SUBCULTURES ARE AN INTEGRAL ASPECT OF SOCIETY'S DIVERSITY, REPRESENTING THE MYRIAD WAYS INDIVIDUALS FIND MEANING, EXPRESS THEMSELVES, AND CHALLENGE OR COMPLEMENT MAINSTREAM NORMS. THEY REVEAL THAT WITHIN ANY SOCIETY, MULTIPLE WORLDS COEXIST—EACH WITH ITS OWN SET OF VALUES, BELIEFS, AND PRACTICES. RECOGNIZING AND UNDERSTANDING THESE GROUPS FOSTERS GREATER EMPATHY, ENRICHES CULTURAL DIALOGUE, AND HIGHLIGHTS THE ONGOING EVOLUTION OF SOCIETAL IDENTITIES. AS THE WORLD BECOMES MORE INTERCONNECTED, THE LINE BETWEEN SUBCULTURE AND MAINSTREAM CULTURE WILL CONTINUE TO SHIFT, REFLECTING THE DYNAMIC, MULTIFACETED NATURE OF HUMAN COMMUNITIES.

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
