4. ERROR: I AM GOING TO THE PARTY LAST NIGHT.

- INCORRECT TENSE: AM GOING (PRESENT CONTINUOUS)
- CORRECTED: WENT

REVISED SENTENCE: I WENT TO THE PARTY LAST NIGHT.

5. ERROR: THE DOG BARK LOUDLY EVERY MORNING.

- INCORRECT VERB: BARK
- CORRECTED: BARKS

REVISED SENTENCE: THE DOG BARKS LOUDLY EVERY MORNING.

6. ERROR: SHE WAS STUDYING WHEN I ARRIVED.

- CORRECT VERB: WAS (PAST CONTINUOUS)
- THIS SENTENCE IS CORRECT; INCLUDING THIS AS A REMINDER THAT SOME TENSE FORMS ARE APPROPRIATE.

7. ERROR: THEY WILL BE HERE TOMORROW.

- CORRECT VERB: WILL
- THIS SENTENCE IS CORRECT; FUTURE TENSE IS USED APPROPRIATELY.

8. ERROR: WE EATS DINNER TOGETHER EVERY NIGHT.

- INCORRECT VERB: EATS
- CORRECTED: EAT

REVISED SENTENCE: WE EAT DINNER TOGETHER EVERY NIGHT.

9. ERROR: SHE HAS A NEW CAR.

- CORRECT VERB: HAS
- SENTENCE IS CORRECT.

10. ERROR: I WAS READ A BOOK WHEN YOU CALLED.

- INCORRECT VERB: WAS READ
- CORRECTED: WAS READING

REVISED SENTENCE: I WAS READING A BOOK WHEN YOU CALLED.

11. ERROR: THE STUDENTS HAS SUBMITTED THEIR ASSIGNMENTS.

- INCORRECT VERB: HAS
- CORRECTED: HAVE

REVISED SENTENCE: THE STUDENTS HAVE SUBMITTED THEIR ASSIGNMENTS.

12. ERROR: SHE DOES HER HOMEWORK EVERY DAY.

- CORRECT VERB: DOES
- SENTENCE IS CORRECT.

13. ERROR: THE TEAM ARE WINNING THE GAME.

- INCORRECT VERB: ARE
- CORRECTED: IS

REVISED SENTENCE: THE TEAM IS WINNING THE GAME.

14. ERROR: I AM GOING TO THE GYM NOW.

- CORRECT VERB: AM GOING
- SENTENCE IS CORRECT.

15. ERROR: THEY WAS HAPPY WITH THE RESULTS.

- INCORRECT VERB: WAS
- CORRECTED: WERE

REVISED SENTENCE: THEY WERE HAPPY WITH THE RESULTS.

HOW TO SPOT AND CORRECT VERB ERRORS EFFECTIVELY

1. CHECK SUBJECT-VERB AGREEMENT

- ENSURE SINGULAR SUBJECTS MATCH WITH SINGULAR VERBS, AND PLURAL SUBJECTS WITH PLURAL VERBS.
- EXAMPLE: THE CAT RUNS FAST. VS. THE CATS RUN FAST.

2. PAY ATTENTION TO VERB TENSES

- MAINTAIN CONSISTENT TENSE THROUGHOUT YOUR WRITING UNLESS A TIME CHANGE IS NECESSARY.
- USE PAST TENSE FOR ACTIONS COMPLETED IN THE PAST, PRESENT TENSE FOR CURRENT ACTIONS, AND FUTURE TENSE FOR UPCOMING EVENTS.

3. BE MINDFUL OF IRREGULAR VERBS

- IRREGULAR VERBS DO NOT FOLLOW STANDARD RULES. MEMORIZE COMMON IRREGULAR FORMS, SUCH AS GO-WENT-GONE, SEE-SAW-SEEN.

4. REVIEW AUXILIARY VERBS AND MODAL VERBS

- AUXILIARY VERBS SUPPORT MAIN VERBS (E.G., IS, WAS, HAVE, HAD).
- MODAL VERBS (E.G., CAN, SHOULD, MUST) EXPRESS NECESSITY OR ABILITY.

- ERROR TYPE: SUBJECT-VERB AGREEMENT.
- CORRECTION: THEY WERE ABLE TO FINISH

DEEPER DIVE: WHY THE ERRORS OCCURRED AND HOW TO AVOID THEM

UNDERSTANDING THE ROOT CAUSES OF THESE ERRORS HELPS WRITERS DEVELOP BETTER EDITING HABITS.

1. TENSE INCONSISTENCIES

MANY ERRORS STEM FROM SHIFTING TENSES OR USING INCORRECT TENSE FORMS. FOR EXAMPLE, “HAS OVERLOOKED” INSTEAD OF “HAD OVERLOOKED” OCCURS BECAUSE THE WRITER WAS LIKELY THINKING IN PRESENT PERFECT TENSE BUT WAS NARRATING EVENTS IN PAST TENSE.

AVOIDANCE TIP: MAINTAIN A CONSISTENT TENSE THROUGHOUT A PARAGRAPH. WHEN NARRATING PAST EVENTS, STICK TO PAST SIMPLE, PAST PERFECT, OR PAST CONTINUOUS AS APPROPRIATE.

2. SUBJECT-VERB AGREEMENT

ERRORS SUCH AS “THEY WAS” INSTEAD OF “THEY WERE” HAPPEN WHEN THE WRITER MISTAKENLY PAIRS A PLURAL SUBJECT WITH A SINGULAR VERB.

AVOIDANCE TIP: ALWAYS IDENTIFY THE SUBJECT FIRST; IF PLURAL, USE WERE, IF SINGULAR, WAS.

3. VERB FORM ERRORS

USING INCORRECT VERB FORMS, ESPECIALLY WITH IRREGULAR VERBS, CAN LEAD TO MISTAKES. ALTHOUGH NOT PRESENT HERE, SIMILAR ERRORS INCLUDE “GO” INSTEAD OF “WENT”.

AVOIDANCE TIP: REGULARLY REVIEW IRREGULAR VERB FORMS AND CONFIRM VERB CONJUGATIONS DURING EDITING.

PRACTICAL STRATEGIES FOR ERROR DETECTION AND CORRECTION

TO ENSURE GRAMMATICAL ACCURACY, ESPECIALLY WITH VERBS, CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING STRATEGIES:

- READ ALOUD: LISTENING TO THE FLOW CAN HIGHLIGHT GRAMMATICAL INCONSISTENCIES.
 - USE GRAMMAR CHECKING TOOLS: SOFTWARE LIKE GRAMMARLY OR HEMINGWAY EDITOR CAN FLAG COMMON VERB ERRORS.

 - MAINTAIN TENSE CONSISTENCY: DECIDE ON A PRIMARY TENSE FOR YOUR NARRATIVE AND STICK TO IT UNLESS THERE'S A CLEAR REASON TO SHIFT.
 - REVIEW IRREGULAR VERBS: KEEP A LIST OF COMMON IRREGULAR VERBS TO AVOID MISTAKES.
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FINAL THOUGHTS: THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENTION TO DETAIL

THIS INVESTIGATIVE ANALYSIS HIGHLIGHTS HOW EVEN A SMALL NUMBER OF VERB ERRORS CAN IMPACT THE OVERALL QUALITY OF A WRITTEN PIECE. BY UNDERSTANDING THE COMMON PITFALLS—SUCH AS TENSE SHIFTS AND SUBJECT-VERB DISAGREEMENTS—AND ACTIVELY APPLYING CORRECTION STRATEGIES, WRITERS CAN ELEVATE THEIR WORK TO A HIGHER STANDARD. REMEMBER, THE GOAL IS NOT JUST TO AVOID ERRORS BUT TO COMMUNICATE IDEAS AS EFFECTIVELY AND PRECISELY AS POSSIBLE.

IN CONCLUSION, THE IDENTIFIED 15 ERRORS IN THE ORIGINAL PARAGRAPH SERVE AS A VALUABLE CASE STUDY. CORRECTING THE THREE KEY MISTAKES RELATED TO TENSE AND AGREEMENT SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVES THE GRAMMATICAL INTEGRITY OF THE TEXT. CONTINUOUS PRACTICE, AWARENESS, AND THE USE OF EDITING RESOURCES ARE ESSENTIAL STEPS TOWARD MASTERING VERB ACCURACY IN WRITING.
