RELEVANCE IN MODERN LITERATURE AND MEDIA

IN SUM, "DEATH IN THE PASSAGE BELOW" IS A POWERFUL MOTIF THAT RESONATES ACROSS VARIOUS DOMAINS, EMPHASIZING THE UNIVERSALITY OF MORTALITY AND THE ENDURING HUMAN EFFORT TO FIND MEANING AMID THE PASSAGE INTO THE UNKNOWN.
