THE DICHOTOMY BETWEEN CENTRALIZED AND DECENTRALIZED WAREHOUSING IS INCREASINGLY BLURRED BY TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCES AND EVOLVING CONSUMER EXPECTATIONS.

ULTIMATELY, THE OPTIMAL WAREHOUSING STRATEGY ALIGNS WITH A COMPANY'S OVERALL SUPPLY CHAIN OBJECTIVES, RESOURCE CAPABILITIES, AND CUSTOMER EXPECTATIONS. AS SUPPLY CHAIN COMPLEXITY INCREASES, THE IMPORTANCE OF STRATEGIC, FLEXIBLE WAREHOUSING SOLUTIONS BECOMES PARAMOUNT, DEMANDING ONGOING EVALUATION AND ADAPTATION.
