AS THE GLOBAL ECONOMY EVOLVES WITH TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATIONS AND GEOPOLITICAL SHIFTS, THE PRINCIPLES OF SPECIALIZATION AND COMPARATIVE ADVANTAGE CONTINUE TO GUIDE COUNTRIES TOWARD MUTUALLY BENEFICIAL TRADE RELATIONSHIPS. EMBRACING THESE CONCEPTS, WHILE ADDRESSING THEIR LIMITATIONS, IS ESSENTIAL FOR FOSTERING SUSTAINABLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND GLOBAL PROSPERITY IN THE YEARS AHEAD.

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
