USING A WORD BANK FOR VERB SELECTION

WHAT IS A WORD BANK?

A WORD BANK IS A COLLECTION OF WORDS PROVIDED TO HELP YOU COMPLETE SENTENCES. IN LANGUAGE EXERCISES, A WORD BANK OFTEN INCLUDES VERBS FROM WHICH YOU SELECT THE MOST APPROPRIATE ONE TO FIT THE SENTENCE CONTEXT.

VERB CONJUGATION BASICS

UNDERSTANDING VERB TENSES

VERB TENSES INDICATE WHEN AN ACTION OCCURS: PAST, PRESENT, OR FUTURE. CORRECT TENSE USAGE IS CRITICAL FOR CLEAR COMMUNICATION.

COMMON TENSES INCLUDE:

- PRESENT SIMPLE
- PAST SIMPLE
- FUTURE SIMPLE
- PRESENT CONTINUOUS
- PAST CONTINUOUS
- PRESENT PERFECT
- PAST PERFECT

CONJUGATION PATTERNS

MOST VERBS FOLLOW REGULAR PATTERNS, BUT SOME ARE IRREGULAR AND NEED SPECIAL ATTENTION.

REGULAR VERBS:

- ADD -ED FOR PAST TENSE (E.G., WALK ☐ WALKED)
- ADD -S OR -ES FOR THIRD PERSON SINGULAR PRESENT (E.G., SHE WALKS)

IRREGULAR VERBS:

- CHANGE FORM ENTIRELY (E.G., GO ☐ WENT, SEE ☐ SAW)

SUBJECT-VERB AGREEMENT

THE VERB MUST AGREE WITH THE SUBJECT IN NUMBER AND PERSON.

EXAMPLES:

- HE RUNS EVERY MORNING.
- THEY RUN EVERY MORNING.

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE TO COMPLETING SENTENCES USING THE WORD BANK

STEP 1: ANALYZE THE SENTENCE

IDENTIFY THE SUBJECT, TENSE, AND CONTEXT.

STEP 2: REVIEW THE WORD BANK

LOOK AT ALL THE VERBS AVAILABLE. NOTE THEIR BASE FORMS AND ANY IRREGULARITIES.

ADVANCED TIPS FOR VERB CONJUGATION

HANDLING IRREGULAR VERBS

IRREGULAR VERBS DO NOT FOLLOW STANDARD PATTERNS. MEMORIZING COMMON IRREGULAR FORMS IS ESSENTIAL.

EXAMPLES:

- BE WAS/WERE BEEN
- GO WENT GONE
- SEE SAW SEEN

USING MODAL VERBS

MODAL VERBS LIKE CAN, COULD, MAY, MIGHT, MUST, SHALL, SHOULD, WILL, WOULD EXPRESS ABILITY, PERMISSION, OBLIGATION, OR PROBABILITY. THEY DO NOT CHANGE FORM BASED ON TENSE BUT ARE FOLLOWED BY THE BASE FORM.

EXAMPLES:

- SHE CAN SWIM.
- THEY MUST FINISH THEIR HOMEWORK.

VERB PHRASES AND CONTINUOUS TENSES

USE AUXILIARY VERBS TO FORM CONTINUOUS AND PERFECT TENSES.

EXAMPLES:

- PRESENT CONTINUOUS: IS/ARE/AM + VERB ENDING IN -ING (E.G., SHE IS RUNNING)

- PAST PERFECT: HAD + PAST PARTICIPLE (E.G., THEY HAD FINISHED)

COMMON MISTAKES TO AVOID WHEN CONJUGATING VERBS

- **INCORRECT TENSE USAGE:** USING PAST TENSE IN A PRESENT TENSE SENTENCE.
- **SUBJECT-VERB DISAGREEMENT:** SAYING "HE GO" INSTEAD OF "HE GOES."
- **IGNORING IRREGULAR FORMS:** USING "GOED" INSTEAD OF "WENT."
- **OMITTING AUXILIARY VERBS IN CONTINUOUS OR PERFECT TENSES:** SAYING "SHE RUNNING" INSTEAD OF "SHE IS RUNNING."
- **INCORRECT MODAL VERB PLACEMENT:** "SHE CAN TO SWIM" INSTEAD OF "SHE CAN SWIM."

BARKS

SELECT AND CONJUGATE THE APPROPRIATE VERB: YOUR TEAM ____ (WIN) THE MATCH YESTERDAY.

WON

CHOOSE THE CORRECT VERB AND CONJUGATE: YOUR COUSIN ____ (VISIT) US NEXT WEEK.

WILL VISIT

THE PROCESS OF CORRECT VERB SELECTION AND CONJUGATION

STEP 1: UNDERSTANDING CONTEXT AND SENTENCE MEANING

BEFORE CHOOSING A VERB, ANALYZE:

- THE SUBJECT OF THE SENTENCE (SINGULAR/PLURAL)
- THE TENSE REQUIRED (PRESENT, PAST, FUTURE)
- THE MOOD (INDICATIVE, IMPERATIVE, SUBJUNCTIVE)
- THE OVERALL MESSAGE OR ACTION

EXAMPLE:

"SHE _____ (RUN) EVERY MORNING."

CONTEXT INDICATES A HABITUAL ACTION IN THE PRESENT TENSE, SINGULAR SUBJECT, REQUIRING "RUNS."

STEP 2: SELECTING THE CORRECT VERB FROM THE WORD BANK

BASED ON THE CONTEXT, CHOOSE THE VERB THAT FITS:

- THE ACTION OR STATE
- THE GRAMMATICAL NUMBER AND PERSON
- THE TENSE AND ASPECT

EXAMPLE:

WORD BANK: RUN, RUNS, RAN, RUNNING

GIVEN THE SUBJECT "SHE" AND HABITUAL PRESENT TENSE, SELECT "RUNS."

STEP 3: CONJUGATING THE VERB

APPLY RULES OF CONJUGATION TO MATCH TENSE, PERSON, AND NUMBER:

- REGULAR VERBS: ADD -ED FOR PAST, -ING FOR PRESENT PARTICIPLE

REGULAR VERBS

- PRESENT TENSE: ADD 'S' OR 'ES' FOR THIRD PERSON SINGULAR (HE, SHE, IT)
- PAST TENSE: ADD -ED
- PRESENT PARTICIPLE: ADD -ING

EXAMPLES:

BASE FORM	PRESENT	PAST	PARTICIPLE
-----	-----	-----	-----
TALK	TALKS	TALKED	TALKING
PLAY	PLAYS	PLAYED	PLAYING

IRREGULAR VERBS

IRREGULAR VERBS DO NOT FOLLOW STANDARD PATTERNS. THEY REQUIRE MEMORIZATION OR REFERENCE. EXAMPLES INCLUDE:

BASE FORM	PAST TENSE	PAST PARTICIPLE
-----	-----	-----
GO	WENT	GONE
SEE	SAW	SEEN
WRITE	WROTE	WRITTEN

MODAL VERBS

MODAL VERBS LIKE "CAN," "MUST," "SHOULD" DO NOT CONJUGATE IN THE TRADITIONAL SENSE BUT ARE USED WITH BASE FORM OF THE MAIN VERB.

EXAMPLE:

SHE CAN SWIM.

THEY SHOULD STUDY.

CHALLENGES IN CHOOSING AND CONJUGATING VERBS

COMMON MISTAKES

- INCORRECT TENSE USE: E.G., SAYING "HE GO TO SCHOOL" INSTEAD OF "HE GOES TO SCHOOL."
- SUBJECT-VERB AGREEMENT ERRORS: E.G., "THEY RUNS" INSTEAD OF "THEY RUN."
- MISAPPLICATION OF IRREGULAR FORMS: E.G., "BUYED" INSTEAD OF "BOUGHT."
- OMISSION OF AUXILIARY VERBS IN PERFECT OR CONTINUOUS TENSES.

FACTORS CONTRIBUTING TO ERRORS

- LACK OF FAMILIARITY WITH IRREGULAR VERBS
- CONFUSION BETWEEN VERB FORMS
- OVERGENERALIZATION OF REGULAR CONJUGATION RULES
- NEGLECT OF CONTEXTUAL CLUES
