

WHEN YOU HAVE BLOOD DRAWN AT THE DOCTORS OFFICE, WHICH VESSEL TYPE WOULD YOU EXPECT THEM TO DRAW FROM?

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UNDERSTANDING THE PROCESS OF BLOOD COLLECTION IS ESSENTIAL FOR PATIENTS, HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS, AND ANYONE INTERESTED IN MEDICAL PROCEDURES. ONE OF THE MOST COMMON DIAGNOSTIC TESTS INVOLVES DRAWING BLOOD, A PROCEDURE KNOWN AS VENIPUNCTURE. IF YOU'VE EVER WONDERED WHICH BLOOD VESSEL TYPE YOUR HEALTHCARE PROVIDER TARGETS DURING THIS PROCESS, THIS ARTICLE PROVIDES A COMPREHENSIVE GUIDE. WE'LL EXPLORE THE TYPES OF BLOOD VESSELS, THE REASONS BEHIND CHOOSING SPECIFIC VESSELS, AND WHAT TO EXPECT DURING A BLOOD DRAW.

INTRODUCTION TO BLOOD VESSELS AND THEIR ROLE IN CIRCULATORY SYSTEM

BEFORE DELVING INTO WHICH VESSELS ARE TYPICALLY USED FOR BLOOD DRAWS, IT'S IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND THE STRUCTURE AND FUNCTION OF BLOOD VESSELS IN THE HUMAN BODY.

THE CIRCULATORY SYSTEM OVERVIEW

THE HUMAN CIRCULATORY SYSTEM CONSISTS OF A COMPLEX NETWORK OF BLOOD VESSELS THAT TRANSPORT BLOOD, NUTRIENTS, OXYGEN, AND WASTE PRODUCTS THROUGHOUT THE BODY. THESE VESSELS ARE CLASSIFIED INTO THREE MAIN TYPES:

- **ARTERIES:** CARRY OXYGEN-RICH BLOOD AWAY FROM THE HEART TO TISSUES.
- **VEINS:** RETURN DEOXYGENATED BLOOD BACK TO THE HEART.
- **CAPILLARIES:** MICROSCOPIC VESSELS WHERE EXCHANGE OF GASES, NUTRIENTS, AND WASTE OCCURS BETWEEN BLOOD AND TISSUES.

WHILE ALL THESE VESSELS PLAY VITAL ROLES, NOT ALL ARE SUITABLE FOR BLOOD COLLECTION.

THE PRIMARY VESSEL TYPE USED FOR BLOOD DRAWS: VEINS

WHEN IT COMES TO ROUTINE BLOOD SAMPLING AT A DOCTOR'S OFFICE, VEINS ARE THE TARGET VESSELS. THIS IS BECAUSE THEY ARE MORE ACCESSIBLE, HAVE A STEADY FLOW OF BLOOD, AND ARE SAFER FOR BOTH THE PATIENT AND HEALTHCARE PROVIDER.

WHY ARE VEINS USED FOR BLOOD DRAWS?

SEVERAL FACTORS MAKE VEINS THE PREFERRED VESSELS FOR VENIPUNCTURE:

- **ACCESSIBILITY:** VEINS ARE CLOSER TO THE SURFACE OF THE SKIN, MAKING THEM EASIER TO LOCATE AND PUNCTURE.
- **STEADY BLOOD FLOW:** VEINS OFFER A CONTROLLED FLOW OF BLOOD, REDUCING THE RISK OF COMPLICATIONS.
- **LOWER PRESSURE:** COMPARED TO ARTERIES, VEINS OPERATE UNDER LOWER PRESSURE, MINIMIZING THE RISK OF INJURY OR ARTERIAL PUNCTURE.
- **REDUCED PAIN AND RISK:** PUNCTURING VEINS TYPICALLY CAUSES LESS DISCOMFORT AND HAS FEWER COMPLICATIONS THAN PUNCTURING ARTERIES OR OTHER VESSELS.

COMMON VEINS USED IN BLOOD COLLECTION

THE VEINS MOST FREQUENTLY USED FOR BLOOD DRAWS ARE SUPERFICIAL VEINS, WHICH ARE EASILY ACCESSIBLE AND SAFE TO PUNCTURE. THESE INCLUDE:

1. **CUBITAL FOSSA VEINS:** THE MOST COMMON SITE, LOCATED IN THE BEND OF THE ELBOW, INCLUDES:
 - **MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN:** OFTEN THE FIRST CHOICE DUE TO ITS SIZE, STABILITY, AND MINIMAL DISCOMFORT.
 - **BASILIC VEIN:** LOCATED ON THE INNER SIDE OF THE ARM; USED IF THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN IS NOT SUITABLE.
 - **CEPHALIC VEIN:** LOCATED ON THE OUTER SIDE OF THE ARM; SOMETIMES USED IF OTHER VEINS ARE INACCESSIBLE.
2. **DORSAL HAND VEINS:** VEINS ON THE BACK OF THE HAND CAN BE USED IF ARM VEINS ARE DIFFICULT TO ACCESS.

OTHER VESSELS AND WHY THEY ARE NOT TYPICALLY USED

WHILE VEINS ARE THE STANDARD CHOICE, UNDERSTANDING WHY OTHER VESSEL TYPES ARE GENERALLY AVOIDED HELPS CLARIFY THE PROCEDURE.

ARTERIES

ARTERIES CARRY OXYGEN-RICH BLOOD FROM THE HEART TO TISSUES, AND PUNCTURING THEM IS SIGNIFICANTLY MORE RISKY.

- **RISKS:** ARTERIAL PUNCTURE CAN LEAD TO BLEEDING, HEMATOMA, OR ARTERIAL SPASM.
- **DIFFICULTY:** ARTERIES ARE DEEPER, HAVE THICKER WALLS, AND ARE HARDER TO ACCESS SAFELY.
- **USES:** ARTERIES ARE TYPICALLY ONLY PUNCTURED IN SPECIFIC DIAGNOSTIC PROCEDURES, SUCH AS ARTERIAL BLOOD GASES (ABG) TESTS.

CAPILLARIES

CAPILLARIES ARE MICROSCOPIC VESSELS THAT CONNECT ARTERIES AND VEINS.

- **SAMPLING:** BLOOD SAMPLES FROM CAPILLARIES ARE USUALLY OBTAINED VIA FINGERSTICK OR HEELSTICK (FOR INFANTS).
- **LIMITATIONS:** THE SMALL VOLUME OF BLOOD OBTAINED AND POTENTIAL FOR CONTAMINATION MAKE CAPILLARY SAMPLING UNSUITABLE FOR ROUTINE VENIPUNCTURE.

OTHER DEEP OR LESS ACCESSIBLE VEINS

DEEP VEINS OR THOSE LOCATED IN LESS ACCESSIBLE REGIONS ARE NOT USED DUE TO DIFFICULTY IN ACCESS AND HIGHER RISK OF COMPLICATIONS.

UNDERSTANDING THE BLOOD DRAW PROCEDURE

KNOWING WHAT TO EXPECT DURING A BLOOD DRAW CAN HELP ALLEVIATE ANXIETY AND IMPROVE COOPERATION.

PREPARATION

- ENSURE THE PATIENT IS COMFORTABLE AND RELAXED.
- CONFIRM PATIENT IDENTITY AND EXPLAIN THE PROCEDURE.
- SELECT AN APPROPRIATE VEIN, USUALLY IN THE ANTECUBITAL FOSSA.

THE COLLECTION PROCESS

- THE HEALTHCARE PROVIDER APPLIES A TOURNIQUET TO ENGORGE THE VEINS.
- THE SKIN IS CLEANED WITH ANTISEPTIC.
- A STERILE NEEDLE IS INSERTED INTO THE CHOSEN VEIN, TYPICALLY THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN.
- BLOOD IS COLLECTED INTO ONE OR MORE TUBES.
- THE NEEDLE IS REMOVED, PRESSURE APPLIED TO STOP BLEEDING, AND A BANDAGE APPLIED.

POST-PROCEDURE CARE

- INSTRUCT THE PATIENT TO KEEP PRESSURE ON THE SITE FOR A FEW MINUTES.
- WATCH FOR ANY SIGNS OF BLEEDING OR HEMATOMA.
- ADVISE ON ANY NECESSARY FOLLOW-UP OR CARE.

FACTORS INFLUENCING WHICH VESSEL IS USED

WHILE VEINS IN THE ANTECUBITAL FOSSA ARE MOST COMMON, SEVERAL FACTORS CAN INFLUENCE THE CHOICE OF VESSEL:

- **VEIN SIZE AND VISIBILITY:** LARGER, PROMINENT VEINS ARE PREFERRED.
- **PATIENT COMFORT:** AVOIDING PAINFUL OR DIFFICULT SITES.
- **PREVIOUS BLOOD DRAWS:** SCAR TISSUE OR DAMAGE MAY LIMIT ACCESS.
- **MEDICAL CONDITIONS:** CONDITIONS LIKE DEHYDRATION OR OBESITY CAN AFFECT VEIN ACCESSIBILITY.

CONCLUSION: THE TYPICAL VESSEL FOR BLOOD DRAWS

IN MOST ROUTINE MEDICAL SETTINGS, BLOOD IS DRAWN FROM SUPERFICIAL VEINS, PREDOMINANTLY THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN IN THE ANTECUBITAL FOSSA. ITS ACCESSIBILITY, SIZE, AND SAFETY PROFILE MAKE IT THE OPTIMAL CHOICE FOR VENIPUNCTURE. WHILE OTHER VESSELS LIKE ARTERIES AND CAPILLARIES SERVE DIFFERENT DIAGNOSTIC PURPOSES, THEY ARE NOT USED FOR STANDARD BLOOD COLLECTION DUE TO HIGHER RISKS OR TECHNICAL LIMITATIONS.

UNDERSTANDING WHICH VESSEL IS TYPICALLY USED AND WHY CAN HELP PATIENTS FEEL MORE AT EASE DURING THE PROCEDURE. IF YOU HAVE SPECIFIC CONCERNS OR CONDITIONS THAT AFFECT YOUR VEINS, DISCUSSING THEM WITH YOUR HEALTHCARE PROVIDER BEFOREHAND CAN ENSURE A SAFE AND SMOOTH BLOOD DRAW EXPERIENCE.

ADDITIONAL TIPS FOR PATIENTS BEFORE BLOOD DRAWS

- STAY WELL-HYDRATED BEFORE THE PROCEDURE TO MAKE VEINS MORE PROMINENT.
- FOLLOW ANY FASTING INSTRUCTIONS IF REQUIRED.
- COMMUNICATE ANY FEARS OR CONCERNS WITH THE HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONAL.
- RELAX AND TRY TO REMAIN STILL DURING THE PROCEDURE TO FACILITATE EASIER ACCESS.

BY KNOWING WHAT TO EXPECT AND UNDERSTANDING THE REASONS BEHIND VESSEL CHOICE, YOU CAN APPROACH YOUR BLOOD DRAW WITH CONFIDENCE AND LESS APPREHENSION.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHICH TYPE OF BLOOD VESSEL IS TYPICALLY USED FOR BLOOD DRAWS AT THE DOCTOR'S OFFICE?

THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN IS MOST COMMONLY USED FOR BLOOD DRAWS BECAUSE IT IS LARGE, CLOSE TO THE SURFACE, AND LESS LIKELY TO MOVE.

WHY IS THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN PREFERRED FOR BLOOD SAMPLING?

BECAUSE IT IS EASILY ACCESSIBLE, HAS A STEADY BLOOD FLOW, AND REDUCES DISCOMFORT AND COMPLICATIONS DURING THE PROCEDURE.

ARE ARTERIES EVER USED FOR BLOOD DRAWS IN A CLINICAL SETTING?

NO, ARTERIES ARE GENERALLY NOT USED FOR ROUTINE BLOOD DRAWS DUE TO THEIR DEEPER LOCATION AND HIGHER BLOOD PRESSURE, WHICH INCREASE RISK.

WHAT OTHER VEINS, BESIDES THE MEDIAN CUBITAL, MIGHT BE USED FOR BLOOD COLLECTION?

THE CEPHALIC VEIN AND BASILIC VEIN MAY BE USED IF THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN IS NOT ACCESSIBLE.

HOW DOES THE STRUCTURE OF VEINS MAKE THEM SUITABLE FOR BLOOD DRAWS?

VEINS HAVE THINNER WALLS AND ARE CLOSER TO THE SURFACE, MAKING THEM EASIER AND SAFER TO ACCESS WITH A NEEDLE.

CAN BLOOD BE DRAWN FROM OTHER VESSELS LIKE CAPILLARIES OR ARTERIES IN A TYPICAL DOCTOR'S OFFICE?

IN ROUTINE BLOOD TESTS, BLOOD IS USUALLY DRAWN FROM VEINS; CAPILLARY SAMPLES ARE TAKEN VIA FINGERSTICK, AND ARTERIES ARE AVOIDED UNLESS SPECIFIC TESTS REQUIRE ARTERIAL BLOOD GASES.

WHAT PRECAUTIONS ARE TAKEN TO ENSURE THE CORRECT VESSEL IS USED FOR BLOOD DRAWING?

HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS PALPATE AND VISUALIZE VEINS, SELECT THE MOST PROMINENT AND SUITABLE ONE, AND USE PROPER TECHNIQUE TO MINIMIZE DISCOMFORT AND COMPLICATIONS.

IS THE SIZE OF THE VESSEL IMPORTANT FOR A BLOOD DRAW?

YES, LARGER VEINS LIKE THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN ARE PREFERRED BECAUSE THEY ALLOW EASIER ACCESS AND REDUCE THE RISK OF COLLAPSING OR PUNCTURING SMALLER VESSELS.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH DRAWING BLOOD FROM THE WRONG VESSEL TYPE?

DRAWING FROM ARTERIES OR SMALLER VESSELS CAN LEAD TO COMPLICATIONS SUCH AS BLEEDING, PAIN, HEMATOMA, OR INACCURATE TEST RESULTS.

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

UNDERSTANDING VENIPUNCTURE: THE BASICS OF BLOOD COLLECTION

MOST BLOOD DRAWS ARE PERFORMED THROUGH A PROCEDURE CALLED VENIPUNCTURE. THIS INVOLVES INSERTING A NEEDLE INTO A VEIN TO COLLECT BLOOD FOR ANALYSIS. SINCE VEINS ARE THE VESSELS MOST ACCESSIBLE AND SUITABLE FOR DRAWING BLOOD, THEY ARE THE PRIMARY FOCUS OF THE PROCEDURE.

WHY VEINS ARE PREFERRED OVER ARTERIES

- EASE OF ACCESS: VEINS ARE GENERALLY CLOSER TO THE SURFACE OF THE SKIN, ESPECIALLY IN THE ARMS.
- LOWER PRESSURE: VEINS OPERATE UNDER LOWER PRESSURE THAN ARTERIES, MAKING THEM SAFER AND EASIER TO PUNCTURE.
- LESS PAIN AND RISK: PUNCTURING A VEIN IS LESS PAINFUL AND CARRIES A LOWER RISK OF COMPLICATIONS LIKE BLEEDING OR DAMAGE COMPARED TO ARTERIES.
- ADEQUATE BLOOD VOLUME: VEINS TYPICALLY PROVIDE SUFFICIENT BLOOD VOLUME FOR ROUTINE TESTING.

WHICH VESSEL TYPE DO HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS TYPICALLY USE FOR BLOOD DRAWS?

THE ANSWER IS FAIRLY STRAIGHTFORWARD: THE VEINS, PARTICULARLY SUPERFICIAL VEINS IN THE ARM, ARE THE VESSELS MOST COMMONLY USED FOR BLOOD SAMPLING IN A CLINICAL SETTING.

THE PRIMARY VESSEL: THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN

THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN IS THE MOST FREQUENTLY USED VEIN FOR BLOOD COLLECTION AT THE DOCTOR'S OFFICE. IT RESIDES IN THE ANTECUBITAL FOSSA (THE CREASE OF THE ELBOW) AND OFFERS SEVERAL ADVANTAGES:

- LARGE SIZE: IT IS USUALLY PROMINENT AND EASY TO LOCATE.
- SUPERFICIAL LOCATION: CLOSE TO THE SKIN SURFACE, MAKING ACCESS EASIER.
- STRAIGHT PATHWAY: OFFERS A DIRECT ROUTE FOR THE NEEDLE, REDUCING DISCOMFORT.
- LOW RISK OF COMPLICATION: LESS LIKELY TO HIT AN ARTERY OR NERVE DURING PUNCTURE.

OTHER VEINS IN THE AREA THAT MAY BE USED INCLUDE:

- THE CEPHALIC VEIN, LOCATED ON THE THUMB SIDE OF THE FOREARM.
- THE BASILIC VEIN, LOCATED ON THE LITTLE FINGER SIDE OF THE FOREARM.

WHILE THESE ARE LESS COMMONLY USED THAN THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN, THEY CAN SERVE AS ALTERNATIVE SITES IF NEEDED.

ANATOMY OF BLOOD VESSELS INVOLVED IN VENIPUNCTURE

TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THE VESSEL TYPES INVOLVED, IT'S HELPFUL TO EXPLORE THE RELEVANT ANATOMY.

THE VENOUS SYSTEM IN THE ARM

THE VEINS IN THE ARM ARE PART OF A NETWORK THAT DRAINS BLOOD FROM THE HAND AND FOREARM BACK TOWARD THE HEART. THE KEY SUPERFICIAL VEINS USED FOR BLOOD DRAWS INCLUDE:

- MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN: CONNECTS THE CEPHALIC AND BASILIC VEINS ACROSS THE ELBOW.
- CEPHALIC VEIN: RUNS ALONG THE LATERAL (THUMB) SIDE.
- BASILIC VEIN: RUNS ALONG THE MEDIAL (PINKY) SIDE.

HOW THESE VEINS CONNECT TO DEEPER VESSELS

THESE SUPERFICIAL VEINS DRAIN INTO LARGER VEINS THAT CONTINUE TOWARD THE HEART:

- THE CEPHALIC VEIN DRAINS INTO THE AXILLARY VEIN.
- THE BASILIC VEIN ALSO DRAINS INTO THE AXILLARY VEIN VIA THE BRACHIAL VEINS.
- THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN CONNECTS THE CEPHALIC AND BASILIC VEINS, SERVING AS A CONVENIENT ACCESS POINT.

WHY ARE ARTERIES NOT USED FOR ROUTINE BLOOD DRAWS?

WHILE ARTERIES ARE CRUCIAL FOR TRANSPORTING OXYGEN-RICH BLOOD FROM THE HEART TO TISSUES, THEY ARE NOT TYPICALLY USED FOR BLOOD COLLECTION DUE TO SEVERAL REASONS:

- HIGHER PRESSURE: ARTERIES OPERATE UNDER HIGHER PRESSURE, INCREASING THE RISK OF BLEEDING OR INJURY.
- DEEPER LOCATION: MOST ARTERIES ARE LOCATED DEEPER WITHIN TISSUES AND ARE LESS ACCESSIBLE.
- THICKER WALLS: THEIR MUSCULAR WALLS MAKE PUNCTURE MORE DIFFICULT AND PAINFUL.
- VITAL FUNCTION: ARTERIES CARRY OXYGENATED BLOOD VITAL FOR TISSUE SURVIVAL; PUNCTURING THEM CAN DISRUPT CIRCULATION AND CAUSE SERIOUS COMPLICATIONS.

THE ONLY EXCEPTION IS IN SPECIFIC DIAGNOSTIC PROCEDURES, SUCH AS ARTERIAL BLOOD GAS SAMPLING, WHICH INVOLVES ACCESSING ARTERIES LIKE THE RADIAL OR FEMORAL ARTERY UNDER SPECIALIZED CIRCUMSTANCES.

THE PROCESS OF SELECTING A VESSEL FOR BLOOD DRAW

HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS SELECT THE VESSEL BASED ON SEVERAL FACTORS:

- LOCATION ACCESSIBILITY: SUPERFICIAL VEINS IN THE ARM ARE IDEAL.
- VEIN SIZE: LARGER VEINS ARE EASIER TO PUNCTURE AND REDUCE DISCOMFORT.
- VEIN STABILITY: VEINS THAT ARE LESS PRONE TO ROLLING OR COLLAPSING ARE PREFERABLE.
- PATIENT FACTORS: CONDITIONS LIKE DEHYDRATION, OBESITY, OR VEIN SCLEROSIS CAN INFLUENCE THE CHOICE.

TYPICAL STEPS IN A BLOOD DRAW PROCEDURE

1. PREPARATION:

- THE HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONAL WILL USUALLY ASK YOU TO SIT OR LIE DOWN.
- THE ARM IS POSITIONED COMFORTABLY WITH THE SELECTED VEIN EXPOSED.

2. TOURNIQUET APPLICATION:

- A TOURNIQUET IS TIED AROUND THE UPPER ARM TO TEMPORARILY RESTRICT BLOOD FLOW, CAUSING THE VEINS TO SWELL SLIGHTLY FOR EASIER ACCESS.

3. VEIN SELECTION AND PALPATION:

- THE PROFESSIONAL PALPATES (FEELS) THE VEINS TO IDENTIFY THE MOST SUITABLE ONE.

4. CLEANING THE SITE:

- THE SKIN IS DISINFECTED WITH AN ALCOHOL SWAB TO PREVENT INFECTION.

5. NEEDLE INSERTION:

- A STERILE NEEDLE IS INSERTED AT AN ANGLE, USUALLY 15-30 DEGREES, INTO THE CHOSEN VEIN.

6. BLOOD COLLECTION:

- BLOOD IS DRAWN INTO COLLECTION TUBES.

7. NEEDLE REMOVAL AND AFTERCARE:

- THE NEEDLE IS WITHDRAWN, AND PRESSURE IS APPLIED TO THE SITE TO STOP BLEEDING.
- A BANDAGE IS APPLIED.

SUMMARY: WHICH VESSEL TYPE WOULD YOU EXPECT THEM TO DRAW FROM?

IN CONCLUSION, THE VESSEL TYPE MOST EXPECTED FOR BLOOD DRAWS AT THE DOCTOR'S OFFICE IS A SUPERFICIAL VEIN, SPECIFICALLY THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN IN THE ANTECUBITAL FOSSA. THIS VEIN IS FAVORED DUE TO ITS LARGE SIZE, SUPERFICIAL LOCATION, AND EASE OF ACCESS. WHILE OTHER SUPERFICIAL VEINS LIKE THE CEPHALIC AND BASILIC VEINS MAY BE USED AS ALTERNATIVES, ARTERIES ARE GENERALLY AVOIDED UNLESS IN SPECIALIZED PROCEDURES LIKE ARTERIAL BLOOD GAS ANALYSIS.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

- PATIENT VARIABILITY: NOT EVERYONE HAS PROMINENT VEINS, ESPECIALLY IN CASES OF DEHYDRATION, OBESITY, OR VEIN SCLEROSIS. IN SUCH CASES, ALTERNATIVE SITES OR TECHNIQUES MAY BE EMPLOYED.
- OTHER ACCESS POINTS: IN RARE SITUATIONS, BLOOD MAY BE DRAWN FROM VEINS IN THE HAND OR WRIST IF ARM VEINS ARE INACCESSIBLE.
- SAFETY AND COMFORT: PROPER TECHNIQUE MINIMIZES DISCOMFORT AND REDUCES RISKS, EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF SKILLED HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS.

FINAL THOUGHTS

UNDERSTANDING WHICH VESSEL TYPE YOU WOULD EXPECT THEM TO DRAW FROM DURING A BLOOD DRAW CAN HELP ALLEVIATE ANXIETY AND FOSTER TRUST IN THE PROCESS. RECOGNIZING THAT THE PRIMARY VESSEL IS A SUPERFICIAL VEIN—MOST OFTEN THE MEDIAN CUBITAL VEIN—CLARIFIES WHY THE PROCEDURE IS GENERALLY QUICK, SAFE, AND MINIMALLY INVASIVE. NEXT TIME YOU VISIT YOUR DOCTOR FOR BLOOD WORK, YOU'LL HAVE A CLEARER PICTURE OF THE ANATOMICAL JOURNEY YOUR BLOOD TAKES FROM YOUR BODY TO THE LABORATORY.
