

READ THE PASSAGE FROM "RAYMOND'S RUN." SELECT THE THREE PHRASES THAT CONTRIBUTE TO THE TONE OF ANNOYANCE

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INTRODUCTION

THE BROADER SIGNIFICANCE OF THESE PHRASES

WHILE EACH PHRASE INDIVIDUALLY COMMUNICATES ANNOYANCE, THEIR COMBINED EFFECT CONSTRUCTS A NUANCED TONE THAT REFLECTS SQUEAKY'S COMPLEX EMOTIONAL STATE. - THEME REINFORCEMENT: THE PHRASES UNDERSCORE THEMES OF PATIENCE, RESPONSIBILITY, AND THE CHALLENGES OF SIBLING RELATIONSHIPS.
- NARRATIVE VOICE: THEY CONTRIBUTE TO A CONVERSATIONAL, AUTHENTIC TONE THAT MAKES SQUEAKY'S INTERNAL WORLD ACCESSIBLE TO READERS.

MOREOVER, THE TONE OF ANNOYANCE HELPS SET THE STAGE FOR THE STORY'S EVENTUAL RESOLUTION, WHERE UNDERSTANDING AND EMPATHY BEGIN TO REPLACE IRRITATION. RECOGNIZING THESE PHRASES ALLOWS READERS TO APPRECIATE THE STORY'S EMOTIONAL DEPTH AND BAMBARA'S SKILLFUL USE OF LANGUAGE TO EVOKE SUBTLE YET POWERFUL FEELINGS.

CONCLUSION: THE POWER OF LANGUAGE IN CONVEYING EMOTION

IN "RAYMOND'S RUN," TONI CADE BAMBARA MASTERFULLY EMPLOYS SPECIFIC PHRASES TO DEPICT SQUEAKY'S TONE OF ANNOYANCE, ENRICHING HER CHARACTER AND ADVANCING THE STORY'S THEMES.
