THE CATALYST: PEARL HARBOR ATTACK

THE TURNING POINT CAME ON DECEMBER 7, 1941, WHEN JAPAN LAUNCHED A SURPRISE ATTACK ON THE U.S. NAVAL BASE AT PEARL HARBOR, HAWAII.

DETAILS OF THE ATTACK

- OVER 2,400 AMERICANS KILLED AND NUMEROUS SHIPS AND AIRCRAFT DESTROYED.
- THE ATTACK AIMED TO NEUTRALIZE THE U.S. PACIFIC FLEET AND EXPAND JAPANESE DOMINANCE IN ASIA.

UNITED STATES DECLARES WAR

- FOLLOWING THE ATTACK, CONGRESS DECLARED WAR ON JAPAN ON DECEMBER 8, 1941.
- SOON AFTER, GERMANY AND ITALY DECLARED WAR ON THE UNITED STATES, OFFICIALLY BRINGING AMERICA INTO WORLD WAR II.

AMERICA JOINS THE GLOBAL CONFLICT

THE ENTRY OF THE UNITED STATES SIGNIFICANTLY ALTERED THE DYNAMICS OF WWII, PROVIDING THE ALLIES WITH IMMENSE RESOURCES, MANPOWER, AND INDUSTRIAL CAPACITY.

KEY THEATERS OF OPERATION

- EUROPEAN THEATER: FOCUSED ON DEFEATING NAZI GERMANY AND LIBERATING OCCUPIED TERRITORIES.

WOMEN AND MINORITIES IN THE WAR EFFORT

- THE ICONIC "ROSIE THE RIVETER" SYMBOLIZED WOMEN'S CONTRIBUTIONS TO INDUSTRY.
- AFRICAN AMERICANS, LATINOS, AND OTHER MINORITIES SERVED IN SEGREGATED UNITS AND FACED CHALLENGES BUT CONTRIBUTED SIGNIFICANTLY.

END OF THE WAR AND AXIS DEFEAT

THE CONVERGENCE OF ALLIED MILITARY VICTORIES AND STRATEGIC BOMBING CAMPAIGNS ULTIMATELY LED TO THE COLLAPSE OF THE AXIS POWERS.

SURRENDER OF GERMANY

- HITLER COMMITTED SUICIDE IN APRIL 1945.
- GERMANY SURRENDERED UNCONDITIONALLY ON MAY 7, 1945, MARKING VE DAY.

JAPAN'S SURRENDER AND THE END OF WWII

- THE UNITED STATES DROPPED ATOMIC BOMBS ON HIROSHIMA AND NAGASAKI IN AUGUST 1945.
- JAPAN ANNOUNCED SURRENDER ON AUGUST 15, 1945, OFFICIALLY SIGNING ON SEPTEMBER 2, 1945 (VJ DAY).

IMPACT AND LEGACY OF U.S. INVOLVEMENT

THE AFTERMATH OF WWII RESHAPED THE GLOBAL ORDER AND ESTABLISHED THE UNITED STATES AS A SUPERPOWER.

- THE RISE OF FASCIST REGIMES IN GERMANY, ITALY, AND JAPAN CREATED A GLOBAL THREAT.
- ECONOMIC TIES WITH ALLIED NATIONS, ESPECIALLY BRITAIN AND CHINA, INCREASED.
- LEND-LEASE ACT OF 1941 MARKED A SHIFT, ALLOWING THE U.S. TO SUPPLY WAR MATERIAL TO ALLIES WITHOUT DIRECT INVOLVEMENT.

THE TURNING POINT: PEARL HARBOR

- ON DECEMBER 7, 1941, JAPAN LAUNCHED A SURPRISE ATTACK ON THE U.S. NAVAL BASE AT PEARL HARBOR, HAWAII.
- THE ATTACK RESULTED IN SIGNIFICANT LOSS OF LIFE AND NAVAL ASSETS, GALVANIZING AMERICAN PUBLIC OPINION.
- THE FOLLOWING DAY, DECEMBER 8, 1941, THE U.S. CONGRESS DECLARED WAR ON JAPAN, FORMALLY ENTERING WORLD WAR II.

THE UNITED STATES' ENTRY AND MOBILIZATION

DECLARATION OF WAR AND GLOBAL COMMITMENT

- AFTER PEARL HARBOR, THE U.S. DECLARED WAR ON JAPAN; SHORTLY THEREAFTER, GERMANY AND ITALY DECLARED WAR ON THE U.S., BRINGING THE NATION FULLY INTO THE GLOBAL CONFLICT.
- THIS MARKED THE BEGINNING OF AMERICA'S EXTENSIVE MILITARY ENGAGEMENT ACROSS MULTIPLE THEATERS.

INDUSTRIAL AND ECONOMIC MOBILIZATION

- THE U.S. RAPIDLY TRANSFORMED ITS INDUSTRIAL BASE TO SUPPORT WARTIME PRODUCTION.
- KEY ASPECTS OF MOBILIZATION INCLUDED:
 - CONVERSION OF FACTORIES TO PRODUCE TANKS, AIRCRAFT, SHIPS, AND WEAPONS.
 - RATIONING OF FOOD, FUEL, AND MATERIALS.

EUROPEAN AND NORTH AFRICAN CAMPAIGNS

INVASION OF NORMANDY (D-DAY):

- JUNE 6, 1944, SAW THE MASSIVE ALLIED INVASION OF NORMANDY, FRANCE.

- BEGAN IN 1942 WITH BATTLES SUCH AS EL ALAMEIN.
- THE ALLIES PUSHED AXIS FORCES OUT OF AFRICA, SECURING STRATEGIC POSITIONS AND PREPARING FOR THE INVASION OF EUROPE.

PACIFIC THEATER

JAPANESE EXPANSION AND U.S. RESPONSE:

- JAPAN RAPIDLY EXPANDED ACROSS ASIA AND THE PACIFIC, CAPTURING TERRITORIES LIKE THE PHILIPPINES, GUAM, AND WAKE ISLAND.
- THE ATTACK ON PEARL HARBOR WAS A DIRECT RESPONSE TO AMERICAN EMBARGOES AND RESTRICTIONS ON JAPAN.

KEY BATTLES:

- BATTLE OF MIDWAY (JUNE 1942): A DECISIVE NAVAL VICTORY THAT SHIFTED THE BALANCE OF POWER IN THE PACIFIC.

ECONOMIC BOOM AND WORKFORCE CHANGES

- WAR PRODUCTION CREATED MILLIONS OF JOBS, ENDING THE GREAT DEPRESSION.
- WOMEN ENTERED THE WORKFORCE IN UNPRECEDENTED NUMBERS, SYMBOLIZED BY "ROSIE THE RIVETER."
- RACIAL SEGREGATION PERSISTED, BUT THE WAR ALSO LAID GROUNDWORK FOR FUTURE CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENTS.

PROPAGANDA AND PUBLIC SUPPORT

- EXTENSIVE USE OF MEDIA TO RALLY SUPPORT.
- CAMPAIGNS TARGETED ENLISTMENT, CONSERVATION, AND PATRIOTISM.

INTERMENT AND CIVIL LIBERTIES

- JAPANESE AMERICANS FACED INTERNMENT IN CAMPS, REFLECTING WARTIME FEARS AND RACIAL PREJUDICE.
- THE INTERNMENT REMAINS A CONTROVERSIAL CHAPTER IN U.S. HISTORY.

END OF THE WAR AND ITS AFTERMATH

SURRENDER OF AXIS POWERS

- NAZI GERMANY SURRENDERED UNCONDITIONALLY ON MAY 7, 1945, FOLLOWING HITLER'S SUICIDE AND THE FALL OF BERLIN.
- JAPAN SURRENDERED ON AUGUST 15, 1945, AFTER THE ATOMIC BOMBINGS OF HIROSHIMA AND NAGASAKI, OFFICIALLY SIGNING SURRENDER DOCUMENTS ON SEPTEMBER 2, 1945.

IMPACT ON THE UNITED STATES

- EMERGED AS A SUPERPOWER, WITH NUCLEAR CAPABILITIES AND A DOMINANT GLOBAL INFLUENCE.
- PARTICIPATED IN ESTABLISHING THE UNITED NATIONS TO PROMOTE INTERNATIONAL PEACE.
- INITIATED THE COLD WAR ERA, DRIVEN BY TENSIONS WITH THE SOVIET UNION.

LEGACY AND LESSONS

- THE WAR LED TO SIGNIFICANT SOCIAL, POLITICAL, AND TECHNOLOGICAL CHANGES.
- IT HIGHLIGHTED THE IMPORTANCE OF INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AND MILITARY PREPAREDNESS.
