- IDENTIFY THE RELATIONSHIP IN THE FIRST PAIR BEFORE REVIEWING OPTIONS.
- FOCUS ON THE NATURE OF THE RELATIONSHIP—IS IT CATEGORICAL, FUNCTIONAL, OR RELATIONAL?
- ELIMINATE OPTIONS THAT DO NOT FIT THE TYPE OF RELATIONSHIP.
- RECALL STANDARD COLLECTIVE NOUNS FOR ANIMALS AND OBJECTS—THIS KNOWLEDGE IS CRUCIAL.
- PRACTICE WITH DIVERSE ANALOGY PAIRS TO BUILD AN INTUITIVE UNDERSTANDING OF RELATIONSHIPS.
