STAGE RIGHT AND STAGE LEFT MEAN THE RIGHT AND LEFT SIDE, RESPECTIVELY, FROM THE AUDIENCE'S PERSPECTIVE

WHEN ATTENDING A THEATRICAL PERFORMANCE, MANY AUDIENCE MEMBERS NOTICE THE TERMS "STAGE RIGHT" AND "STAGE LEFT" FREQUENTLY USED BY ACTORS, DIRECTORS, AND STAGEHANDS. THESE DIRECTIONAL TERMS ARE ESSENTIAL TO UNDERSTANDING THE FLOW OF A PRODUCTION, BUT THEY CAN OFTEN BE CONFUSING FOR FIRST-TIME THEATER-GOERS. FROM THE AUDIENCE'S PERSPECTIVE, "STAGE RIGHT" REFERS TO THE ACTOR'S RIGHT SIDE, WHICH APPEARS ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE STAGE FROM THE VIEWER'S VANTAGE POINT, AND VICE VERSA FOR "STAGE LEFT." PERSPECTIVE FROM THE AUDIENCE'S VIEWPOINT

TO CLARIFY:

- STAGE RIGHT: THE ACTOR'S RIGHT SIDE, WHICH APPEARS TO THE LEFT SIDE OF THE AUDIENCE.
