FAR FROM MERE ACTS OF DESTRUCTION, THESE ACTS SERVED AS DELIBERATE TOOLS TO ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN HIS EMPIRE, ELIMINATE THREATS, AND PROJECT POWER ACROSS MESOPOTAMIA.

HIS APPROACH REFLECTED AN UNDERSTANDING OF URBAN FORTIFICATIONS AS SYMBOLS OF INDEPENDENCE AND RESISTANCE. BY DISMANTLING THESE DEFENSES, SARGON EFFECTIVELY RESHAPED THE POLITICAL LANDSCAPE OF ANCIENT MESOPOTAMIA, LAYING THE GROUNDWORK FOR FUTURE IMPERIAL RULE AND INFLUENCING WARFARE, GOVERNANCE, AND URBAN PLANNING FOR CENTURIES TO COME.

IN ANALYZING SARGON'S CAMPAIGNS, IT BECOMES EVIDENT THAT THE DESTRUCTION OF CITY WALLS WAS A CALCULATED ACT OF EMPIRE-BUILDING—AN ASSERTION OF DOMINANCE THAT EXTENDED BEYOND PHYSICAL CONQUEST TO SHAPE THE VERY FABRIC OF CIVILIZATION IN THE ANCIENT NEAR EAST.
