- THE TREND TOWARD MARRYING LATER ALLOWS INDIVIDUALS MORE TIME TO EXPLORE PERSONAL IDENTITY, CAREER, AND COMPATIBILITY BEFORE TYING THE KNOT.
- COHABITATION BEFORE MARRIAGE HAS BECOME NORMATIVE, SERVING AS A TESTING GROUND FOR LONG-TERM COMMITMENT.

IMPACT OF GLOBALIZATION AND CULTURAL EXCHANGE

1. CROSS-CULTURAL MARRIAGES

- INCREASED GLOBALIZATION HAS LED TO MORE INTERCULTURAL UNIONS, BLENDING TRADITIONS AND FOSTERING MULTICULTURAL FAMILIES.
