- COMMON IN HUMANITIES.
- IN-TEXT CITATION FORMAT: (AUTHOR’S LAST NAME PAGE NUMBER)
- EXAMPLE: (SMITH 45)

CHICAGO STYLE

- FREQUENTLY USED IN HISTORY AND SOME SOCIAL SCIENCES.
- NOTES AND BIBLIOGRAPHY OR AUTHOR-DATE SYSTEM.
- FOR AUTHOR-DATE: (AUTHOR’S LAST NAME YEAR, PAGE NUMBER)
- EXAMPLE: (SMITH 2020, 45)

KEY DIFFERENCES IN FORMATTING

STYLE	FORMAT EXAMPLE	PUNCTUATION AND SPACING NOTES
APA	(JOHNSON, 2019)	NO SPACE AFTER PARENTHESES; COMMA SEPARATES AUTHOR AND YEAR
MLA	(JOHNSON 45)	NO COMMA; SPACE BETWEEN AUTHOR AND PAGE NUMBER
CHICAGO	(JOHNSON 2019, 45)	COMMA SEPARATES YEAR AND PAGE; NO SPACE AFTER PARENTHESES

UNDERSTANDING THESE DIFFERENCES ENSURES YOUR IN-TEXT CITATIONS ARE ACCURATE AND CONSISTENT WITH STYLE GUIDELINES.

BEST PRACTICES FOR CREATING IN-TEXT CITATIONS

1. KNOW YOUR CITATION STYLE

- AUTHOR'S LAST NAME: THE PRIMARY IDENTIFIER LINKING TO THE SOURCE

THE CRITICAL ROLE OF SPACING AND PUNCTUATION IN CITATIONS

> AS NOTED, THE FINDINGS WERE CONCLUSIVE (SMITH 15).

4. INCORPORATE PUNCTUATION WITHIN THE SENTENCE

IN-TEXT CITATIONS ARE OFTEN INTEGRATED INTO SENTENCES. ENSURE THAT PUNCTUATION FLOWS CORRECTLY:

FORMATTING NOTES:

- SEPARATE MULTIPLE CITATIONS WITH SEMICOLONS.
- ENSURE CONSISTENT SPACING—NO EXTRA SPACES BEFORE OR AFTER SEMICOLONS.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR DIFFERENT SOURCE TYPES

DIFFERENT SOURCE TYPES REQUIRE NUANCED FORMATTING, ESPECIALLY CONCERNING SPACING AND PUNCTUATION.

QUOTING MATERIAL

- ALWAYS INCLUDE PAGE NUMBERS OR PARAGRAPH NUMBERS WHEN QUOTING.

- BE CONSISTENT WITH YOUR STYLE GUIDE'S RECOMMENDATIONS.

CITING MULTIPLE WORKS

WHEN CITING SEVERAL SOURCES WITHIN THE SAME PARENTHESES:

- SEPARATE WITH SEMICOLONS: (JOHNSON, 2019; LEE, 2018)
- MAINTAIN CONSISTENT SPACING: NO EXTRA SPACES BEFORE OR AFTER SEMICOLONS.
