IN 1787-1788, KING LOUIS XVI CALLED FOR THE ESTATES-GENERAL TO ADDRESS THE FINANCIAL CRISIS FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE 1614. THIS ASSEMBLY WAS MEANT TO GATHER REPRESENTATIVES FROM ALL THREE ESTATES TO DISCUSS TAXATION REFORMS.

THE OUTBREAK OF TENSIONS

DISCONTENT GREW AS THE THIRD ESTATE FELT UNDERREPRESENTED AND IGNORED. WHEN THE ESTATES-GENERAL CONVENED IN 1789, VOTING PROCEDURES—EACH ESTATE VOTING SEPARATELY—FAVORED THE PRIVILEGED ESTATES, FURTHER ALIENATING THE THIRD ESTATE. THIS SET THE STAGE FOR CONFRONTATIONS AND DEMANDS FOR CHANGE.

SECOND EVENT: THE FORMATION OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY AND THE TENNIS COURT OATH

THE THIRD ESTATE BREAKS AWAY

FRUSTRATED WITH THEIR LACK OF INFLUENCE, MEMBERS OF THE THIRD ESTATE PROCLAIMED THEMSELVES THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY IN JUNE 1789. THEY ASSERTED THAT THEY REPRESENTED THE PEOPLE OF FRANCE AND SOUGHT TO CREATE A CONSTITUTIONAL GOVERNMENT.

THE TENNIS COURT OATH

ON JUNE 20, 1789, MEMBERS OF THE THIRD ESTATE FOUND THEMSELVES LOCKED OUT OF THEIR USUAL MEETING HALL. THEY GATHERED INSTEAD ON A NEARBY TENNIS COURT AND TOOK THE FAMOUS TENNIS COURT OATH, PLEDGING NOT TO DISBAND UNTIL THEY HAD DRAFTED A NEW CONSTITUTION FOR FRANCE.
