RECOGNIZING THAT CONGRESS MUST APPROVE MILITARY ACTIONS BEFORE THEY ARE EXECUTED IS FUNDAMENTAL TO PRESERVING THE SEPARATION OF POWERS, ENSURING DEMOCRATIC ACCOUNTABILITY, AND MAINTAINING STRATEGIC STABILITY. FROM INITIAL IDENTIFICATION OF THREATS TO FINAL OVERSIGHT, EACH STEP MUST BE CAREFULLY NAVIGATED TO UPHOLD THE RULE OF LAW AND PROTECT THE INTERESTS OF THE NATION.

BY ADHERING TO THIS SEQUENCE, POLICYMAKERS, MILITARY LEADERS, AND LEGISLATORS WORK TOGETHER TO FORTIFY NATIONAL SECURITY WHILE RESPECTING THE CONSTITUTIONAL FRAMEWORK THAT UNDERPINS AMERICAN DEMOCRACY. IN AN ERA MARKED BY COMPLEX THREATS AND RAPID TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCEMENTS, MAINTAINING THIS DISCIPLINED APPROACH IS MORE CRUCIAL THAN EVER TO SAFEGUARD THE NATION'S FUTURE.
