

# WHAT TWO THINGS SHOULD BE IN YOUR DESCRIPTION OF A STORY'S THEME?; WHAT ARE TWO WAYS YOU CAN FIND THE

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UNDERSTANDING THE CORE ELEMENTS OF A STORY'S THEME IS ESSENTIAL FOR WRITERS, READERS, AND CRITICS ALIKE. WHEN ANALYZING OR CRAFTING A NARRATIVE, ARTICULATING ITS THEME HELPS CLARIFY THE MESSAGE OR INSIGHT THE STORY AIMS TO CONVEY. BUT WHAT EXACTLY SHOULD BE INCLUDED IN A DESCRIPTION OF A STORY'S THEME? FURTHERMORE, DISCOVERING THE THEME WITHIN A STORY CAN SOMETIMES BE CHALLENGING. FORTUNATELY, THERE ARE EFFECTIVE STRATEGIES TO IDENTIFY IT. IN THIS ARTICLE, WE WILL EXPLORE THE TWO CRUCIAL COMPONENTS THAT SHOULD BE PRESENT IN YOUR DESCRIPTION OF A STORY'S THEME AND DISCUSS TWO PRACTICAL WAYS TO UNCOVER THE THEME WITHIN A NARRATIVE.

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## WHAT TWO THINGS SHOULD BE IN YOUR DESCRIPTION OF A STORY'S THEME?

A COMPREHENSIVE AND INSIGHTFUL DESCRIPTION OF A STORY'S THEME SHOULD ENCAPSULATE TWO FUNDAMENTAL ASPECTS: THE CENTRAL IDEA OR MESSAGE AND THE UNDERLYING INSIGHT INTO HUMAN NATURE OR SOCIETY. INCLUDING THESE COMPONENTS ENSURES YOUR DESCRIPTION ACCURATELY REFLECTS THE DEPTH AND PURPOSE OF THE STORY.

### 1. THE CENTRAL IDEA OR MESSAGE

AT ITS CORE, THE THEME OF A STORY IS ITS PRIMARY MESSAGE—THE MAIN POINT THE AUTHOR WANTS TO COMMUNICATE TO THE AUDIENCE. THIS MESSAGE OFTEN REVOLVES AROUND UNIVERSAL TRUTHS, MORAL LESSONS, OR OBSERVATIONS ABOUT LIFE.

KEY POINTS TO CONSIDER WHEN DESCRIBING THE CENTRAL IDEA:

- WHAT IS THE STORY TRYING TO SAY ABOUT LIFE, LOVE, JUSTICE, OR HUMAN BEHAVIOR?
- DOES THE STORY CONVEY A MORAL LESSON OR WARNING?
- IS THERE AN OVERARCHING STATEMENT ABOUT SOCIETY OR HUMAN NATURE?

EXAMPLES:

- A STORY ILLUSTRATING THAT "TRUE COURAGE IS FACING YOUR FEARS".
- A NARRATIVE EMPHASIZING THAT "LOVE CAN TRANSCEND OBSTACLES".
- A TALE HIGHLIGHTING THE IMPORTANCE OF "HONESTY AND INTEGRITY".

HOW TO ARTICULATE THIS IN YOUR DESCRIPTION:

EXPRESS THE MAIN MESSAGE CLEARLY, AVOIDING VAGUE LANGUAGE. FOR EXAMPLE, INSTEAD OF SAYING, "THE STORY IS ABOUT FRIENDSHIP," SPECIFY, "THE STORY EXPLORES HOW GENUINE FRIENDSHIP CAN HELP INDIVIDUALS OVERCOME PERSONAL STRUGGLES."

### 2. THE UNDERLYING INSIGHT INTO HUMAN NATURE OR SOCIETY

BEYOND THE SURFACE MESSAGE, THE THEME OFTEN REVEALS DEEPER INSIGHTS ABOUT HUMAN NATURE OR SOCIETAL ISSUES. THIS

COMPONENT PROVIDES CONTEXT AND ADDS LAYERS OF MEANING TO THE STORY.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR THIS ASPECT:

- WHAT DOES THE STORY SUGGEST ABOUT HUMAN MOTIVATIONS, EMOTIONS, OR BEHAVIORS?
- DOES IT CRITIQUE OR HIGHLIGHT SOCIETAL NORMS, TRADITIONS, OR INJUSTICES?
- HOW DOES THE STORY REFLECT UNIVERSAL EXPERIENCES OR DILEMMAS?

EXAMPLES:

- THE STORY UNDERSCORES "THE RESILIENCE OF THE HUMAN SPIRIT IN THE FACE OF ADVERSITY".
- IT OFFERS COMMENTARY ON "THE CORRUPTING INFLUENCE OF POWER".
- IT EXAMINES "THE STRUGGLE FOR IDENTITY IN A CONFORMIST SOCIETY".

IN YOUR DESCRIPTION:

IDENTIFY THE BROADER IMPLICATIONS OF THE STORY'S MESSAGE. FOR INSTANCE, "THIS STORY REVEALS HOW SOCIETAL EXPECTATIONS CAN SUPPRESS INDIVIDUAL AUTHENTICITY," OR "IT HIGHLIGHTS THE ENDURING HUMAN DESIRE FOR FREEDOM."

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## WHAT ARE TWO WAYS YOU CAN FIND THE THEME?

DISCOVERING THE THEME OF A STORY CAN SOMETIMES SEEM ELUSIVE, ESPECIALLY WHEN THE NARRATIVE IS COMPLEX OR LAYERED. HOWEVER, THERE ARE EFFECTIVE METHODS TO UNCOVER THE UNDERLYING MESSAGE. HERE ARE TWO PROVEN WAYS TO FIND THE THEME WITHIN A STORY:

### 1. ANALYZING THE TITLE AND REPEATED ELEMENTS

THE TITLE OF A STORY OFTEN HINTS AT ITS CENTRAL THEME OR MESSAGE. SIMILARLY, RECURRING MOTIFS, SYMBOLS, OR PHRASES CAN PROVIDE CLUES.

HOW TO USE THIS METHOD:

- EXAMINE THE STORY'S TITLE FOR KEYWORDS OR PHRASES THAT RESONATE WITH THE NARRATIVE.
- LOOK FOR RECURRING SYMBOLS, METAPHORS, OR MOTIFS THAT EMPHASIZE CERTAIN IDEAS.
- NOTE REPEATED PHRASES OR STATEMENTS MADE BY CHARACTERS OR NARRATORS.

EXAMPLE:

IN GEORGE ORWELL'S "ANIMAL FARM," THE TITLE AND RECURRING REFERENCES TO ANIMALS SYMBOLIZE BROADER POLITICAL ALLEGORIES ABOUT POWER AND CORRUPTION.

PRACTICAL STEPS:

- HIGHLIGHT WORDS OR IMAGES THAT APPEAR MULTIPLE TIMES.
- REFLECT ON HOW THESE ELEMENTS RELATE TO OVERARCHING IDEAS.

BENEFITS:

- HELPS REVEAL THE FOCUS OR MESSAGE THE AUTHOR EMPHASIZES.
- CONNECTS THEMATIC ELEMENTS WITH THE STORY'S TITLE FOR A CLEARER UNDERSTANDING.

## 2. IDENTIFYING THE CONFLICT AND RESOLUTION

THE CENTRAL CONFLICT IN A STORY OFTEN DIRECTLY TIES TO ITS THEME. ANALYZING HOW THE CONFLICT ARISES, UNFOLDS, AND IS RESOLVED CAN SHED LIGHT ON THE MESSAGE THE STORY CONVEYS.

HOW TO IMPLEMENT THIS APPROACH:

- DETERMINE WHAT THE MAIN CONFLICT IS—WHETHER INTERNAL (WITHIN A CHARACTER) OR EXTERNAL (BETWEEN CHARACTERS, SOCIETY, OR NATURE).
- OBSERVE HOW THE CONFLICT IS ADDRESSED OR RESOLVED.
- CONSIDER WHAT LESSONS OR INSIGHTS ARE GAINED THROUGH THE RESOLUTION.

EXAMPLE:

IN "TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD," THE CONFLICT SURROUNDING RACIAL INJUSTICE LEADS TO A RESOLUTION THAT ADVOCATES EMPATHY AND MORAL INTEGRITY, REVEALING THEMES OF JUSTICE AND HUMAN DIGNITY.

PRACTICAL STEPS:

- WRITE DOWN THE PRIMARY CONFLICT AND NOTE WHAT VALUES OR ISSUES IT INVOLVES.
- ANALYZE HOW CHARACTERS CHANGE OR WHAT LESSONS EMERGE AFTER THE CONFLICT'S RESOLUTION.

BENEFITS:

- CLARIFIES THE STORY'S MORAL OR MESSAGE.
- CONNECTS CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT AND PLOT TO OVERARCHING THEMES.

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## ADDITIONAL TIPS FOR EXPLORING A STORY'S THEME

WHILE THE TWO MAIN METHODS OUTLINED ARE EFFECTIVE, CONSIDER THESE ADDITIONAL STRATEGIES FOR A MORE COMPREHENSIVE UNDERSTANDING:

- LOOK AT THE CHARACTERS' GOALS AND GROWTH: HOW DO THEIR DESIRES AND TRANSFORMATIONS REFLECT THE STORY'S MESSAGE?
- EXAMINE THE SETTING AND CONTEXT: SOMETIMES, THE ENVIRONMENT OR HISTORICAL BACKGROUND INFLUENCES THE THEME.
- REFLECT ON THE STORY'S ENDING: DOES IT LEAVE THE READER WITH A MORAL, QUESTION, OR INSIGHT?

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## SUMMARY

IN CRAFTING OR ANALYZING A STORY'S THEME, FOCUS ON TWO KEY COMPONENTS IN YOUR DESCRIPTION: THE CENTRAL IDEA OR MESSAGE AND THE UNDERLYING INSIGHTS INTO HUMAN NATURE OR SOCIETY. THESE ELEMENTS ENSURE YOUR INTERPRETATION CAPTURES THE DEPTH AND SIGNIFICANCE OF THE NARRATIVE.

TO FIND THE THEME WITHIN A STORY, EMPLOY METHODS SUCH AS ANALYZING THE TITLE AND RECURRING SYMBOLS OR EXAMINING THE CONFLICT AND RESOLUTION. THESE APPROACHES HELP UNCOVER THE MESSAGE THE AUTHOR INTENDS TO COMMUNICATE AND DEEPEN YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF THE STORY'S CORE MEANING.

BY MASTERING THESE TECHNIQUES, WRITERS CAN CRAFT MORE MEANINGFUL STORIES, AND READERS CAN DEVELOP A RICHER APPRECIATION FOR THE NARRATIVES THEY ENCOUNTER. REMEMBER, A WELL-ARTICULATED THEME NOT ONLY ENHANCES COMPREHENSION BUT ALSO ELEVATES THE STORYTELLING ITSELF.

### WHAT ARE TWO KEY ELEMENTS THAT SHOULD BE INCLUDED IN YOUR STORY'S THEME DESCRIPTION?

### WHAT ARE TWO EFFECTIVE METHODS TO DISCOVER THE THEME OF A STORY?

ONE WAY IS TO ANALYZE THE STORY'S MAIN CONFLICTS AND RESOLUTIONS, AND ANOTHER IS TO EXAMINE THE RECURRING SYMBOLS OR MOTIFS THAT HIGHLIGHT ITS CENTRAL MESSAGE.

### HOW DOES ANALYZING THE STORY'S CONFLICTS HELP IN FINDING ITS THEME?

ANALYZING CONFLICTS REVEALS THE UNDERLYING ISSUES OR QUESTIONS THE STORY EXPLORES, WHICH OFTEN POINT TO ITS CENTRAL THEME OR MESSAGE.

### WHAT ROLE DO SYMBOLS AND MOTIFS PLAY IN IDENTIFYING A STORY'S THEME?

SYMBOLS AND MOTIFS REINFORCE THE STORY'S MAIN IDEAS AND CAN PROVIDE CLUES TO ITS UNDERLYING THEMES BY HIGHLIGHTING IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OR MESSAGES.

### CAN UNDERSTANDING THE CHARACTERS' MOTIVATIONS HELP IN DEFINING A STORY'S THEME?

YES, CHARACTER MOTIVATIONS OFTEN REFLECT THE STORY'S UNDERLYING MESSAGES AND CAN HELP CLARIFY THE CENTRAL THEME BY REVEALING WHAT DRIVES THE NARRATIVE.

### WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO CLEARLY DEFINE YOUR STORY'S THEME IN YOUR DESCRIPTION?

CLEARLY DEFINING THE THEME HELPS GUIDE THE STORYTELLING PROCESS, ENSURING CONSISTENCY AND ALLOWING READERS TO GRASP THE CORE MESSAGE OR INSIGHT THE STORY AIMS TO DELIVER.

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## UNDERSTANDING THE CORE OF A STORY'S THEME: TWO ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS

WHETHER YOU'RE A SEASONED WRITER OR AN ASPIRING STORYTELLER, KNOWING WHAT TWO CRITICAL ELEMENTS SHOULD BE IN YOUR DESCRIPTION OF A STORY'S THEME CAN SIGNIFICANTLY ELEVATE YOUR STORYTELLING CRAFT. LET'S EXPLORE THESE TWO ELEMENTS COMPREHENSIVELY AND UNDERSTAND WHY THEY ARE INDISPENSABLE.

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## WHAT TWO THINGS SHOULD BE IN YOUR DESCRIPTION OF A STORY'S THEME?

A WELL-ROUNDED THEME DESCRIPTION CAPTURES NOT JUST WHAT THE STORY IS ABOUT ON THE SURFACE BUT ALSO THE DEEPER MESSAGES IT CONVEYS. THE TWO THINGS THAT SHOULD BE EMBEDDED IN YOUR THEME DESCRIPTION ARE:

1. THE CENTRAL MESSAGE OR MORAL
2. THE BROADER UNIVERSAL SIGNIFICANCE

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### 1. THE CENTRAL MESSAGE OR MORAL

AT THE HEART OF ANY STORY LIES A CORE MESSAGE—THE LESSON OR INSIGHT THAT THE STORY AIMS TO COMMUNICATE. THIS IS OFTEN WHAT THE AUDIENCE TAKES AWAY AFTER EXPERIENCING THE NARRATIVE. IT FUNCTIONS LIKE A MORAL COMPASS, GUIDING THE STORY'S ACTIONS AND CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT AND ANCHORING THE STORY'S PURPOSE.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

INCLUDING THE CENTRAL MESSAGE IN YOUR THEME DESCRIPTION ENSURES CLARITY ABOUT WHAT YOUR STORY IS ULTIMATELY TRYING TO SAY. IT ALSO HELPS YOU MAINTAIN FOCUS DURING THE CREATIVE PROCESS, PREVENTING THE STORY FROM VEERING OFF INTO UNNECESSARY SUBPLOTS OR SUPERFICIAL CONFLICTS.

HOW TO IDENTIFY THE CENTRAL MESSAGE?

- REFLECT ON THE PROTAGONIST'S JOURNEY AND GROWTH.
- CONSIDER THE CONFLICTS AND THEIR RESOLUTIONS.
- ASK YOURSELF WHAT THE STORY IS TRYING TO TEACH OR HIGHLIGHT.

EXAMPLES:

- "LOVE AND SACRIFICE ARE THE TRUE TESTS OF CHARACTER."
- "FREEDOM REQUIRES COURAGE AND PERSEVERANCE."
- "THE IMPORTANCE OF EMBRACING ONE'S IDENTITY."

TIPS FOR ARTICULATING THE CENTRAL MESSAGE:

- KEEP IT CONCISE BUT IMPACTFUL.
- USE ACTIVE VERBS AND CLEAR LANGUAGE.
- ENSURE IT RESONATES EMOTIONALLY AND INTELLECTUALLY.

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### 2. THE BROADER UNIVERSAL SIGNIFICANCE

WHILE THE CENTRAL MESSAGE IS SPECIFIC TO YOUR STORY, THE BROADER UNIVERSAL SIGNIFICANCE CONNECTS YOUR NARRATIVE TO LARGER HUMAN EXPERIENCES, SOCIETAL ISSUES, OR PHILOSOPHICAL IDEAS. IT EXPLAINS WHY YOUR STORY MATTERS BEYOND ITS IMMEDIATE PLOT AND CHARACTERS.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

INCORPORATING THIS ELEMENT INTO YOUR THEME DESCRIPTION DEMONSTRATES THE STORY'S RELEVANCE AND INVITES YOUR AUDIENCE TO SEE THEMSELVES IN THE NARRATIVE. IT ELEVATES YOUR STORY FROM A SIMPLE TALE TO A MEANINGFUL EXPLORATION OF UNIVERSAL CONCERNS.

HOW TO IDENTIFY THE UNIVERSAL SIGNIFICANCE?

- THINK ABOUT THE THEMES THAT ARE TIMELESS AND CROSS-CULTURAL.
- LINK YOUR STORY TO BROADER SOCIETAL ISSUES OR PHILOSOPHICAL DEBATES.
- CONSIDER HOW YOUR STORY REFLECTS OR CHALLENGES HUMAN NATURE.

EXAMPLES:

- "THE STORY EXPLORES THE RESILIENCE OF THE HUMAN SPIRIT IN THE FACE OF ADVERSITY."
- "IT EXAMINES THE SOCIETAL IMPACTS OF CORRUPTION AND THE IMPORTANCE OF INTEGRITY."
- "IT HIGHLIGHTS THE UNIVERSAL QUEST FOR BELONGING AND IDENTITY."

TIPS FOR ARTICULATING THE UNIVERSAL SIGNIFICANCE:

- USE INCLUSIVE LANGUAGE THAT APPEALS TO A WIDE AUDIENCE.
- CONNECT PERSONAL STORIES TO LARGER SOCIETAL OR PHILOSOPHICAL THEMES.
- FRAME YOUR THEME IN A WAY THAT ENCOURAGES REFLECTION AND DISCUSSION.

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## How To Find The Two Elements of Your Story's Theme

IDENTIFYING THESE CRUCIAL COMPONENTS REQUIRES CAREFUL ANALYSIS, RESEARCH, AND INTROSPECTION. HERE ARE TWO EFFECTIVE APPROACHES TO DISCOVER THE CENTRAL MESSAGE AND UNIVERSAL SIGNIFICANCE OF YOUR STORY.

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### 1. ANALYZING YOUR STORY'S CORE COMPONENTS

THIS APPROACH INVOLVES A DETAILED EXAMINATION OF YOUR STORY'S ELEMENTS—CHARACTERS, CONFLICTS, SETTING, AND RESOLUTION—TO EXTRACT ITS UNDERLYING MESSAGE AND BROADER RELEVANCE.

- REFLECT ON KEY SCENES AND SYMBOLS

SIGNIFICANT MOMENTS OR SYMBOLS CAN SYMBOLIZE LARGER IDEAS OR UNIVERSAL TRUTHS.

- SUMMARIZE THE INTENDED MORAL

WRITE A BRIEF STATEMENT OF WHAT YOU WANT AUDIENCES TO TAKE AWAY.

- CONNECT TO BROADER ISSUES

THINK ABOUT SOCIETAL, CULTURAL, OR PHILOSOPHICAL THEMES RELATED TO YOUR STORY.

EXAMPLE:

A STORY ABOUT A YOUNG REFUGEE OVERCOMING ADVERSITY MIGHT HAVE A CENTRAL MESSAGE OF RESILIENCE AND HOPE, WITH UNIVERSAL SIGNIFICANCE RELATED TO HUMAN RIGHTS AND COMPASSION.

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## 2. ENGAGING IN AUDIENCE AND PEER FEEDBACK

SOMETIMES, THE BEST WAY TO UNCOVER YOUR STORY'S THEME IS THROUGH EXTERNAL PERSPECTIVES. SHARING YOUR STORY OR ITS SYNOPSIS WITH TRUSTED READERS, CRITIQUE PARTNERS, OR AUDIENCES CAN REVEAL INSIGHTS YOU MIGHT NOT SEE YOURSELF.

STEPS TO LEVERAGE FEEDBACK:

- PRESENT A CLEAR SUMMARY

SHARE A BRIEF SYNOPSIS EMPHASIZING THE PLOT AND CHARACTERS.

- ASK SPECIFIC QUESTIONS

INQUIRE ABOUT WHAT THEY PERCEIVE AS THE STORY'S CORE MESSAGE AND RELEVANCE.

- NOTE RECURRING THEMES OR IDEAS

LOOK FOR COMMON RESPONSES OR INTERPRETATIONS THAT HIGHLIGHT THE STORY'S UNDERLYING MESSAGES.

- REFINE YOUR THEME DESCRIPTION

USE THE FEEDBACK TO CRAFT A CONCISE AND COMPELLING STATEMENT THAT CAPTURES BOTH THE CENTRAL MESSAGE AND UNIVERSAL SIGNIFICANCE.

BENEFITS:

- OFFERS FRESH PERSPECTIVES AND INTERPRETATIONS.

- REVEALS THE EMOTIONAL IMPACT OF YOUR STORY.

- HELPS ENSURE YOUR THEME RESONATES WITH DIVERSE AUDIENCES.
