PAINE'S MASTERFUL BLEND OF EMOTIONAL APPEAL, VIVID IMAGERY, AND CALL TO ACTION CONTINUES TO INSPIRE GENERATIONS TO STAND FIRM AGAINST OPPRESSION AND INJUSTICE. AS A PIECE OF REVOLUTIONARY LITERATURE, IT EXEMPLIFIES HOW WORDS CAN IGNITE CHANGE AND SUSTAIN HOPE—THE VERY ESSENCE OF REVOLUTIONARY SPIRIT.
