPACTS OF LEGALIZATION

BEYOND SOCIETAL CONCERNS, LEGALIZATION HAS GENERATED SIGNIFICANT ECONOMIC BENEFITS, INCLUDING JOB CREATION, TAX REVENUE, AND REDUCED LAW ENFORCEMENT COSTS.

ECONOMIC HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE:

- BILLIONS IN ANNUAL STATE TAX REVENUE.
- THOUSANDS OF NEW JOBS IN CULTIVATION, RETAIL, AND ANCILLARY SECTORS.
- COST SAVINGS FROM DECREASED ARRESTS AND PROSECUTIONS.

HOWEVER, CRITICS ARGUE THAT ECONOMIC GAINS SHOULD BE BALANCED AGAINST POTENTIAL SOCIAL COSTS.

CONTROVERSIES AND ONGOING RESEARCH

DESPITE EXTENSIVE DATA, DEBATES PERSIST:

- LONG-TERM EFFECTS: LIMITED LONGITUDINAL STUDIES HINDER DEFINITIVE CONCLUSIONS ABOUT LONG-TERM SOCIETAL IMPACTS.
- DISPARITIES: CONCERNS ABOUT DISPROPORTIONATE ENFORCEMENT HISTORICALLY AFFECTING MINORITY COMMUNITIES, AND WHETHER LEGALIZATION REDUCES OR PERPETUATES THESE DISPARITIES.
- FEDERAL VS. STATE LAW: FEDERAL PROHIBITION CREATES LEGAL AMBIGUITIES AND COMPLICATES RESEARCH, BANKING, AND INTERSTATE COMMERCE.

ONGOING RESEARCH AIMS TO CLARIFY THESE ISSUES, BUT CURRENT EVIDENCE SUGGESTS A COMPLEX PICTURE WITH BOTH BENEFITS AND RISKS.

CONCLUSION: A NUANCED PERSPECTIVE

WHILE SOME EVIDENCE SUPPORTS CLAIMS THAT MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION HAS LED TO INCREASED USAGE, PARTICULARLY AMONG ADULTS, THE PICTURE IS LESS CLEAR-CUT REGARDING YOUTH USE AND SOCIETAL IMPACTS. THE AVAILABLE DATA INDICATES THAT INCREASES IN ADULT CONSUMPTION ARE LIKELY ATTRIBUTABLE TO BROADER CULTURAL SHIFTS AND INCREASED AVAILABILITY, RATHER THAN LEGALIZATION ALONE. CONVERSELY, THE ANTICIPATED RISE IN CRIME OR HEALTH ISSUES HAS NOT BEEN UNIVERSALLY OBSERVED, AND MANY STATES HAVE IMPLEMENTED REGULATORY MEASURES TO MITIGATE RISKS.

ULTIMATELY, MARIJUANA LEGALIZATION EXEMPLIFIES A POLICY SHIFT WITH MULTIFACETED CONSEQUENCES. ONGOING RESEARCH, ADAPTIVE REGULATIONS, AND PUBLIC EDUCATION ARE ESSENTIAL TO MAXIMIZE BENEFITS AND MINIMIZE HARMS. AS MORE STATES CONTEMPLATE OR IMPLEMENT LEGALIZATION, UNDERSTANDING THESE NUANCED IMPACTS REMAINS CRUCIAL FOR POLICYMAKERS, RESEARCHERS, AND THE PUBLIC.
