- ADDRESSING THE ROOT CAUSES BEHIND SUCH ACTS LEADS TO MORE EFFECTIVE AND HUMANE SOCIAL RESPONSES.

BY VIEWING PETTY CRIMES THROUGH THE LENS OF RESISTANCE, SOCIETY GAINS A RICHER UNDERSTANDING OF HUMAN BEHAVIOR AND THE IMPORTANCE OF SOCIAL JUSTICE IN SHAPING BEHAVIOR.

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
