AS WE REFLECT ON THESE THEMES, IT BECOMES CLEAR THAT WHILE THE SPECIFICS MAY DIFFER, THE CORE HUMAN RESPONSES—ADAPTATION, CREATIVITY, CONNECTION—REMAIN CONSTANT. PREPARING FOR A POST-FLU WORLD INVOLVES NOT JUST TECHNOLOGICAL AND INFRASTRUCTURAL READINESS BUT ALSO NURTURING THE INTANGIBLE QUALITIES THAT MAKE US RESILIENT IN THE FACE OF ADVERSITY. IN THIS WAY, FICTION ILLUMINATES PATHWAYS TO HOPE AND SURVIVAL, REMINDING US THAT EVEN IN THE DARKEST TIMES, THE HUMAN SPIRIT CAN FIND ITS VOICE.

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
