IT UNDERSCORES THAT THE QUEST FOR SWEETNESS HAS BEEN A UNIVERSAL HUMAN PURSUIT—WOVEN INTO OUR SPIRITUAL TRADITIONS, DAILY PRACTICES, AND COLLECTIVE HISTORY—AND CONTINUES TO INFLUENCE OUR WORLD IN WAYS THAT ARE BOTH TANGIBLE AND SYMBOLIC.

FINAL THOUGHTS

BY EXAMINING EARLY TEXTS LIKE THE ATHARVA VEDA IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE NARRATIVE OF SUGAR CHANGED THE WORLD, WE RECOGNIZE THAT SUGAR'S STORY IS AS MUCH ABOUT HUMAN CULTURE AND SPIRITUALITY AS IT IS ABOUT ECONOMICS AND TRADE. IT IS A STORY OF TRANSFORMATION—OF NATURAL RESOURCES BECOMING SYMBOLS OF DIVINE GRACE, OF ECONOMIC ENGINES DRIVING HISTORY, AND OF HUMANITY'S ENDURING DESIRE FOR THE SWEET TASTE OF LIFE.
