- **ADML files:** Language-specific resource files associated with ADMX files, containing localized display text for policy settings.

These files work together to provide a user-friendly interface in the Group Policy Management Console (GPMC) or Group Policy Editor, enabling administrators to configure policies efficiently.

Default Files Accessed by Group Policy Tools from the Central Store

By default, when administrators use Group Policy Management tools on a Windows Server or Windows client, they access specific files stored in the Central Store. The primary files involved are:
