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The struggle for Texas independence from Mexico was fueled by a series of grievances held by settlers and Tejanos (Mexican Texans) against the Mexican government. These complaints reflected concerns over political representation, cultural differences, economic policies, and the centralization of power. Understanding these primary complaints offers vital insight into the causes of the Texas Revolution and the path toward independence. In this article, we explore the key issues that Texans had with the Mexican government before they declared their independence, organized into major themes for clarity.
